HORNED GREBE

1 AT BILL EVANS LAKE NEAR CLIFF 11/22 TO 11/30 (TB, CD, DAZ).

*EARED GREBE

200 NESTS IN RIO ARRIBA CO. (CAH). 12 GREBES PROBABLY OF THIS SPECIES WERE SEEN AT SNOW LAKE SEVERAL TIMES FROM 10/23 TO 11/2 (MW); 10 TO 12 NEAR CLIFF 11/8 TO 11/22 (TB, CD).

WESTERN GREBE

SEEN AT LA CUEVA ON 6/11 (WH) AND A PAIR WAS REPORTED FROM ROBERTS LAKE, NORTH OF SILVER CITY, ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS IN THE 3U-SUMMER AND ON 9/14 (TB, CD); THIS SPECIES HAS ONLY RECENTLY BEGUN TO SUMMER IN THE STATE AND ITS SUMMER RANGE MAY BE EXPANDING. 8 NEAR FARMINGTON ON 10/23 (APN) AND 2 AT BILL EVANS LAKE ON 11/8, 11/15, AND 11/22 (RAF).

*PIED-BILLED GREBE

4 BROODS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); 1 NEAR CARLSBAD ON 7/1 WHERE NOT FOUND BREEDING RECENTLY (SW).

*DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT

NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR). 1 AT SNOW LAKE ON 11/1 (MS) MAY BE THE FIRST CATRON CO. RECORD.

*GREAT BLUE HERON

NESTS IN MORA (WH), CATRON (RAF), AND GRANT (RAF) COS.; 2 AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 (PWS ET AL.).

*GREEN HERON

NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); AN ADULT WAS FOUND AT A NEST IN BITTER LAKE NWR ON 6/15, BUT THIS WAS ABANDONED LATER (G.INMAN, VM). AN IMMATURE AT SAN ILDEFONSO POND ON 9/14 (PRS).

<u>*SNOWY EGRET</u> NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); SEEN NEAR LOS LUNAS ON 6/20 (JND); 4 NEAR TUCUMCARI ON 9/14 (IDA ET AL.) AND 2 AT LAKE ROBERTS 9/1 (RAF).

*BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR).

CANADA GOOSE

SEEN ON THE RIO GRANDE NEAR LOS LUNAS ON 6/20 (JND). 150 RED-BANDED BIRDS WERE RELEASED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 8/30-9/1 AS POSSIBLE BREEDING STOCK (RWR) AND REPORTS OF ANY SIGHTINGS WOULD BE OF INTEREST.

*MALLARD

NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR), IN SAN JUAN CO. (APN), AND AT FENTON LAKE WHERE 6 INCLUDING YOUNG WERE SEEN ON 7/1 (MBS).

*MEXICAN DUCK

2 WILD BRODS WERE SEEN AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); 5 AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 (PWS ET AL.).

*GADWALL

3 BROODS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR).

*BLUE-WINGED TEAL

1 BROOD AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR).

WOOD DUCK

A MALE WAS SEEN EAST OF LAS VEGAS ON 11/2 (WH).

BUFFLEHEAD

200 AT NAVAJO DAM ON 11/9 (APN).

WHITE-WINGED SCOTER

4 WERE SEEN AT BILL EVANS LAKE ON 11/15 (TB, CD); DETAILLS INCLUDE GOOSE-LIKE PROFILE AND A WHITE PATCH IN THE WING AND 2 ON THE HEAD, THE LATTER INDICATING IMMATURES OR FEMALES. THIS IS A RARE SPECIES IN THE STATE.

SURF SCOTER

1 WAS SEEN AT BILL EVANS LAKE ON 11/22-23 (TB, CD). THIS IS ONLY THE SECOND RECORD FOR THE STATE. DETAILS ARE SIMILAR TO THE SPECIES ABOVE EXCEPT THE WHITE WING PATCH WAS LACKING, AND AGAIN AN IMMATURE OR FEMALE WAS INVOLVED.

RUDDY DUCK

1000 PLUS AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 10/24 (PRS).

HOODED MERGANSER

4 MALES WERE SEEN AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 10/31 (VM).

COMMON MERGANSER

A FEMALE WITH 10 SMALL YOUNG WAS SEEN ON THE GILA RIVER AT THE MOUTH OF MOGOLLON CREEK ON 6/20, AND ANOTHER BROOD WAS SEEN UPSTREAM AT TURKEY CREEK A WEEK LATER (DAZ).

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER

1 WAS SEEN AT BILL EVANS LAKE ON 11/22 (TB, CD).

***TURKEY VULTURE**

NESTED IN SANTA FE CO. (TMS); 10 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

MISSISSIPPI KITE

THE ONLY SUMMER RECORD WAS 1 AT ROSWELL ON 6/12 (VM).

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK

A FEMALE, SEEN FOUR TIMES IN LATE JUNE AND ON 7/2, IN THE GILA VALLEY NEAR MOGOLLON CREEK MAY HAVE BEEN BREEDING (DAZ); 1 WAS SEEN AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. ON 7/21 (JDS) AND AN IMMATURE WAS SEEN IN GRASSLAND SOUTH OF SILVER CITY ON 6/5; THESE WERE PRESUMABLY MIGRANTS.

SWAINSON'S HAWK

LATE MIGRANTS WERE 2 AT LAS VEGAS ON 11/1 AND 1 ON 11/2 (WH).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK

1 AT SANTA CLARA PUEBLO ON 9/14 (PRS ET AL.).

ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK

EARLY FALL MIGRANTS WERE SEEN AT ISLETA ON 9/14 (JND) AND AT LAS VEGAS ON 9/21 (WH).

HARRIS' HAWK

2 IMMATURES WERE SEEN AT ROSWELL ON 8/7 (VM).

BALD EAGLE

SINGLES WERE SEEN IN CATRON CO. AT LOCO MT. ON 11/13 AND ON THE SAN AUGUSTINE PLAINS ON 11/18 (MW).

MARSH HAWK

A FEMALE WAS SEEN NEAR CARLSBAD ON 6/24 (SW).

OSPREY

1 WAS SEEN 5 MILES EAST OF CAPITAN ON A FENCE POST, 8/24 (L.A.GALLOWAY).

PIGEON HAWK

PRESENT AT ROSWELL ONCE IN THE AUTUMN (VM); 1 AT SAM ACACIA 10/26 (JND).

SPARROW HAWK

2 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

BLUE GROUSE

A PAIR WAS SEEN IN THE JEMEZ MTS. NEAR LOS ALAMOS ON 6/28 (PRS, SW).

BOBWHITE

5 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

HARLEQUIN QUAIL

1 WAS SEEN ON LOCO MT. ON 11/13 (MW).

SANDHILL CRANE

ARRIVED AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 10/2, WITH A PEAK OF 63,000 ON 10/25 (VM); 3 TO 10 SEEN 4 TIMES IN THE PERIOD 10/11 TO 11/9 NEAR GILA (TB,CD,RAF).

PURPLE GALLINULE

1 WAS CAPTURED NEAR ELIDA, ROOSEVELT CO., ON 6/20, AND WAS PHOTOGRAPHED (A.L.GENNARO); THIS IS THE 5TH RECORD FOR THE STATE, ALL BEING IN THE SPRING OR SUMMER IN THE SOUTHEAST.

*AMERICAN COOT

NESTS in SAN JUAN (APN) AND CATRON (RAF) COS.; ALSO A BROOD OF 3 YOUNG WAS SEEN AT FENTON LAKE IN THE JEMEZ MTS. ON 7/11 (MBS) AND 23 BROODS COUNTED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); 1 AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 (PWS ET AL.); 1800 AT MORGAN LAKE ON 10/5 (APN).

*SNOWY PLOVER

NESTS IN CHAVES CO. (VM).

*KILLDEER

NESTS IN CHAVES CO. (VM) AND AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); 12 AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 AND 6 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

MOUNTAIN PLOVER

2 PAIR 20 MILES EAST OF LAS VEGAS ON 6/11-12 (WH).

LONG-BILLED CURLEW

4 SEEN 20 MILES EAST OF LAS VEGAS ON 6/11-12 (WH); 25 PLUS NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

UPLAND PLOVER

AN UNUSUALLT HEAVY MIGRATION WAS RECORDD IN THE PECOS VALLEY NEAR ROSWELL, WITH THE FIRST SEEN ON 7/27 AND WITH MAXIMA OF 104 ON 8/7 AND 165 ON 8/12 (VM).

*SPOTTED SANDPIPER

NESTS IN SAN MIGUEL CO. (WH, ES).

SOLITARY SANDPIPER

1 ALONG GERONIMO TRAIL ON 7/15 (PWS ET AL.).

PECTORAL SANDPIPER

REPORTED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR ON 9/19 (JND ET AL.).

DUNLIN

2 WERE RECORDED AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 8/26 (VM) AND 4 AT BILL EVANS LAKE ON 11/8 (RAT); THIS IS A RARELY RECORDED BIRD IN THE STATE.

*AMRICAN AVOCET

NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR); 2 WERE SEEN NEAR TRUJILLO ON 9/13 (IDA ET AL.).

*BLACK-NECKED STILT

NESTS AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR) AND IN CHAVCS CO. (VM).

RING-BILLED GULL

AT LEAST 12 WERE AT EAGLE NEST LAKE ON 9/13 AND 10/3-5 (IDA ET AL.); 1 PROBABLY OF THIS SPECIES AT SNOW LAKE ON 10/26 (MW).

BONAPARTE'S GULL

1 AT MORGAN LAKE ON 9/11 (APN).

LEAST TERN

8-10 AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 6/15 BUT APPARENTLY DID NOT NEST THERE THIS YEAR (VM).

BLACK TERN SINGLES NEAR TUCUMCARI ON 9/14 (IDA ET AL.) AND AT LAKE ROBERTS ON 9/1 (RAF).

BAND-TAILED PIGEON

NUMEROUS IN THE SOUTHWEST IN SUMMER WITH 97 IN THE BLACK RANGE ON 6/13-14 (HEK ET AL.) AND FLOCKS OF 30 TO 40 NEAR CLIFF IN JUNE AND JULY (DAZ).

*ROCK DOVE

NESTED IN BERNALILLO CO. (CAH); BREEDING OF FERAL BIRDS IN THE STATE ARE OF INTEREST, ESPECIALLY IN NATURAL SITES AND/OR AWAY FROM HABITATIONS.

WHITE-WINGED DOVE

AT LEAST A DOZEN PAIRS SUMMERED IN THE GILA VALLEY SOUTH OF CLIFF, AND 50 PLUS WERE SEEN IN THE MIMBRES VALLEY, 6/21 (DAZ); 1 IN CARLSBAD ON SEVERAL DATES IN THE PERIOD 6/8 TO 6/26 (SW); 20 PLUS AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 (PWS ET AL.).

*MOURNING DOVE

NESTS IN SAN JUAN (APN), SANTA FE (CAH), BERNALILLO (CAM), TORRANCE (CAM), SOCORRO (RWR) AND GRANT (DAZ) COS.; 50 PLUS NEAR MILNESAND 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

GROUND DOVE

6 AT SAN SIMON MARSH ON 7/16 (PWS ET AL.) IS A LARGE NUMBER OF THIS RARE BIRD IN NEW MEXICO.

INCA DOVE

SINGLES AT 2 LOCATIONS IN SILVER CITY IN JUNE AND JULY (DAZ) WHERE THE SPECIES IS A VAGRANT.

YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO

FIRST IN THE GILA VALLEY IN MID-JUNE, AFTER WHICH RECORDED REGULARLY (DAZ) 1 IN MADRID IN EARLY JUNE (JLD); 1 AT LAS VEGAS an 7/4 (WH); SUMMERED IN ROSWELL (VM); 2 AT SAN SIMON MARSH 7/16 (PWS ET AL.). LATEST DATE WAS 9/19 AT LA JOYA SGR (JND).

***ROADRUNNER**

NESTS IN BERNALILLO (CAH), SOCORRO (RWR), CHAVES (VM), AND EDDY (CAH) COS.; 1 NEAR MILNESAND 7/17 (PWS ET AL.) WHERE STATUS IS POORLY KNOWN.

*BARN OWL

2 NESTS AT ROSWELL WERE APPARENTLY BOTH SUCCESSFUL, WITH ONE PRODUCING 6 FLEDGED YOUNG (VM).

*GREAT HORNED OWL

BRED IN SAN MIGUEL (TMS), TORRANCE (TMS), CHAVES (VM), AND GRANT (RAF, WBL, DAZ) Cos.

*BURROWING OWL

64 WERE COUNTED IN BREEDING COLONY AT ROSWELL ON 7/5, MOSTLY YOUNG BIRDS (VM); A PAIR WAS SEEN 9 MILES EAST OF MAGDALENA ON 7/19 (MCK), AND THE SPECIES WAS NOTED NEAR LOS LUNAS ON 6/20 (JND), AND AT CARRIZOZO ON 6/7-8 (PRS).

SPOTTED OWL

1 WAS SEEN AT VALLE GRANDE, JEMEZ MTS., ON 7/13 (PRS).

SHORT-EARED OWL

1 SEEN 10/23 AT ENTRANCE TO WATER CANON, EAST SIDE OF MAGDALENA MTS. (JDL).

*LESSER NIGHTHAWK

NESTED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (RWR).

CHIMNEY SWIFT

1--PROBABLY THIS SPECIES--ON 6/12, AND 2 on 6/18 AT ROSWELL (VM).

*WHITE-THROATED SWIFT

NESTED AT LOS ALAMOS (PRS) AND SUMMERED AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. (JDS)

<u>*BLACK-CHINNED HUMMINGBIRD</u> NESTS IN CHAVES (VM) .010 GRANT (DAZ) Cos.

*BROAD-TAILED HUMMINGBIRD

NEST IN BERNALILLO CO. (RJL); OCCASIONAL IN SUMMER AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. (JDS) AND 1 AT CARLSBAD ON 7/17 (SW).

RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD

EARLY DATES OF RETURNING AUTUMN MIGRANTS WERE: SANDIA MTS. ON 7/9 (MCK, TMS) AND JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/10 (MBS). INTERESTING WAS REPORT OF A PRAYING MANTIS EATING ONE OF THESE HUMMINGBIRDS AT A FEEDER ROSWELL ON 9/9 (R.KIRK, VM).

CALLIOPE HIMMINGBIRD

OCCASIONALLY SEEN IN THE LOWLANDS SOUTHWEST OF DEMING AND IN THE ANIMAS VALLEY IN AUGUST AND EARLY SEPTEMBER (DAZ); THIS SPECIES IS RARELY REPORTED AT LOWER ELEVATIONS.

RIVOLI'S HUMMINGBIRD

AN ADULT FEMALE WAS TAKEN AT CEDAR CREST ON 7/31 (JLD,MCK); THIS IS THE FIRST SPECIMEN, AND 4TH RECORD FROM THE NORTHERN PART OF THE STATE (OTHERS FROM CHAMA--PHOTOGRAPHED--, AND MONTEZUMA), AND OBSERVERS SHOULD BE ALERT FOR IT AS A VERY RARE POSSIBLE BREEDING BIRD IN MOUNTAIN CANONS AND FORESTS IN THAT REGION.

KINGFISHER

2-3 AT ESPANOLA ON 6/5 (PRS); SEEN AT A POND NEAR ISLETA 6/20 (JND).

*RED-SHAFTED FLICKER

NESTS IN SAN JUAN (APN), LOS ALAMOS (PRS), SAM MIGUEL (WM), CATRON (MCK), AND GRANT (RAF) COS.

*GILA WOODPECKER

NEST in GRANT CO. (DAZ).

RED-HEADED WOODPECKER

1 AT ROSWELL ON 6/27, AND 1 AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 10/9 (VM).

*ACORN WOODPECKER

NEST IN GRANT CO. (DAZ). 2 SEEN AT QUAKING ASPEN CAMPGROUND, NEAR GALLUP, ON 8/31 TO 9/1 (JND) WERE IN AN AREA WHERE FEW HAVE BEEN REPORED.

*LEWIS' WOODPECKER

NESTS IN SANTA FE (PRS) AMD MCKINLEY (A.M.REA) COS.--VERY LOCAL IN THE LATTER AREA; ADULTS WITH A JUVENILE IN LAS VEGAS ON 7/22 (WH). 1 IN LOS ALAMOS ON 8/26 AND 5 TO 6 ON 9/19 (PRS).

*YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER NEST IN LOS ALAMOS (PRS).

WILLIAMSON'S SAPSUCKER PAIR AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/22 (MBS); IMMATURES IN LOS ALAMOS 7/10 TO 8/19 (PRS).

*HAIRY WOODPECKER

A PAIR NESTED IN THE GILA VALLEY AT MOGOLLON CREEK AND AN ADULT WAS SEEN SOUTH OF CLIFF IN LATE JUNE AND JULY (DAZ); JUVENILES IN LOS ALAMOS 7/9-10 (PRS).

DOWNY WOODPECKER

FEMALE IN LOS ALAMOS 6/14; THE SPECIES SEEN THERE ALSO 6/22 TO 7/1 (PRS).

*LADDER-BACKED WOODPECKER

NESTS IN SANDOVAL (CAH) AND GRANT (DAZ) COS.

EASTERN KINGBIRD

4 NEAR ESPANOLA ON 6/5 AND 1 AT SANTA FE ON 8/23 (PRS); 1 AT CONCHAS LAKE ON 9/13-14 (IDA ET AL.).

*WESTERN KINGBIRD

NESTS IN SAN JUAN (APN), BERNALILLO (MCK), TORRANCE (CAH), SOCORRO (CAH, PRS, RWR), LINCOLN (PRS), CHAVES (CAH,VM), GRANT (DAZ), EDDY (CAH) COS.

*CASSIN'S KINGBIRD

DEPENDENT YOUNG WITH ADULT AT LAS VEGAS ON 6/25 WHERE THE SPECIES WAS ALSO SEEN IN THE SPRING AND ON 9/2 AND 10/14 (WM); 1 AT CORRALES ON 6/28 (J.FINDLEY); UP TO 30 AT ROSWELL IN FLOCKS DURING THE SUMMER, WHERE 25 BRED IN MAY AND JUNE (VM). THESE 3 BREEDING LOCALITIES BRING THE TOTAL TO 5 IN NEW MEXICO (2 OTHERS IN UNION CO.) AS THIS SPECIES CONTINUES TO EXPAND AS A BREEDING BIRD IN THE STATE.

BROWN-HEADED COWBIRD

NOTED AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. ON 6/21 (JDS); 8 NEAR MILINESANO ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.). STATUS OF THIS SPECIES IN THE NORTHWEST AND EASTERN PLAINS IS NOT SATISFACTORILY KNOWN.

BRONZED COWBIRD

REPORTED BREEDING IN THE GILA VALLEY AT MOGOLLON CREEK WHERE PHOTOGRAPHED IN JUNE AND JULY (DAZ). THIS SPECIES IS STILL SPREADING IN THE GILA VALLEY, WHERE FIRST RECORDED AT REDROCK IN JUNE 1962; WHILE LOCAL AND RARE OR UNCOMMON, IT MAY BE OVERLOOKED DUE TO CONFUSION WITH BROWN-HEADED COWBIRDS. (NOTE: BRONZED COWBIRD EGGS ARE WHITE, NOT SPECKLED AS ARE THOSE OF THE BROWN-HEADED.)

WESTERN TANAGER

PRESUMED MIGRANTS WERE SEEN AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. on 6/13 (JDS) AND ROSWELL an 7/28 (VM); LATE WAS A FEMALE AT ALBUQUERQUE 11/1-2 (JND).

SCARLET TANAGER

AN IMMATURE TAKEN AT CEDAR CREST ON 10/10 IS THE SECOND SPECIMEN FROM THE STATE (JDL,MCK), THE FIRST BEING A PREVIOUSLY MISIDENTIFIED FEMALE TAKEN IN SOCORRO CO. MAY, 1964.

HEPATIC TANAGER

SEEMINGLY PARIED BIRDS IN S.U. CANON IN JUNE-AUGUST (MCK), AND NEAR LOS ALAMOS ON 6/5 (PRS).

*BLACK-HEADED GROSBEAK

NEST IN SAN MIGUEL CO. (WH); 64 WERE BANDED DURING SUMMER AT LOS ALAMOS WHERE MANY YOUNG WERE PRODUCED (PRS); 55 WERE BANDED AT CEDAR CREST (MCK).

*BLUE GROSBEAK

NESTS IN BERNALILLO (MCK) AND GRANT (DAZ) COS.; SEEN AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. 6/19 (JDS); 2 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

*INDIGO BUNTING

A NEST WITH EGGS WAS FOUND NEAR CLIFF ON 6/12 (DAZ); THIS IS THE FIRST BREEDING RECORD IN THE GILA VALLEY, ALTHOUGH THE SPECIES HAS BEEN A REGULAR SUMMER RESIDENT THERE SINCE 1962 OR 1963.

LAZULI BUNTING

1 AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/13 (PRS); 2 SINGING MALES WERE AT CEDAR CREST IN JUNE-AUGUST, AND 2 FEMALES WITH BROOD PATCH WERE BANDED '/6 AND 8/12 (MCK).

DICKCISSEL

1 WITH A FLOCK OF SPARROWS AT MAGDALENA ON 9/20 (JND, JDL ET AL.) THIS SPECIES IS A RARE BUT REGULAR AUTUMN MIGRANT IN THE STATE AND MAY BE EXPECTED TO CONSORT WITH HOUSE SPARROWS IN TOWNS.

EVENING GROSBEAK

SUMMER RECORDS ARE FROM LOS ALAMOS (PRS), DEL MONTE RANCH (WH), AND CEDAR CREST (MCK), THE EARLIEST BEING LATE JUNE.

CASSIN'S FINCH

THIS SPECIES SUMMERED IN THE JEMEZ MTS. WHERE IT WAS RECORDED IN SMALL NUMBERS AT LOS ALAMOS ON 6/4, 6/10 TO 7/14, 7/16 AND 8/1, INCLUDING A MALE BANDED THERE an 4/13 RETRAPPED ON 8/8 (WBL,PRS); ALSO AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/4 (MBS).

*HOUSE FINCH

A TOTAL OF 57 NESTS RECORDED IN SAN JUAN (APN), SANDOVAL (CAH), SANTA FE (CAH), SAN MIGUEL (WH), BERNALILLO (CAH,RJL), TORRANCE (CAH), LINCOLN (PRS), CHAVES (VM), AND GRANT (RAF,DAZ) COS.

PINE SISKIN

2 YOUNG WERE SEEN AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/19 (MBS); THE SPECIES WAS RECORDED AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. ON 7/25 (JDS).

*LESSER GOLDFINCH

2 NESTS AT LOS ALAMOS (WBL).

RED CROSSBILL

PAIRS IN LOS ALAMOS WITH LARGE YOUNG BEGINNING ON 6/4 (PRS), 6 BIRDS IN THE BLACK RANGE ON 6/12 (HEK ET AL.), AND A FLOCK IN S.U. CANON ON 7/20-21 (MCK). AUTUMN RECORDS WERE FROM 9/13 THROUGH 11/27 AND INCLUDING TRES RITOS (IDA ET AL.), DEL MONTE RANCH AND GASCON (WM), COWLES (IDA ET AL.), LOS ALAMOS (PRS), JEMEZ MTS. AND JEMEZ SPRINGS (MBS), AND TAJIQUE-TORREON (JND ET AL.).

*GREEN-TAILED TOWHEE

NESTS IN RIO ARRIBA (CAH) AND LOS ALAMOS (PRS) COS.

***BROWN TOWHEE**

NESTS IN SANTA FE (CAH), BERNALILLO (CAH,MCK), AND GRANT (RAF,DAZ) COS.; COMMON IN SUMMER AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. (JDS). SEEN AT TUCUMCARI ON 9/14 (IDA ET AL.); STATUS OF THE SPECIES ON THE EAST SIDE IS POORLY KNOWN.

LARK BUNTING

A FEW 20 MILES EAST OF LAS VEGAS ON 6/11-12 (WM); SINGLES AT TRAS PIEDRAS ON 7/13 (WH), AND EAST OF ALBUQUERQUE ON 6/10 (MCK) WERE PRESUMABLY MIGRANTS. A MALE AT HORSE SPRINGS ON 8/15 WAS IN BREEDING PLUMAGE (MCK); LARGE FLOCKS EAST OF TUCUMCARI ON 9/14 (IDA ET AL.).

LECONTE'S SPARROW

1 AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 11/24 WAS THE FIRST SEEN THERE IN SEVERAL YEARS (J.H.SIKES,VM).

VESPER SPARROW

SEEN BETWEEN THE RIO GRANDE AND TRES PIEDRAS ON 6/22 (WH).

*LARK SPARROW

NESTS IN SAN MIGUEL (WH) AND EDDY (CAH) COS.

CASSIN'S SPARROW

COMMON NEAR GAGE UNTIL AT LEAST MID-JUNE (DAZ); 6 NEAR MILNESAND ON 7/17 (PWS ET AL.).

BLACK-THROATED SPARROW

NESTS IN BERNALILLO (CAH), SOCORRO (CAH), AND EDDY (CAH) COS.; VERY COMMON IN SUMMER AT CHACO CANON NATL. MON. (JDS).

SLATE-COLORED JUNCO

1 AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 10/25 (MBS).

OREGON JUNCO

EARLY AUTUMN RECORDS WERE 10/12 AT LOS ALAMOS (PRS), 10/18 AT LAS VEGAS (WH), AND 10/25 AT BAYARD (RAF); THE EARLIEST MEARNSI TYPE WAS 9/16 AT LOS ALAMOS (PRS).

*GRAY-HEADED JUNCO

NESTS IN LOS ALAMOS (PRS) AND SAN MIGUEL (WH) COS.; FIRST JUVENILES AT JEMEZ SPRINGS ON 7/7 (MBS).

*CHIPPING SPARROW

NESTS IN LOS ALAMOS (WBL) AND BERNALILLO (DLD) COS.

CLAY-COLORED SPARROW

1 AT SANTA FE ON 9/10 (PRS), SEEN NEAR LAS VEGAS ON 9/21 AND 10/19 (WH), AND 6 NEAR ROSWELL ON 10/2 (VM).

BREWER'S SPARROW SINGLES IN LOS ALAMOS ON 8/21 AND 9/12 (PRS).

BLACK-CHINNED SPARROW RECORDED IN THE BURRO MTS. NEAR TYRONE IN JUNE (DAZ).

SONG SPARROW

2 AT FENTON LAKE IN THE JEMEZ MTS. ON 7/11 (MBS); 3 AT SAN SIMON MARSH 7/16 (PWS ET AL.).

SUMMARY OF THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM IN NEW MEXICO FOR 1969, AND A FIVE-YEAR ANALYSIS

NINTEEN-SIXTY-NINE WAS A GOOD YEAR FOR THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM IN NEW MEXICO FOR BOTH THE TOTAL NUMBER OF RECORDS SUBMITTED AND THE TOTAL NUMBER OF SPECIES RECORDED. THE NUMBER OF RECORDS SUBMITTED DROPPED SLIGHTLY FROM THE 624 SUBMITTED IN 1968 TO A TOTAL OF 578 THIS YEAR. THIS, HOWEVER, IS A NEGLIGIBLE DROP SINCE AT LEAST THREE OF THE MAJOR CONTRIBUTORS IN 1968 WERE UNABLE TO SUBMIT RECORDS FOR THE 1969 SEASON. MOREOVER, ONE RECORDER INADVERTENTLY SENT HIS RECORDS DIRECTLY TO CORNELL, RATHER THAN SUBMITTING THEM THROUGH N.M.O.S., SO THAT HIS RECORDS ARE NOT INCLUDED IN OUR TOTALS. THE RECORDS OF ANOTHER RECORDER WERE APPARENTLY LOST IN THE MAIL, BUT WILL BE RE-SUBMITTED, IN ADDITION TO RECORDS FOR 1969, RECORDS FOR PREVIOUS YEARS HAVE CONTINUED TO FLOW IN, ADDING SIGNIFICANTLY TO OUR KNOWLEDGE OF BREEDING BIRDS IN THE STATE. ALTHOUGH ONLY THREE NEW SPECIES WERE ADDED TO OUR LIST FOR THE 1,969 SEASON, BACK RECORDS ADDED ANOTHER 11 NEW SPECIES. WE NOW HAVE RECENT RECORDS FOR 177 SPECIES OF NESTING BIRDS FOR NEW MEXICO. SINCE N.M.O.S. BEGAN PARTICIPATING IN THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM IN 1965, A TOTAL Or APPROXIMAGELY 2310 RECORD\$ HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED.

IN THE SUMMARY OF THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM FOR 1968, I INCLUDED LIST OF 79 SPECIES FROM J. STOKLEY LIGON'S NEW MEXICO BIRDS WHICH MAY BREED IN THE STATE, BUT FOR WHICH WE HAVE NO RECORDS IN THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM. SINCE THAT TIME WE HAVE RECEIVED RECORDS FOR EIGHT OF THESE SPECIES: EARED GREBE, DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT, GREEN HERON, BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON, BARN OWL, BROWN CREEPER, LAZULI BUNTING, AND BREWER'S SPARROW. WHILE OUR PICTURE OF NESTING ACTIVITY IN THE STATE CONTINUES TO GROW, THERE REMAINS AMPLE ROOM FOR MAJOR CONTRIBUTIONS. ACCURATE RECORDS ARE STILL NEEDED FOR A LARGE NUMBER OF SPECIES WHICH CERTAINLY BREED IN THE STATE, BUT FOR WHICH WE HAVE NO RECORDS IN THE PROGRAM. IN ADDITION, THERE ARE MANY SPECIES (51) FOR WHICH WE HAVE ONLY ONE OR TWO RECORDS. FOR THESE SPECIES WE NEED ADDITIONAL RECORDS TO GIVE A MORE ACCURATE REPRESENTATION OF THEIR BREEDING SEASONS. THE SPECIES MISSING FROM OUR RECORDS, AND THOSE SPECIES REPRESENTED BY FEW RECORDS, CONTINUE TO REFLECT ANOTHER GAP IN OUR KNOWLEDGE Or THE STATE, THAT IS, THE SPOTTY RECORD FROM CERTAIN GEOGRAPHIC AREAS. RECORDS FROM WATERFOWL AND MARSH BIRD NESTING AREAS, HIGH MOUNTAINS AND THE EASTERN PLAINS REMAIN SCARCE. THE PAUCITY OF RECORDS FROM THE PLAINS AREAS IS REFLECTED ALSO IN THE BREAKDOWN OF NEST RECORDS BY COUNTIES.

CHART 1 INDICATES THE NUMBER OF NEST RECORDS SUBMITTED FOR EACH COUNTY IN THE STATE DURING EACH YEAR OF PARICIPATION BY N.M.O.S. IN THE NEST RECORD PROGRAM. THE FINAL COLUMN INDICATES THE TOTAL NUMBERS OF RECORDS SUBMITTED FOR EACH COUNTY DURING THE FIVE YEARS THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN IN OPERATION. CURRY COUNTY IS THE ONLY ONE OF THE STATE'S 32 COUNTIES FOR WHICH NO RECORDS HAVE SEEN SUBMITTED. OF THE APPROXIMATELY 2235 RECORDS SUBMITTED ON WHICH THE CHART IS BASED, NEARLY ONE-THIRD (651 RECORDS) ARE FOR GRANT COUNTY. IF COVERAGE OF THAT COUNTY CONTINUES AT THE SAME LEVEL, IT MAY BE POSSIBLE TO PREPARE A RELATIVELY ACCURATE LIST OF NESTING SPECIES FOR THAT COUNTY WITHIN FIVE OR TEN YEARS. THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF RECORDS SUBMITTED PER COUNTY OVER THE FIVE-YEAR PERIOD IS 69. BASED ON THIS FIGURE, 12 COUNTIES HAVE RECEIVED AVERAGE OR MORE THAN AVERAGE ATTENTION, WHILE THE REMAINING 20 COUNTIES HAVE BEEN LESS EXTENSIVELY COVERED. IN GENERAL, COUNTIES MOST DISTANT FROM THE POPULATION CENTERS OF ALBUQUERQUE, SANTA FE, LOS ALAMOS, SILVER CITY, ROSWELL, AND CARLSBAD TEND TO RECEIVE THE LEAST COVERAGE.

CHART 2 IS BASED ON ALL OF THE RECORDS SUBMITTED SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE WEST RECORD PROGRAM. IT INDICATES THE NUMBER OF SPECIES, OF THE 177 SPECIES REPORTED FOR NEW MEXICO, WHICH NEST DURING EACH MONTH OF THE YEAR.
