SUMMARY OF THE 1964-65 WINTER AND SPRING SEASONS

THE WEATHER PATTERN FOR THE WINTER AND SPRING PERIODS IS HARD TO CHARACTERIZE IN A GENERAL WAY AS A MOSAIC OF LOCALLY VARIABLE CONDITIONS PREVAILED OVER MUCH OF THE STATE.

THE EXTREMELY DRY SOUTHEASTERN PLAINS MAINTAINED "CRITICAL" DROUGHT CONDITIONS WITH LITTLE SNOW OR SPRING RAIN AND RANGES IN POOR SHAPE. GOOD RUN-OFF FROM THE ADJACENT SACRAMENTOS AND MORE NORTHERN MONTANE AREAS, HOWEVER, SHOULD KEEP WATER UP IN THE PECOS AND IRRIGATED AREAS. MONTGOMERY MENTIONED THE MAINTENANCE OF HIGH WATER LEVELS IN IMPOUNDMENTS IN THE AREA (PARTIALLY TO OFFSET EXPECTED HIGH SUMMER DEMANDS FOR IRRIGATION WATER) AS THE FACTOR MOST RESPONSIBLE FOR A POOR SHOREBIRD MIGRATION THERE; VERY FEW MUDFLATS WERE LEFT UNCOVERED.

THE TULAROSA BASIN (ALAMOGORDO AREA) WAS ALSO EXPECTED TO BENEFIT

SOMEWHAT FROM THE GOOD SNOWS IN THE SACRAMENTOS; IT ALSO RECEIVED SOME PRECIPITATION OF ITS OWN, NOTABLY IN MARCH, AND, DESPITE A DRY, WINDY APRIL AND MAY, THE OUTLOOK SEEMED GOOD FOR FOOD CONDITIONS IN THE AREA.

TO THE NORTH, THE CENTRAL RIO GRANDE VALLEY RECEIVED BELOW AVERAGE AMOUNTS OF WINTER AND SPRING PRECIPITATION; BUT, THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE REPORTED SATISFACTORY FOOD SUPPLIES AND 165% OF NORMAL SPRING FLOW FORECAST FOR ITS DITCHES, WITH THE "WATER PICTURE BETTER THAN FOR SEVERAL YEARS". WINTERING WATER FOWL OCCURRED ON THE REFUGE IN SLIGHTLY SMALLER NUMBERS THAN LAST YEARS THOUGH THE FIGURES FOR GEESE WERE ABOVE THE PAST FIVE YEARS' AVERAGE.

CEDAR CREST, IN THE MOUNTAINS NEAR ALBUQUERQUE, HAD A RATHER MILD, WET WINTERS AS DID FARMINGTON, IN THE SAN JUAN BASIN; THE FORMER LOCALE, AFTER A BRIEF WARM, DRY SPELL IN APRIL, EXPERIENCED A COLD, WET MAY.

THE REMAINING NORTHERN STATIONS (LOS ALAMOS, ESPANOLA, SANTA FE, LAS VEGAS) ALL REPORTED A COLD, WET WINTER WHICH CONTINUED INTO SPRING.

IN GENERAL, THE ABOVE VARIATION WAS NOT REFLECTED IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE BIRDS THEMSELVES. THERE WAS APPARENTLY A UNIFORM PAUCITY OF WINTERING BOREAL PASSERINES (NOTABLY: CASSIN'S FINCHES, RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES, EVENING GROSBEAKS, AND WAXWINGS, WITH SISKINS, BLUEBIRDS AND SOLITAIRES SCARCE IN MANY LOWLAND AREAS) AND A LATE AND GENERALLY UNSPECTACULAR SPRING MIGRATION (THOUGH HERE SOME STATIONS DID DIFFER A BIT, CEDAR CREST REPORTING ABOUT NORMAL ARRIVAL DATES FOR MOST SPECIES, WHILE SANTA FE, NOT FAR TO THE NORTH, SAW NOTHING OF MANY KINDS, NOTABLY WARBLERS, UNTIL MUCH LATER THAN USUAL.

SUBSCRIBERS TO <u>AUDUBON FIELD NOTES</u> PROBABLY HAVE SEEN AN ARTICLE IN THE JUNE, 1965, ISSUE (VOL. 19, NO. 3) TITLED "WHAT CONSTITUTE SCIENTIFIC DATA FOR THE STUDY OF BIRD DISTRIBUTION?" THIS ARTICLE POINTS UP THE PROBLEMS OF

ACCEPTING SIGHT RECORDS WITHOUT ADEQUATE SUBSTANTIATION.

NEW MEXICO HAS NO COMPLETE, UP-TO-DATE, ANNOTATED CHECK-LIST OF SPECIES. THE VARIOUS EDITORS WHO HAVE WORKED ON THE SEASONAL REPORTS ARE HANDICAPPED IN HAVING NO PUBLISHED AUTHORITY TO WHICH THEY CAN REFER FOR CURRENT INFORMATION. MANY OF THE SIGHT RECORDS SUBMITTED TO THE N.M.O.S. FIELD NOTES ARE DOUBTLESS GOOD SOUND ONES, AND SURELY ALL ARE SINCERE. BUT WHEN A RECORD IS A FIRST FOR THE STATE, OR THE AREAS IT MUST BE JUDGED WITH CARE IF THE N.M.O.S. WORK IS TO HAVE TRUE SCIENTIFIC VALUE. MANY OBSERVERS ARE NOT PERSONALLY KNOWN TO THE EDITORS, A CONFINING FACTOR IN DETERMINING VALIDITY. IF FEW OR NO DETAILS ARE LISTED WITH THE REPORTS IT IS OFTEN IMPOSSIBLE TO ASSESS IT, AND SO IT MUST BE LEFT OUT. READ AGAIN WHAT ROGER TORY PETERSON SAYS ON SIGHT RECORDS IN "HOW TO USE THIS BOOK", PREFACING THE <u>FIELD GUIDE TO</u> WESTERN BIRDS. THEN KEEP IN MIND THE FOLLOWING POINTS WHEN SUBMITTING UNUSUAL DATA:

GIVE FULL AND COMPLETE DETAILS ON WHERE AND WHEN; WHO SAW THE BIRDS AND WAS IT SEEN MORE THAN ONCE? DESCRIBE ALL FIELD MARKS NOTED; WERE THERE PHOTOGRAPHS, OR WAS A SPECIMEN TAKEN? ARE OTHER AREA RECORDS OF THE BIRD KNOWN TO THE OBSERVER?

REMEMBER: IT IS FAR BETTER TO REPORT TOO MUCH THAN TOO LITTLE!!

1 REPORTED AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE 5/15 (BOGGS); A FIRST YEAR PLUMAGE BIRD FOUND DEAD AT THE GOLF COURSE PONDS IN SANTA FE 5/29 WAS TURNED OVER TO U.N.M. AS A SPECIMEN (PRS).

HORNED GREBE

AT LEAST 7 WERE SEEN AT ELEPHANT BUTTE RESERVOIR 2/18 AMONG HUNDREDS OF EARED GREBES; 1 WAS COLLECTED AT ELEPHANT BUTTE 2/21 (BH, HAYWARD); THIS IS APPARENTLY THE FIRST SPECIMEN FOR THE STATE; 1 FOUND DEAD SOME YEARS AGO WAS NOT PRESERVED(BH).

EARED GREBE

ARRIVAL DATES: BITTER LAKES REFUGE 3/4 (ANC); CLAYTON 3/21 (AK); ROSWELL 3/22 (VM). 1 SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/20 REMAINED UNTIL 5/21 (WG).

WESTERN GREBE

200 WERE SEEN AT ONE TIME 4/25 IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA WHERE PREVIOUSLY THE MOST SEEN AT ONE TIME HAD BEEN 4 (ES).

WHITE PELICAN

USUALLY SEEN IN HUNDREDS AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE IN THE SPRING, BUT THIS YEAR WERE SEEN ONLY TWICE: 1 AT LOVING 1/10 (SW), AND 1 AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE 5/1 (VM); 42 WERE COUNTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/13 (WG).

DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT

3 WERE SEEN 3/16 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE AND 8 WERE PRESENT 5/21 (WG).

GREEN HERON

1 SEEN NEAR ALAMEDA 5/2 (LL); 1 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 5/7 (PRS); 1 SEEN ON SILVER CITY BIG-DAY COUNT 5/8; 2 NOTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 5/21 (WG).

COMMON EGRET

2 WERE NOTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/20 (WG).

SNOWY EGRET 4 WERE COUNTED 4/13 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE, AND A PEAK OF 18 WERE IN ON 5/28 (WG); THE EARLIEST SANTA FE DATE WAS 4/21 (PRS). LOUISIANA HERON 1 WAS IDENTIFIED AT HARROUN LAKE NEAR CARLSBAD 12/6 (SW); THIS IS ONE OF THE FEW SIGHT RECORDS FOR THE STATE. LEAST BITTERN 1 WAS SEEN 5/28 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (WG). AMERICAN BITTERN 1 WAS SEEN AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE 2/15 (ANC). WHITE-FACED IBIS 35 WERE SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/28 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN AT REDROCK, GRANT CO., 5/8 ON THE SILVER CITY BIG-DAY COUNT; 27 WERE SEEN AT ELEPHANT BUTTE 5/15 (BH); SEEN IN ISLETA SWAMP 5/16 (FIDE MCK). WHISTLING SWAN 1 IMMATURE BIRD WAS AT ROBERTS LAKE, GRANT CO., FROM 1/23 UNTIL AT LEAST 3/21 (BH); THE 2 BIRDS THAT HAVE WINTERED AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE FOR SEVERAL YEARS DID NOT APPEAR THIS YEAR (VM). ROSS' GOOSE 2 WERE SEEN ON LAKE MCALISTER IN A LARGE FLOCK OF CANADA GEESE 1/17 (JRT), AND WERE NOTED THERE THROUGH MARCH (ES). NEW MEXICAN DUCK 4 WERE SEEN AT THE BOSOUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 3/12 (OLVER); 2 BIRDS SEEN AT REDROCK, GRANT CO., 5/8 WERE ALSO SEEN 5/9 (BH, ET AL.); 2 WERE SEEN AT A TANK ON THE NORTH END OF THE ANIMAS MTS., HIDALGO CO., 5/22 (BH, ROY JOHNSON). GREEN-WINGED TEAL A VERY LARGE CONCENTRATION WAS AT ELEPHANT BUTTE 1/9 WHERE AN ESTIMATED 2000 BIRDS IN 3 FLOCKS WERE OBSERVED AT THE NORTH END OF THE LAKE (BH). WOOD DUCK 6 BIRDS, INCLUDING AT LEAST 2 MALES, WERE SEEN 4/7 ON THE MIMBRES RIVER 5 MILES NW OF SANTA RITA, NEAR BEAR CANYON RESERVOIR, GRANT CO., (BH, REYNOLDS); 1 WAS SEEN 4/20 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (DUKE). REDHEAD 3 WERE SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/20 AND 5 WERE THERE 5/5 (WG). RING-NECKED DUCK APPROXIMATELY 50 WERE AT STORRIE LAKE, SAN MIGUEL CO., 3/7 (PRS). CANVASBACK 4 WERE SEEN AT STORRIE LAKE, SAN MIGUEL CO., 3/7(PRS). HOODED MERGANSER 1 WAS SEEN 5/28 AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (WG). **RED-BREASTED MERGANSER** 1 IMMATURE FEMALE WAS TAKEN 1/9 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE FROM GILL NET PUT OUT BY

N.M.S.U. FISHERIES BIOLOGISTS; THIS IS APPARENTLY THE SECOND SPECIMEN FOR THE STATE, THOUGH THERE WERE OTHERS NOT PRESERVED; ON 2/18, 3 MALES AND 5 FEMALES WERE OBSERVED AT ELEPHANT BUTTE, AND IT IS LIKELY MORE WERE PRESENT AMONG THE THOUSANDS OF COMMON MERGANSERS THERE (BH).

1 WAS AT TESUQUE ALL WINTER (HUEY); THREE $RECORDS_9$ ALL ADULTS, FOR THE SILVER CITY AREA ON 12/11, 3/19, 3/29 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN ON THE SILVER CITY BIG-DAY COUNT 5/8.

RED-TAILED HAWK

3 NESTS WERE LOCATED IN TORRANCE COUNTY IN APRIL: TWO IN JUNIPERS, AND ONE ON A SANDSTONE CLIFF; EGGS WERE SEEN IN TWO; PARENT BIRD WAS FLUSHED FROM THE NEST IN ONE (JMC).

HARLAN'S HAWK

WHAT IS APPARENTLY THE THIRD STATE RECORD FOR THIS HAWK WAS REPORTED FROM ESPANOLA 12/27 BY PATRICIA SNIDER AS FOLLOWS: "ALL DARK HAWK, BUT TAIL WAS MOTTLED, NOT BANDED, WHITE ABOVE; NO WHITE TAIL COVERTS AS IN ROUGH-LEG; NOT BLACK PHASE OF FERRUGINOUS OR ROUGH-LEG: WRONG SHAPE NOT BLACK SWAINSON'S, WHICH IS EVEN MORE UNLIKELY; WING WITH LIGHTER FLIGHT FEATHERS AS IN TURKEY VULTURE OR ZONE-TAILED HAWK; NOT BLACK RED-TAIL: IT WAS ALL DARK BELOW, SOMEWHAT SMALLER".

SWAINSON'S HAWK

1 WAS SEEN SOUTH OF LOVING 1/31 (WHERE IT HAS BEEN REPORTED AS WINTERING PREVIOUSLY) (SW, <u>ET AL.</u>); FIRST OF THE YEAR IN THE SW SECTION WAS NOTED 10 MILES NORTH OF LORDSBURG 3/28 (BH); 1 WAS SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 4/18 (JND).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK

FIRST OF THE YEAR WAS NOTED 3/21 ON THE GILA RIVER NEAR GILA (BH); 1 ADULT WAS SEEN 5/2 AT LOS ALAMOS CANYON (WBL).

HARRIS' HAWK

NOTED NEAR ROSWELL ON 12/9, 1/19, 2/5, 2/27 (VM).

BLACK HAWK

SINGLE BIRD ONE MILE WEST OF GILA 5/1 AND 5/8 SECOND BIRD OBSERVED 5/8 (HARRIS, TRAVIS, <u>ET AL.</u>) FIVE MILES SE OF CLIFF, APPARENTLY NESTING. PAIR OF BIRDS OBSERVED AT THIS LOCATION BY ROY JOHNSON AND HARRIS 5/26 GAVE ALL EVIDENCE OF NESTING, THOUGH BIRD WAS NOT FLUSHED FROM NEST IN COTTONWOOD TREE. A FOURTH BIRD IN SECOND YEAR PLUMAGE WAS OBSERVED BY JOHNSON AND HARRIS ONE MILE NORTH OF THIS LOCATION 5/26. IN SUMMARY, THERE ARE EVIDENTLY 5 BLACK HAWKS ALONG THE GILA RIVER THIS SUMMER IN A STRETCH RUNNING FROM REDROCK TO CLIFF, INCLUDING ONE NESTING PAIR AND A SECOND YEAR BIRD. HARRIS OBSERVED AN ADULT AND (FLEDGLING?) YOUNG FIVE MILES SE OF CLIFF DURING THE FALL OF 1964 (8/26). A BLACK HAWK (SAME AS ABOVE?) WAS SEEN BY ZIMMERMAN <u>ET AL.</u> NEAR CLIFF-GILA 4/1 (BH).

GOLDEN EAGLE

2 WERE SEEN IN THE EMBUDITO CANYON AREA, BERNALILLO CO., FROM 12/7 THROUGH 4/4 (JLT); AN IMMATURE WAS SEEN AT ESPANOLA 12/27 (PRS); 5 WERE SEEN AT CARLSBAD CAVERNS NATIONAL PARK 2/14 (SW), AND A NEST IN THE PARK PRODUCED 1 YOUNG WHICH WAS BANDED (SANCHEZ); 2 WERE SEEN IN TRIGO CANYON EAST OF BELEN 4/1 (JLS); A NEST FOUND IN TORRANCE COUNTY 4/10 ON A LIMESTONE CLIFF EDGE CONTAINED 1 DEAD EGG AND 1 DEAD DOWNY YOUNG (JMC); 3 WERE SEEN 4/14 NEAR MT. TAYLOR, ONE OF WHICH WAS AN IMMATURE BIRD (JLS).

BALD EAGLE

1 WAS SEEN 12/20 ON THE GILA RIVER NEAR THE GILA CLIFF DWELLINGS, WHERE AN ADULT HAD BEEN REPORTED SINCE THE FIRST OF DECEMBER BY A PARK SERVICE EMPLOYEE (BH); AN IMMATURE BIRD WITH HEAD AND TAIL STILL SHOWING SOME DARK COLORING WAS SEEN 12/30 AT CABALLO RESERVOIR, SIERRA CO. (BH); 2 ADULTS AND 1 IMMATURE WERE SEEN 1/11 NEAR LA CUEVA, MORA CO. (HIBBEN); AT LEAST 2 WINTERED IN THE ANIMAS RIVER VALLEY ON THE COLORADO-NEW MEXICO BORDER (AN); 1 WAS SEEN IN APRIL NEAR HUERFANO BUTTE, SAN JUAN CO. (AN).

OSPREY

1 WAS SEEN 4/1 NEAR CLIFF-GILA BY ZIMMERMAN ORNITHOLOGY CLASS.

PRAIRIE FALCON

2 NESTS WERE LOCATED IN TORRANCE CO. IN APRIL, BOTH CONTAINING 5 EGGS (JMC).

PEREGRINE FALCON

1 WAS SEEN AT ESPANOLA 12/27 (PRS); 1 WAS SEEN IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA IN EARLY JANUARY, 3/15, 4/23, AND 5/4 (ES); SINGLES WERE SEEN AT BITTER LAKES REFUGE 2/5 AND 4/4 (VM); A PAIR WAS SEEN NEAR NAVAJO DAM, SAN JUAN RIVER, IN MAY (AN).

PIGEON HAWK

1 WAS SEEN IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA 1/30 (ES), AND IN SANTA FE 3/4 (PRS).

SANDHILL CRANE

2 WERE SEEN IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA 2/28; 22 AND 28 WERE SEEN ON TWO OCCASIONS IN THE SAME AREA IN MARCH (ES).

VIRGINIA RAIL
