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SUMMARY OF THE SUMMER AND FALL SEASONS, 1964

THE EFFECTS OF LONG-CONTINUED DROUTH IN THE EASTERN THIRD OF THE STATE CULMINATED BY MID-SUMMER IN THE VIRTUAL LACK OF ANY AVAILABLE SURFACE WATER IN THAT AREA. LAKES AVALON AND MCMILLAN WERE NEARLY OR COMPLETELY DRAINED BY THE FIRST WEEK IN AUGUST, STOCK PONDS WERE ALL DRY, AND THE WATER LEVEL AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE WAS PROBABLY AT THE LOWEST IN ITS HISTORY. THUS THE SUMMER SAW RELATIVELY FEW LONG-BILLED CURLEWS, KILLDEERS AND MARSH HAWKS IN THE SOUTHEAST, AND AVOCETS APPARENTLY FAILING TO NEST IN THE CLAYTON AREA. NUMBERS OF MIGRATING SHOREBIRDS WERE GENERALLY LOW IN THIS SECTION ALSO, DESPITE A FEW UNUSUAL RECORDS. SOMEWHAT OFFSETTING THIS RATHER DISMAL PICTURE WAS KREHBIEL'S REPORT OF THE FIRST REALLY SUCCESSFUL NESTING SEASON IN SEVERAL YEARS FOR SCALED QUAIL AROUND CLAYTON, NORMAL ABUNDANCE OF LAND BIRDS BOTH AS MIGRANTS AND NESTERS IN MOST OF THE EAST, AND PAT SNIDER'S RECORDING OF AN EXCEPTIONALLY GOOD BUTEO MIGRATION IN THE NORTHCENTRAL AND NORTHEAST SECTIONS.

IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHWESTERN NEW MEXICO THE SUMMER RAINS GENERALLY HELD OFF UNTIL MID-JULY OR LATER, WITH EXTREMELY DRY CONDITIONS PREVAILING UNTIL THEN, BUT LITTLE IF ANY ADVERSE EFFECT ON THE BREEDING BIRDS WAS NOTED. AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE WATERFOWL NESTING SUCCESS WAS ONLY "FAIR" WITH APPROXIMATELY 150 YOUNG, MOSTLY MALLARDS AND GADWALLS, PRODUCED, AND COOT NUMBERS VERY LOW; POPULATION LEVELS OF SMALL LAND BIRDS AND WADERS WERE CHARACTERIZED AS "NORMAL". GAMBEL'S QUAIL ENJOYED AN EXCELLENT NESTING SEASON THERE. FEED CONDITIONS AT THE REFUGE WERE EXTREMELY GOOD, AND BY THE END OF THE PERIOD THE SANDHILL CRANE POPULATION HAD BUILT UP TO AN ALL—TIME HIGH FOR THE REFUGE.

FALL MIGRATION THROUGH THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN PORTIONS OF THE STATE WAS SEEMINGLY UNEXCEPTIONAL EXCEPT FOR THE UNUSUAL ABUNDANCE OF SEVERAL COMMON SPECIES OF SHOREBIRDS NOTED AT SANTA FE. W. B. LEWIS AT LOS ALAMOS COMMENTED ON SEVERAL LATE LINGERING WARBLERS, POSSIBLY A PHENOMENON OF THE DELAYED FROSTS IN THAT AREA.

PEAK FALL MIGRATION DATES AT TWO STATIONS IN THE STATE WERE: ROSWELL, SEPTEMBER 16; AND CEDAR CREST, SANDIA MTS., SEPTEMBER 7, 9, 30, AND OCTOBER 9 AND 31.

SOME INTERESTING RECORDS FROM THE SUMMER-FALL SEASON WERE: WESTERN GREBES REPORTED AT AN UNUSUAL NUMBER OF LOCALITIES IN THE FALL; 14 Ross' GEESE AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE ON NOVEMBER 20; ZONE-TAILED HAWK ATTEMPTING TO NEST NEAR LOS ALAMOS MEANS THIS SPECIES CAN NO LONGER BE CONSIDERED ESSENTIALLY RESTRICTED TO THE SOUTHERN PART OF THE STATE; BLACK SKIMMER AT LAKE HCMILLAN IS APPARENTLY A FIRST RECORD FOR THE STATE; GROOVE-BILLED ANI AT SANTA FE; THREE WHIP-POOR-WILL RECORDS (TWO BREEDING SEASON) FROM CENTRAL NEW MEXICO; RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH, TWO JULY RECORDS FROM NORTHERN NEW MEXICO WHERE POSSIBLE BREEDING SHOULD BE WATCHED FOR IN THE FUTURE; RED-EYED VIREO, SPECIMEN FROM UNION COUNTY, AND TENNESSEE WARBLER, COLLECTED AT SILVER CITY, BOTH FIRST SPECIMEN RECORDS FOR THE STATE; RED-FACED WARBLER IN THE DATIL MOUNTAINS, ANOTHER SOUTHERN SPECIES THAT IS POSSIBLY EXTENDING ITS RANGE NORTHWARD; INDIGO AND LAZULI BUNTINGS APPARENTLY BREEDING (AND HYBRIDIZING?) TOGETHER AT CORRALES; SEVERAL RUFOUS-CROWNED SPARROW RECORDS FINALLY AMASSED FROM THE NORTHERN HALF OF THE STATE, AN AREA WHICH HAS LONG COMPRISED A HIATUS IN THE KNOWN DISTRIBUTION OF THE SPECIES BETWEEN POPULATIONS IN COLORADO AND OKLAHOMA AND THOSE IN SOUTHEASTERN NEW MEXICO; AND BLACK-CHINNED SPARROWS NOW KNOWN FROM AS FAR NORTH AS THE SANDIA MOUNTAINS NEAR ALBUQUERQUE.

HORNED GREBE 2 TO 6 WERE AT LAKE AVALON, EDDY CO., FROM 10/25 THROUGH NOVEMBER (RCB). EARED GREBE 2 AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 6/5 (PB); SEEN IN SANTA FE FROM 8/13 WHICH IS EARLIER THAN USUAL (PRS). WESTERN GREBE 1 ON FARMINGTON RESERVOIR 9/20 (AN); 27 OR MORE ON CABALLO LAKE 9/24 (BH); 4 SEEN AT ONE TIME 9/26 IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA (ES); 2 AT BITTER LAKE 10/13 (VM); 5 AT LAKE AVALON FROM 10/25 THROUGH NOVEMBER (RCB); 2 AT BLUEWATER LAKE 11/2 (JS). PIED-BILLED GREBE SEEN IN SANTA FE FROM 9/5 WHICH IS EARLY (PRS). WHITE PELICAN 2 FOR A WEEK IN MID-JUNE AT LAKE MCMILLAN, EDDY CO. (RCB); 40 OR MORE ON CABALLO LAKE 8/23 (PRS) AND AT LEAST 90 THERE 9/27 (BH); 12 AT LAKE AVALON 10/4 INCREASING TO AS MANY AS 400; LAST NOTED 11/30 (RCB). DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT NOTED AT EAGLE NEST RESERVOIR 11/1 (JS). LITTLE BLUE HERON 1 WAS AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 7/30 WHERE IT APPEARS INFREQUENTLY (VM). SNOWY EGRET 10 PAIR NESTED AT THE ROOKERY ABOVE SIX-MILE DAM, EDDY CO. (RCB); 4 WERE AT THE ESPANOLA BOTTOMS ON 10/1 (PRS); 2 AT BLUEWATER ON 11/2 (JS). BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON 15 TO 20 PAIR NESTED AT SIX-MILE DAM; ALL WERE GONE BY 9/10 (RCB). YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON 2 IMMATURES 8/24 ON THE GILA RIVER NEAR GILA, OF WHICH 1 WAS COLLECTED (BH); THIS IS APPARENTLY THE THIRD RECORD FOR NEW MEXICO. AMERICAN BITTERN 1 SEEN AT LAKE AVALON 10/16 (RCB). WOOD IBIS 5 WERE PRESENT ON THE BOSOUE DEL APACHE REFUGE FOR TWO WEEKS DURING EARLY AND MID-JULY (LO). WHITE-FACED IBIS 2 WERE SEEN AT BELEN 9/7 (LL); 2 WERE SEEN AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 9/12 AND 9/18 (VM, JHS). CANADA GOOSE 15 WERE ON HARROUN LAKE, EDDY CO., 11/13 WHERE THEY ARE SELDOM SEEN AT ALL (RCI3). SNOW AND BLUE GOOSE THE 1450 COUNTED 11/30 ON THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE ARE RECORD HIGH NUMBERS FOR THE SPECIES SINCE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE REFUGE IN 1939 (LO). ROSS' GOOSE

4 FIRST NOTED 10/30 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (LO) INCREASING TO 14 BY 11/20; ALSO SEEN BY REFUGE MANAGER, JND, PRS, DURING THIS TIME.

MALLARD

NEST WITH 7 EGGS WAS NOTED 6/10 IN CORRALES, SANDOVAL CO., AND ADULT WITH 4 DOWNY YOUNG WAS SEEN THERE 7/1 (JSF); A FLIGHTLESS BIRD WITH 2 DOWNY YOUNG WAS SEEN 7/11 ON CIMARRON RIVER ABOUT 20 MILES WEST OF OKLAHOMA LINE (DN); ADULT WITH 7 DOWNY YOUNG SEEN SAN GREGORIO LAKE, JEMEZ MTS., 7/21 (DN).

PINTAIL

NOTED AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 6/5 (PB).

BLUE-WINGED TEAL

2 PAIR NOTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 6/2 (DN); 5 SEEN ON A SMALL POND NEAR LA CIENEGA 6/14 (PRS).

AMERICAN WIDGEON

1 THIS SUMMER WITH DOWNY YOUNG IN THE CARLSBAD AREA IS APPARENTLY THE FIRST NESTING RECORD FOR THE REGION (RCB); A FEMALE IN SANTA FE 7/25 WAS EARLY (PRS).

SHOVELER

5 FEMALES ON 6/30 IN SANTA FE WERE OFF-SEASON (PRS).

WOOD DUCK

1 FEMALE WAS ON A POND AT ENGLE FISH HATCHERY, SIERRA CO., 7/3 (DN); A PAIR SEEN 10/23 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE WAS THE SECOND OBSERVATION THERE SINCE JANUARY 1963 (LO); AT LEAST 1 WAS SEEN ON TULAROSA CREEK NEAR APACHE CREEK, CATRON CO., 10/24 (JC); 1 WAS AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 11/22 (ANC); AT LEAST 2 BIRDS, 1 OF WHICH WAS COLLECTED, WERE ON THE GILA RIVER NEAR GILA 11/23 (BH).

REDHEAD SEEN IN SANTA FE EARLIER THAN USUAL (7/25, 8/15) (PRS).

CANVASBACK

1 MALE WAS IN SANTA FE 10/9 (PRS); ABOUT 100 WERE ON MORGAN LAKE NEAR FRUITLAND, SAN JUAN CO., 10/24 (AN).

RUDDY DUCK

2 FEMALES IN SANTA FE ON 6/2 WERE PROBABLY STILL MIGRANTS; 4 FEMALES SEEN ON 7/18 WERE EARLY (PRS).

HOODED MERGANSER

6 PAIR WERE SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 10/30, AND 2 PAIR 11/27 (LO); 1 PAIR WAS AT HARROUN LAKE 11/13 AND A PAIR WAS AT LAKE AVALON 11/30 (RCB).

TURKEY VULTURE

LAST NOTED 9/25 IN FARMINGTON (AN) AND SAME DATE IN SANTA FE (PRS); LAST SEEN AT LOS ALAMOS 10/4 (JRT).

MISSISSIPPI KITE

NESTED AT ROSWELL FOR THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE YEAR; ONE NEST IN A COTTONWOOD AT ROSWELL COUNTRY CLUB WAS BEING BROODED 6/8; ONE IN A COTTONWOOD AT CAHOON PARK WAS BEING BROODED 6/26; BOTH NESTS WERE SUCCESSFUL EACH HAVING 1 YOUNG AT NEST SITE 8/10; OTHER NESTS WERE ALMOST CERTAINLY IN THE AREA (VM).

GOSHAWK

1 WAS SEEN 9/22 AT LAGUNITAS LAKE WEST OF TRES PIEDRAS, TAOS CO.,(BH); AND 2 IMMATURES WERE NOTED 10/21 AT FT. BAYARD, GRANT CO. (BH).

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK

1 SEEN IN LOS ALAMOS 6/1 (PRS); 1 SEEN CAPTURING A COMMON BUSHTIT IN SPRINGTIME CANYON, SAN MATEO MTS., SOCORRO CO., 6/10 (DN); 1 BANDED AT CEDAR CREST 9/24 (MCK); OBSERVED 4 TIMES IN SILVER CITY AREA BETWEEN 8/15 AND 11/30 (BH).

COOPER'S HAWK

SEEN IN OR NEAR ROSWELL 7/19, 7/22, 8/3 (1 DIVING AT AN AVOCET) WERE FIRST SUMMER RECORDS FOR THE SPECIES IN THAT REGION (VM).

RED-TAILED HAWK

NEST WITH BROODING OR INCUBATING ADULT 7 MILES WEST AND 1 1/2 MILES SOUTH OF SOCORRO 6/2 (DN); SUCCESSFUL NESTING REPORTED NEAR LAS GALLINAS, SAN MIGUEL CO., (ES); EXCEPTIONALLY GOOD NUMBERS NOTED IN SANTA FE FOR FALL FLIGHTS (PRS).

SWAINSON'S HAWK

A MIGRATING FLOCK OF 79 WAS NOTED AT BEAVERHEAD, CATRON CO., 9/20 (BH).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK

A PAIR NESTED UNSUCCESSFULLY AT LOS ALAMOS: FIRST ADULT SEEN 6/7 (JB), NEST FIRST SEEN 7/16, AND SECOND ADULT SEEN THEN (DR); BOTH ADULTS STRONGLY DEFENDED THE NESTING AREA FOR AT LEAST 100-200 YARDS, FREQUENTLY STOOPING ON OBSERVERS AND AT ONE TIME ACTUALLY HITTING ONE OBSERVER ON TOP OF THE HEAD; EGGS OR YOUNG NOT SEEN UNTIL AFTER ADULTS DISAPPEARED 8/9 WHEN ONE EGG WAS SEEN NEAR EDGE OF NEST (WBL, JRT, ET AL.). A NEST IN THE PELONCILLO MTS., HIDALGO CO., HAD 2 LARGE YOUNG 6/27 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN AT REDROCK, GRANT CO., 7/25 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN IN MONTICELLO CANYON NORTH OF T OR C 8/21 (PRS).

ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK

SINGLE IN TYPICAL PLUMAGE SEEN 11/11 AT SEPAR, GRANT CO. (BH).

BLACK HAWK

1 ADULT SEEN AT ABOUT 7000 FEET IN RIPARIAN GROWTH NEAR MOGOLLON 7/3 (JH); 1 ADULT AND 1 IMMATURE NOT LONG OUT OF THE NEST SEEN 8/26 AT CLIFF (BH).

BALD EAGLE

1 ADULT AND 1 IMMATURE WERE SEEN BETWEEN SPRINGER AND CIMARRON 11/1 (JS).

MARSH HAWK

1 FEMALE RETURNED TO SANTA FE AS EARLY AS 8/15 (PRS).

OSPREY

1 WAS AT LAKE AVALON FROM 7/1 (RCB); 2 SEEN OVER JUAN TABO CANYON EAST OF ALBUQUERQUE 9/29 WERE APPARENTLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THERMALS (GM).

PRAIRIE FALCON

2 ADULTS AND 2 YOUNG (LEFT NEST 7/18-19) WERE SEEN IN CHACO CANYON NATIONAL MONUMENT (DN); 1 WAS SEEN AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 9/18 WHERE IT IS CASUAL IN FALL AND WINTER (VM, ANC).

PEREGRINE FALCON

SINGLE BIRDS WERE SEEN AT REDROCK 7/25 (BH, JH) AND AT CABALLO LAKE 9/24 (BH).

SPARROW HAWK

66 WERE COUNTED 9/22 IN THE 50 MILES BETWEEN FARMINGTON AND DURANGO (AN).

SCALED QUAIL

NUMBERS IN SANTA FE SEEMED LOW (PRS); PAIRED BIRDS SEEMED COMMON IN GRASSLAND OF ANIMAS VALLEY 6/22 (DN); COMMON AT CHACO CANYON NATIONAL MONUMENT WHERE ADULT AND 3 HALF-GROWN YOUNG WERE NOTED 7/17 (DN).

HARLEQUIN QUAIL

BROOD OF 12 BIRDS NOTED AT FT. BAYARD 7/22 (BH).

RING-NECKED PHEASANT

POPULATION ON THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE REMAINED LOW, AND ONLY ONE BROOD OF 5 YOUNG WAS SEEN (LO).

TURKEY

A HEN WITH 7 OR MORE QUARTER-GROWN YOUNG WAS NEAR THE TOP OF SIGNAL PEAK, GRANT CO., 6/14 (DN).

SANDHILL CRANE

ARRIVED AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 10/3 AND BUILT UP TO A PEAK OF ABOUT 38,000 BY 10/22 (VM); 2 FLOCKS TOTALING ABOUT 35 BIRDS WERE NOTED 11/23 ON THE GILA RIVER NEAR GILA (BH); 5500 ON THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 11/30 IS A RECCRD HIGH NUMBER FOR THE SPECIES THERE SINCE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE REFUGE (La).

VIRGINIA RAIL

REPORTED NESTING IN THE FARMINGTON AREA (AN); AN IMMATURE WAS CAUGHT BY A CAT, PHOTOGRAPHED AND RELEASED IN SANTA FE 9/7 (PRS).

SORA

1 OR 2 BIRDS AT REDROCK, GRANT CO. 7/25 IN FULL ADULT PLUMAGE (BH); 1 KILLED BY CAR 8/10 NEAR CARLSBAD (RCB); 2 IN SANTA FE 8/26 AND 1 9/12, 9/13 (PRS); 1 FOUND AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 9/12 AND 9/18 (VM, ANC); OBSERVED THREE TIMES AT FT. BAYARD IN SUMMER PERIOD UP TO 9/24 (BH).

COMMON GALLINULE

6 DOWNY YOUNG AND 4 ADULTS SEEN 6/15 BELOW SIX-MILE DAM ARE THE FIRST FLIGHTLESS IMMATURES EVER SEEN IN THAT AREA (RCB).

AMERICAN COOT

NUMBERS WERE CONSIDERED LOW ON THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (LO). ABOUT 1000 WERE PRESENT IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA THE LAST HALF OF NOVEMBER (ES).

SNOWY PLOVER

NOTED AT LAKE AVALON 8/10 (RCP); 3 SEEN AT ONE TIME IN THE ALAMOGORDO AREA 8/16 (JD).

KILLDEER

40 IN SANTA FE ON 9/1 WAS THE LARGEST NUMBER EVER SEEN THERE AT ONE TIME; MOST WERE GONE BY 9/22 (PRS).

MOUNTAIN PLOVER

25 WERE AT LAKE MCMILLAN THE LAST WEEK OF AUGUST (RCB); 89 WERE SEEN 10 MILES EAST OF CLAYTON 9/22 (AK).

BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER

5 OR 6 OF THIS SPECIES WERE NEAR ROSWELL 10/3; THEY ARE NOT SEEN IN THE

REGION EVERY YEAR (VM).

LONG-BILLED CURLEW

1 TO 20 WERE PRESENT DURING THE SUMMER IN CARLSBAD (RCB); THE SPECIES APPARENTLY FAILED TO NEST THIS YEAR IN DE BACA COUNTY WHERE THEY HAVE BEEN REPORTED NESTING IN RECENT YEARS; 4 WERE SEEN NEAR VAUGHN 5/17 AND 5 NEAR DUNLAP 6/4 (VM, JHS) BUT RANCHERS IN THE AREA OBSERVED NO NESTING ACTIVITY.

UPLAND PLOVER

LESS NUMEROUS THAN USUAL IN THE FIELDS AROUND ROSWELL, 13 BEING SIGHTED 8/8 (ANC) AND ABOUT 30 ON 8/16 (VM).

SPOTTED SANDPIPER

NEST WITH 4 EGGS WAS FOUND AT SAN GREGORIO LAKE, JEMEZ MTS., 7/21 (DN).

SOLITARY SANDPIPER

A GOOD FLIGHT, NOTED IN SANTA FE FROM 9/1 THROUGH 9/22, WAS LATER THAN IN THE PREVIOUS TWO YEARS (PRS).

GREATER YELLOWLEGS

NOTED 6/5 AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE (PB); NUMBERS MIGRATING THROUGH SANTA FE FROM 8/26 HTO 9/16 SEEMED GREATER THAN USUAL (PRS).

LESSER YELLOWLEGS

GREATEST NUMBER SEEN IN SANTA FE DURING THE FALL IN 2 YEARS OF WATCHING; DATES NOTED WERE FROM 7/25 THROUGH 9/29, THE LATTER BEING THE LATEST DATE RECORDED BY NEARLY 2 WEEKS (PRS).

PECTORAL SANDPIPER

UNUSUAL FOR THE REGION, WERE SEEN AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 7/30 (VM).

WHITE-RUMPED SANDPIPER

SEEN AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 7/30; THE SPECIES IS UNUSUAL IN THIS REGION (VM).

BAIRD'S SANDPIPER

FLIGHT THROUGH SANTA FE WAS LATER THAN USUAL (<u>CA</u>. 8/26 THROUGH 9/29) BUT NUMBERS WERE ABOUT NORMAL; 3 WERE NOTED IN SANTA FE 7/25 (PRS).

DOWITCHER

1 NOTED IN SPRING PLUMAGE 7/31 IN SANTA FE; 1 IN CHANGING PLUMAGE 9/22 IN SANTA FE (PRS).

STILT SANDPIPER

1 BIRD OBSERVED AND COLLECTED AT CHARETTE LAKE, COLFAX CO. 9/11 (BH).

SEMIPALMATED SANDPIPER

1 BIRD, RARE IN THE STATE, WAS PHOTOGRAPHED AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 8/3 (VM).

WESTERN SANDPIPER

1 SEEN IN SANTA FE 7/24; GOOD FLIGHT THROUGH SANTA FE, LATER THAN USUAL, NOTED FROM 8/26 THROUGH 9/29 (PRS).

AMERICAN AVOCET

1 BIRD, SAN GREGORIO LAKE, JEMEZ MTS., APPARENTLY ARRIVED 7/22 AND LEFT FOLLOWING DAY (DN); PRESENT ALL SUMMER AT WHITE SANDS NATIONAL MONUMENT (JD); NO NESTING BIRDS NOTED IN CLAYTON AREA, PRESUMABLY DUE TO DROUTH (AK).

BLACK-NECKED STILT

4 BROODS, FROM DOWNY TO 1 MONTH, NOTED 6/23 AT WILLOW LAKE, EDDY CO. (RCB). NORTHERN PHALAROPE 14 IN WINTER PLUMAGE IN SANTA FE ON 9/5 WERE THE MOST EVER SEEN THERE AT ONE TIME (PRS). SONG SPARROW

SEEN IN SANTA FE FROM 9/1 WITH PEAK ON 10/24 (PRS); ADULT BANDED 10/13 IN SILVER CITY WAS THE FIRST ONE AT THAT STATION (COMMON ALONG RIVERS BUT NOT~ EVEN AS MIGRANTS, IN SILVER CITY)(DAZ); RETURNED TO CEDAR CREST 10/18 (MCK).
