IN "INDEX TO N.M.O.S. FIELD NOTES, SEASONAL REPORT #1, JUNE-SEPTEMBER, 1962 - VOLUME VI, NO. 2, JUNE 1-NOVEMBER 30, 1967", MAKE THE FOLLOWING CORRECTION:

UNDER DICKCISSEL, CHANGE 66-2,44 TO READ 66-2, 42.

PROBABLY THE OUTSTANDING WEATHER EVENT OF THIS REPORT PERIOD WAS THE MASSIVE STATE—WIDE SNOWSTORM IN MID—DECEMBER WHICH PILED SNOWS TO UNPRECEDENTED DEPTHS PARTICULARLY IN THE WESTERN PORTION OF THE STATE. IN PLEASANTON, USUALLY ONE OF THE MILDER WINTER AREAS, SNOW WAS EIGHT OR MORE INCHES DEEP FROM THE 18TH TO 20TH OF DECEMBER, AND NOT ONLY SUCH SPECIES AS OREGON AND GRAY—HEADED JUNCOS AND WHITE—CROWNED SPARROWS, BUT ALSO LINCOLN'S, FOX (ONE), SONG, RUFOUS—CROWNED, BLACK—THROATED, AND BREWER'S SPARROWS, ALONG WITH BROWN, RUFOUS—SIDED, AND GREEN—TAILED (ONE) TOWHEES, CARDINALS AND HOUSE FINCHES, WERE ALL FEEDING TOGETHER ON AMARANTHUS SEEDS. ROAD KILLS IN LUNA, SIERRA AND OTHER COUNTIES WERE ENORMOUS AS BIRDS GATHERED IN SNOW—FREE RUTS ON THE HIGHWAYS TO FEED. MEADOWLARKS WERE REPORTED FEEDING ON ROAD—KILLED BIRDS. AFTER THE SNOW CEASED, TEMPERATURES DROPPED TO VERY LOW LEVELS WHICH DOUBTLESS COMPOUNDED THE DIFFICULTIES. THE EFFECT OF DISASTERS SUCH AS THIS ON BIRD POPULATIONS THE FOLLOWING BREEDING SEASON WOULD MAKE AN INTERESTING STUDY.

ROOKERIES WERE REPORTED IN THE WATROUS AREA, MORA CO., WITH 18 COMPLETED NESTS ON 4/27 (WH); AT THE SALMAN RANCH, LA CUEVA, MORA CO., WITH 18 NESTS ON 4/28 (ES); AT GILA CLIFF DWELLINGS NATIONAL MONUMENT 4 YOUNG ON 5/11 AND 14 ON 5/30 (RAF).

GREEN HERON

1 SEEN 5 MILES SOUTH OF RESERVE ON SAN FRANCISCO RIVER, CATRON CO., 5/5 (MCK).

LITTLE BLUE HERON

SINGLE ADULT AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 4/5 (VM, JHS) AND 5/2 (VM), AND AN IMMATURE ON 4/29 (JHS); 1 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR ON 5/5 (JND, WWH).

CATTLE EGRET

3 AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 4/5 (WR); THIS VERY RARE VISITANT HAS STILL NOT BEEN COLLECTED OR PHOTOGRAPHED IN THE STATE.

REGARDED AS A HIGH NUMBER THERE (VM); PEAK OF 2250 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR ON 1/9 WITH 200 PRESENT ON 2/22, AND 1 UNTIL 4/25 (RWR); PEAK OF 2100 AT LAS VEGAS IN LATE JANUARY, WITH 300 PRESENT IN LATE MARCH, AND 15 ON 5/19; 1500 AT LA CUEVA ON 3/27 WERE REGARDED AS A MONTH LATE IN DEPARTURE (JLS); 5 AT FARMINGTON ON 5/11 (APN); SEVERAL PAIR WITH DOWNY YOUNG AT LA CUEVA 5/19 (WH, ES).

6 AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 12/29 (VM); THE SPECIES IS RARE IN THE STATE IN THE WINTER.

OLDSQUAW

A FEMALE WAS SEEN AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 5/2 AND 5/15 (VM, WR); THIS APPEARS TO BE THE FOURTH RECORD FOR THE STATE AND THE SECOND FOR THE SOUTHEAST.
