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SUMMARY

THE SUMMER OF 1967 WAS COOL, WET, AND WINDY, BRINGING AN END TO THE DROUGHT OF THE PREVIOUS WINTER AND SPRING. SUCH REPORTS AS "ABNORMALLY WET" AT LAS VEGAS, "A CONSTANT DELUGE" AT CHAMA, AND "SOGGY" AT CEDAR CREST, WERE RECEIVED AT THE SUMMER'S CLOSE. FLOODS IN JUNE AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE KEPT POPULATIONS OF MARSH AND SHOREBIRDS BELOW LAST YEAR'S LEVELS. DURING THE SUMMER, HUMIDITY WAS UNUSUALLY HIGH. NATIONAL FORESTS WHICH HAD BEEN CLOSED EARLIER WERE AGAIN OPENED TO CAMPING AS THE EXTREME FIRE HAZARD LESSENED. BY THE END OF THE SUMMER, PONDS WERE FULL AND RANGELANDS WERE TERMED IN EXCELLENT CONDITION.

THE BELOW NORMAL PRECIPITATION AND KILLING FROSTS OF SPRING RESULTED IN VERY SLOW HERBACEOUS GROWTH. UNTIL MID-JUNE, PLANT PRODUCTION WAS POOR AND THERE WAS LITTLE FLOWERING FOR SEED PRODUCTION. GRASSHOPPERS AND OTHER INSECTS DID NOT APPEAR IN NUMBERS UNTIL JULY. VERY LITTLE NESTING ACTIVITY WAS REPORTED IN JUNE, WHEN CONDITIONS WERE AT THEIR WORST. MANY SPECIES WERE REPORTED TO HAVE NESTED LATER, OR AGAIN, AFTER RAINS IMPROVED THE SITUATION. BIRD POPULATIONS SEEM TO BE IMPROVING IN THE NORTHERN MOUNTAINS OF THE STATE SINCE CONCLUSION OF SPRAYING FOR SPRUCE BUD-WORM SEVERAL YEARS AGO. GREATER NUMBERS OF WESTERN WOOD PEWEES, HERMIT THRUSHES, WARBLING VIREOS, WESTERN TANAGERS, BLACK-HEADED GROSBEAKS, LESSER GOLDFINCHES, WERE REPORTED.

AFTER HURRICANE BEULAH DEVASTATED SOUTHERN TEXAS IN MID-SEPTEMBER, THE STORM CIRCLED SOUTH OF NEW MEXICO, TURNED NORTH INTO ARIZONA, AND MOVED OVER NORTHWESTERN NEW MEXICO BEFORE ENTERING COLORADO. DIRECTION AND INTENSITY OF THE HURRICANE MAY ACCOUNT FOR MANY OF THE STRAYS REPORTED IN THE WEST.

MUCH OF THE COUNTRY DRIED OFF QUICKLY DURING THE FALL, AND REMAINED SO UNTIL THE SNOWS BEGAN IN LATE NOVEMBER. DAYS WERE CLEAR AND MILD. FALL WAS NOTEWORTHY FOR THE LOW NUMBERS OF MIGRANTS SEEN PASSING THROUGH, AND FOR LATE LINGERING OF SOME SPECIES. AFTER THE SUMMER AND EARLY AUTUMN RAINS THE NATURAL FOOD SUPPLY WAS ABUNDANT. LATE SPRING FROSTS, HOWEVER, HAD DESTROYED MANY FRUIT AND SEED CROPS, SO SOME PLANTS NEVER PROPERLY MATURED.

THE FOLLOWING REPORT OF A PROTHONOTARY WARBLER WAS RECEIVED AFTER PUBLICATION OF THE SPRING ISSUE IN WHICH IT WOULD NORMALLY FALL: ON MAY 17, 1967, AT ABOUT 7:00 P.M., IN THE BACKYARD OF A HOME IN ALAMOGORDO, OTERO COUNTY, A PROTHONOTARY WARBLER WAS IDENTIFIED FROM A DISTANCE OF 25 FEET.
