GENERAL SUMMARY OF WINTERING POPULATIONS AND SPRING MIGRATION

SOUTHEAST: SMALL NUMBERS OF HORNED GREBES WERE SEEN IN THE CARLSBAD AREA THROUGH FEBRUARY AND MARCH, AND ONE AS LATE AS MAY 30. RED—BREASTED MERGANSERS, NUMBERING UP TO 20, WERE AT HARROUN LAKE DURING FEBRUARY AND MARCH. BLUEBIRDS WERE UNUSUALLY NUMEROUS IN THE CARLSBAD AREA IN FEBRUARY: FLOCKS OF 50 TO 200 WESTERN BLUEBIRDS WERE NOTED; MOUNTAIN BLUEBIRDS WERE SEEN IN UNPRECEDENTED FLOCKS OF UP TO 1000. SAGE THRASHERS REMAINED IN THE CARLSBAD AREA ALL WINTER. ROBINS WERE MORE NUMEROUS THAN USUAL. CEDAR WAXWINGS WERE SCARCE, A DOZEN IN ROSWELL NOVEMBER 10, AND 25 IN CARLSBAD AT

CHRISTMAS. AUDUBON'S WARBLERS WERE PRESENT ALL WINTER, MOST NUMEROUS NEAR CARLSBAD. A FEW GREEN—TAILED TOWHEES AND BROWN TOWHEES WINTERED AROUND CARLSBAD CAVERNS.

MIGRATION THROUGH ROSWELL WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN THE BEST IN SEVERAL YEARS WITH RESPECT TO BOTH SPECIES AND NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS. THE PERIOD OF APRIL 25 TO MAY 7 BROUGHT AN UNUSUALLY STRONG FLURRY, ALMOST A WAVE, THROUGH ROSWELL OF SMALL LAND BIRDS, ESPECIALLY WARBLERS. PEAK NUMBERS OF SPECIES AND INDIVIDUALS WERE REACHED APRIL 30, MAY 1, AND MAY 7. SOMEWHAT LESS ACTIVITY FOR THE PERIOD WAS REPORTED FROM EDDY COUNTY. WHEN SOMEONE IN ROSWELL TELEPHONED BETWEEN APRIL 25 AND MAY 12 AND SAID "WHAT IS THAT BIRD...?" IT WAS A WESTERN TANAGER. OCCURRING IN SMALL NUMBERS SOME YEARS, NOT SEEN AT ALL IN OTHER YEARS, THE WESTERN TANAGER WAS PRESENT IN DOZENS. IN EDDY COUNTY ALSO IT WAS REPORTED AS NUMEROUS IN MAY.

SOUTHWEST: THE REPORT FROM THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE INDICATED THAT THE FALL MIGRATION OF DUCKS AND CRANES WAS LATE, WHILE THE GEESE ARRIVED EARLY. FOOD SUPPLY WAS ALMOST DEPLETED BY THE END OF DECEMBER, AND FLOCKS DISPERSED UP AND DOWN THE VALLEY FROM THE REFUGE. THE WATER SITUATION WAS CRITICAL, NECESSITATING CONTINUAL USE OF THE IRRIGATION WELLS. ON DECEMBER 14, FOURTEEN SPECIES OF DUCKS WERE FOUND AT BEAR CANYON RESERVOIR, GRANT COUNTY, A SMALL AND NOT PARTICULARLY ATTRACTIVE BODY OF WATER. BAND—TAILED PIGEONS CONTINUED TO BE REPORTED: SMALL FLOCKS OF UP TO 35 BIRDS WERE SEEN REGULARLY ALL FALL IN THE FT. BAYARD AREA, AND A FEW WERE STILL NOTED IN JANUARY. CASSIN'S FINCHES WERE ALSO SEEN REGULARLY DURING FALL AND WINTER AT FT. BAYARD.

UNUSUAL NUMBERS OF MIGRATING WESTERN TANAGERS WERE NOTED ALSO IN THIS REGION THE END OF APRIL AND EARLY MAY. CONVERSELY, THE POOR—WILL WAS REMARKABLE FOR HIS ABSENCE, GENERALLY. ELEVEN SPECIES OF WARBLERS WERE NOTED AT FT. BAYARD MAY 6 THROUGH MAY 8, BUT THERE WAS NO APPARENT WAVE OF ANY ONE SPECIES. GOOD NUMBERS OF AUDUBON'S AND WILSON'S WARBLERS APPEARED LATER THAN HAD BEEN EXPECTED; RED—FACED WARBLERS WERE OBSERVED SEVERAL TIMES, BUT NO OLIVE WARBLERS WERE NOTED.

NORTHEAST: A MINOR INVASION OF SCRUB JAYS WAS REPORTED AT CLAYTON. STARLING POPULATION IN THAT AREA WAS DOWN, WHILE WINTERING ROBINS, PINE SISKINS, AND CHESTNUT—COLLARED LONOSPURS WERE UP IN NUMBER. IT WAS ESTIMATED THAT THE QUAIL POPULATION WAS PERHAPS ONLY 25% OF NORMAL IN THAT AREA.

MIGRATION PERIOD COMMENT WAS THAT IT WAS THE BEST BIRD SPRING IN A LONG TIME. UNUSUAL NUMBERS OF MARBLED GODWIT AND WILLET WERE PRESENT THE END OF APRIL IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA. EVENING GROSBEAKS WERE PRESENT IN LAS VEGAS ALL SPRING, IN SEVERAL FLOCKS OF 100 BIRDS. THE AMERICAN GOLDFINCH USUALLY APPEARS WITH THE CHINESE ELM BUDS, BUT THE TREES WERE FROSTED THIS YEAR, AND NO GOLDFINCHES WERE SEEN.

NORTHWEST: MANY DUCKS WERE PRESENT ON THE SAN ILDEFONSO POND AND AT RIVERSIDE DURING MARCH. ON MARCH 1, 50 PINTAILS, 100 GREEN-WINGED TEAL, 50 COMMON MERGANSERS, WERE SEEN AT LOWDERMILK'S POND, ALONG WITH 10 OTHER SPECIES OF DUCKS. BALD EAGLES HAVE BEEN REPORTED FROM THE FARMINGTON AREA IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH. LARGE FLOCKS OF MOUNTAIN BLUEBIRDS WERE NOTED IN THE RIO GRANDE VALLEY AROUND ALBUQUERQUE AND SOUTH; HUNDREDS WERE NOTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE ON FEBRUARY 29. EASTERN BLUEBIRDS WERE REPORTED FROM THIS REGION. EVENING GROSBEAKS AND CASSIN'S FINCHES WERE PARTICULARLY ABUNDANT IN THE LOS ALAMOS AREA DURING FEBRUARY AND MARCH. LARGE FLOCKS OF BOHEMIAN WAXWINGS WERE IN SANTA FE IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY. RED CROSSBILLS WHICH WERE COMMON AT LOS ALAMOS IN THE FALL DISAPPEARED DURING DECEMBER AND JANUARY, REAPPEARING IN FEBRUARY AND MARCH. GRAY—HEADED JUNCOS OUTNUMBERED OREGON

JUNCOS BY ABOUT 7:1 AT A LOS ALAMOS FEEDING STATION DURING THE WINTER.

MIGRATION PERIOD WAS CHARACTERIZED BY A LATE SPRING AND THE LINGERING BEYOND USUAL TIME OF VARIOUS WINTER SPECIES, AS NOTED IN THE REPORTS. THE LARGE FLOCKS OF EVENING GROSBEAKS IN ALBUQUERQUE, WHICH USUALLY REMAIN PERHAPS THREE WEEKS DURING THE WINTER, WERE PRESENT FROM THE END OF FEBRUARY UNTIL MAY 27. AN UNUSUAL NUMBER OF WESTERN TANAGERS SHOWED UP AT CEDAR CREST THE FIRST WEEK IN MAY.

NOTE: ALL WATERFOWL REPORTS MARKED WSH HAVE BEEN ABSTRACTED FROM THE RECORDS OF THE NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH.

1 ON 3/8 AT SAN ILDEFONSO WAS VERY EARLY (WBL).

WESTERN GREBE

1 BIRD WAS OBSERVED AT CABALLO RESERVOIR 12/15 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN 4/29 AND 2 ON 5/7 AT LAKE MCMILLAN (RCB).

DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT

1 IN ADULT SPRING PLUMAGE WAS SEEN ALONG THE RIO GRANDE AT ESPANOLA 4/5 (JRT, WBL).

GREEN HERON

1 WAS AT SAN ILDEFONSO 5/2 (JRT).

COMMON EGRET

SINGLE BIRDS WERE NOTED 4/24 AT CABALLO RESERVOIR, AND 4/28 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (BH).

YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON

A SUB-ADULT WAS CLOSELY OBSERVED ALONG THE GILA RIVER NEAR CLIFF 4/23 (DAZ).

LEAST BITTERN

1 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 5/16 ALLOWED A CLOSE VIEW (BH).

WHITE-FACED IBIS

A FLOCK OF 10 WAS SEEN 4/21 NEAR CLIFF (BH); 1 WAS AT SANTA FE 4/23 (PRS); 2 WERE SEEN 4/24 AT CABALLO RESERVOIR, AND A FLOCK OF ABOUT 35 WERE AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/28 (BH); 8 WERE AT HARROUN LAKE 5/4, AND 6 AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 5/24 (VM).

WHISTLING SWAN

2 WERE AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE FROM 12/12 (VM); 2 WERE SEEN ON THE PINE RIVER ARM OF THE NAVAJO RESERVOIR 3/26 (AN).

CANADA GOOSE

5947 WERE ON THE RIO GRANDE BETWEEN ALBUQUERQUE AND ELEPHANT BUTTE RESERVOIR IN NOVEMBER; 4800 WERE ON LA CUEVA, MORA CO., IN DECEMBER (WSH).

WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE

1 WAS RESTING ON A SAND BAR IN THE RIO GRANDE AT ESPANOLA 12/29 (JRT).

SNOW GOOSE

2000 WERE ON MCMILLAN RESERVOIR, EDDY CO., IN MARCH (WSH).

BLUE GOOSE

AT LEAST 8 WERE PRESENT AMONG FLOCKS OF SNOW GEESE TOTALING 500 OR MORE BIRDS AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 12/28 (BH).

ROSS' GOOSE

A SINGLE WAS REPORTED NEAR LOVING, AND 1 WAS WITH SNOW GEESE AT HARROUN LAKE 3/6 (RCB).

MALLARD

3170 WERE ON ELEPHANT BUTTE RESERVOIR IN DECEMBER; 1007 WERE ON ALAMOGORDO RESERVOIR, GUADALUPE CO., IN FEBRUARY; IN MARCH NUMBERS WERE 2160 ON STORRIE RESERVOIR, SAN MIGUEL CO., 2990 ON LA CUEVA, MORA CO., 2090 ON STUBBLEFIELD RESERVOIR, COLFAX CO. (WSH).

MEXICAN DUCK

3 BIRDS OBSERVED 2/22 AT GRAY RANCH IN SW HIDALGO COUNTY WERE ASSUMED TO BE THIS SPECIES; THERE WERE NO MALE MALLARDS NEARBY (BH). THIS IS AN AREA WHERE NEW MEXICO DUCKS NEST AND HAVE BEEN OBSERVED COMMONLY; MALLARDS ALSO OCCUR IN THE AREA AND HYBRIDS ARE NOT UNCOMMON (ED).

CABALLO RESERVOIR IN DECEMBER, AND 3225 WERE ON ELEPHANT BUTTE IN MARCH (WSH); 1 AT SAN JUAN PUEBLO 5/9 WAS VERY LATE (JRT).

TURKEY VULTURE

ARRIVED IN ROSWELL 4/27, AND AT LEAST 4 WERE STILL PRESENT AT THE END OF MAY; THE BIRD HAS NESTED THE PAST 2 YEARS IN THE ROSWELL AREA (VM).

1 WAS SEEN AT BLACK LAKE, COLFAX CO., 12/5 (WSH); 1 ADULT WAS SEEN IN THE FT. BAYARD AREA 2/18, AND AN IMMATURE IN THE SAME AREA ON 3/24 (BH); 1 SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 3/25 IS THE FIRST RECORD FOR THE REFUGE (LO).

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK

1 WAS SEEN 12/13 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE, AND 2 ON 12/21 (LO).

HARLAN'S HAWK

1 FEMALE WAS SEEN AT THE PARKVIEW FISH HATCHERY, RIO ARRIBA Co., 5/30 (WBL).

RED-WINGED BLACKBIRD

AN ADULT MALE WAS SEEN IN LOS ALAMOS ON 2/22 (WBL).

SCOTT'S ORIOLE

RARE IN THE SOUTHEAST, 2 WERE SEEN AT ROSWELL 5/2 (VM) AND 1 AT CARLSBAD 5/15 (RCB); FIRST NOTED AT CEDAR CREST 5/4 (MCK).

EVENING GROSBEAK

LARGE FLOCKS CAME INTO THE FT. BAYARD AND SILVER CITY AREAS DURING SNOWSTORMS 2/20 AND 3/2 (BH); LARGE FLOCKS APPEARED IN ALBUQUERQUE 2/20, REMAINING UNTIL MID—MAY, AN UNUSUALLY LONG TIME FOR THE SPECIES TO STAY IN THAT AREA (JD, ET AL.); AT CEDAR CREST THERE WERE FEWER THAN USUAL (MCK); SEVERAL FLOCKS, 150 BIRDS IN ONE, WERE PRESENT IN LAS VEGAS 3/28 (ES).

CASSIN'S FINCH

REMAINED IN SANTA FE TILL 4/13 (ND) AND IN LOS ALAMOS UNTIL 5/17, AN UNUSUALLY LATE DATE (WBL); SEVERAL WERE SEEN AT CEDAR CREST 5/4 (MCK).

SEEN IN LAS VEGAS 5/7 (ES).

ROSY FINCHES

A FLOCK ON SANDIA CREST ON THE CHRISTMAS COUNT 12/29 WAS THE FIRST RECORD ON A COUNT ALTHOUGH THE SPECIES PREVIOUSLY HAS BEEN SEEN THERE; 35 BIRDS WERE COUNTED, OF WHICH 20 WERE BLACK ROSY FINCHES, 10 WERE GRAY—CROWNED, AND 5 UNDETERMINED. 1 WAS SEEN 3/20 AT CABALLO RESERVOIR (BH); LAST SEEN IN SANTA FE 5/14 (PRS).

RED CROSSBILL

A FLOCK WAS OBSERVED ON SANDIA CREST 12/17, AND VARIOUSLY UNTIL 1/26 (MCK, ET AL.); FIRST WINTER SIGHTING IN THE FT. BAYARD AREA WAS NOT UNTIL 3/24 WHEN THREE FLOCKS WERE SEEN (BH); PRESENT IN LOS ALAMOS FROM 2/29, THE BIRDS BEGAN APPEARING AT A SUET FEEDER AND BIRD BATH THERE ON 5/2 AND AS MANY AS 15 WERE PERCHING ON THE FEEDER AND AT LEAST AS MANY MORE WAITING ABOVE IN THE TREE; THEY WERE STILL COMING 5/31 (WBL); THIS SPECIES IN LAS VEGAS 5/7 WAS UNUSUAL

(ES), AND 4 AT CEDAR CREST 5/12 WERE THE FIRST EVER SEEN AT THAT LOCATION (MCK).

SAGE SPARROW

A BIRD OF THE DARK CALIFORNIA RACES <u>AMPHISPIZA</u> <u>BELLI</u>, WAS IDENTIFIED 3/8 AT RIVERSIDE, NEAR ESPANOLA (JRT, WBL, ET AL.).

SLATE-COLORED JUNCO

1 WAS SEEN 2/21 IN A YARD IN LOS ALAMOS (JRT).

OREGON JUNCO

LAST SEEN IN SANTA FE 4/17 (PRS); IN CEDAR CREST 4/17 (MCK); IN LOS ALAMOS 4/18 (JRT).

GRAY—HEADED JUNCO

LAST SEEN AT CEDAR CREST 5/3, BUT A LATE SNOW IN THE SANDIA MTS. BROUGHT A DOZEN OR SO BACK 5/31 (MCK).

FIRST NOTED IN EARLY APRIL IN EMBUDO CANYON, BERNALILLO CO., AND SEEN BY NUMBERS OF OBSERVERS IN APRIL AND MAY; 2 SPECIMENS EVENTUALLY WERE TAKEN FOR U.N.M. (JSF, ET AL.).

HARRIS' SPARROW

1 WAS SEEN IN THE NW ALBUQUERQUE AREA 4/27 (AM).

WHITE-CROWNED SPARROW

LAST NOTED IN LOS ALAMOS 5/31 (WBL).

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW

SINGLES WERE OBSERVED IN THE FT. BAYARD AREA ON 12/26, 12/31, AND 2/20; 1 BIRD WAS COLLECTED ON 2/20 (BH). FROM 12/8 UNTIL 3/13, AN IMMATURE WAS OBSERVED FREQUENTLY AT A FEEDER IN SANTA FE (HM). TWO OR THREE RECORDS FOR THE SPECIES IN APRIL AND MAY ARE NOTED ON THE MIMBRES RIVER BELOW BEAR CANYON RESERVOIR, AND IN THE FT. BAYARD AREA (BH). 1 IS REPORTED FROM CARLSBAD LATE IN APRIL (RCB).

FOX SPARROW

SINGLE BIRDS WERE REPORTED SEEN SEVERAL TIMES IN FEBRUARY IN THE CARLSBAD AREA (RCB).

SWAMP SPARROW

A SINGLE WAS OBSERVED AT FT. BAYARD SEWAGE PONDS 12/12 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN 4/25 IN THE NW VALLEY AREA OF ALBUQUERQUE (JD, ET AL.).

CHESTNUT-COLLARED LONGSPUR

15 WERE SEEN IN SANTA FE 3/15, AND 20 WERE NOTED 3/28 (PRS); THE SPECIES WINTERED IN LARGER NUMBERS THAN USUAL IN CLAYTON (AK).
