SEASONAL REPORT

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SUMMARY

JUNE 1 TO NOVEMBER 30, 1966

THE SUMMER OF 1966 WAS WET AND CLOUDY WITH HIGH HUMIDITY. RAINS BEGAN EARLUER THAN USUAL BUT WERE SPOTTY IN SOME AREAS, WITH THE ALBUQUERQUE AREA RECEIVING LESS THAN NORMAL RAINFALL. MOST PONDS WERE FILLED. THE RIO GRANDE BELOW BELEN WAS LOWER THAN LAST YEAR, BUT LAKES WERE FULL.

AFTER THE DRY SPRING, GROWTH OF WILD FLOWERS WAS STUNTED, BUT PRODUCED MANY BLOOMS. THERE WAS A GOOD CROP OF WEED SEEDS, JUNIPER BERRIES, SPRUCE CONES IN THE HIGHER MOUNTAINS, AND OF ACORNS; PINONS WERE PRODUCED IN THE SOUTHWESTERN CORNER OF THE STATE. RANGE GRASS WAS TERMED GOOD TO EXCELLENT IN SOME AREAS. PRODUCTION OF APPLES, RUSSIAN OLIVES, AND VIRGINIA CREEPER BERRIES WAS GOOD ALSO.

SOME SPRING MIGRANTS LINGERED INTO THE FIRST WEEK OF JUNE. IT WAS CONSIDERED AN EXCELLENT NESTING SEASON WITH WELL—SCATTERED POPULATIONS. FIRST "FEEL OF FALL" CAME ON AUGUST 12 IN SANTA FE, TURNING THE TIPS OF THE MOUNTAIN MAPLES TO RED BY AUGUST 15 ABOVE 10,000 FEET. MIGRATION BEGAN EARLY BY AUGUST 9 AT CEDAR CREST, AND AUGUST 3 NEAR ESPANOLA.

POPULATION NUMBERS OF PEWEES, WESTERN FLYCATCHERS, WESTERN TANAGERS, AND HERMIT THRUSHES REMAINED LOW IN THE NORTHERN MOUNTAINS.

HEAVY RAINS IN THE SOUTHEAST BROUGHT FLOODS TO CARLSBAD ON AUGUST 21 TO 23, WITH UP TO 8 INCHES OF PRECIPITATION IN SOME AREAS. THESE RAINS CEASED IN EARLY SEPTEMBER AND THE FALL BECAME SUPERB, BUT EXTREMELY DRY. NO TREMENDOUS STORMS MOVED THROUGH THE STATE, AND IT WAS THOUGHT TO BE THE DRIEST IN A DECADE. THE FIRST FRONT AT LAS VEGAS CAME ON OCTOBER 13, WHICH IS LATE.

AT FARMINGTON, NOVEMBER TEMPERATURES WERE FIVE TO EIGHT DEGREES ABOVE NORMAL. THERE HAD BEEN NO SNOW YET BY NOVEMBER 30; FLOWERS WERE STILL IN BLOOM IN PROTECTED PLACES, AND SOME SHRUBS WERE STILL IN LEAF.

MIGRATION WAS DEEMED LIGHT WITH FEW CONCENTRATIONS, DUE TO OPEN WEATHER. AFTER A FLURRY OF EARLY MIGRANTS, MANY LINGERED BEYOND THEIR NORMAL DEPARTURE DATES. THERE WERE FEW RARITIES NOTED. AT ROSWELL, MOON OBSERVATIONS FROM SEPTEMBER 20 TO OCTOBER 3 SHOWED BIRDS SLIPPING BY IN THE EARLY EVENING AT THE RATE OF ONE EVERY TWO MINUTES, WITH FEWER FROM OCTOBER 21 TO 24. THE

BIGGEST DATE AT CEDAR CREST WAS RATHER LATE: OCTOBER 29.

CARLSBAD HAD A GOOD FALL HAWK MIGRATION; THERE WERE GOOD POPULATIONS OF HUMMINGBIRDS; DUCKS AND GEESE WERE STAYING NORTH. ROSWELL HAD A GOOD FLIGHT OF SHOREBIRDS: A UNIT IN BITTER LAKE REFUGE WAS DRAINED TO ERADICATE CARP, AND BY SEPTEMBER 30 WIDE AREAS OF MUDFLATS HAD SEVERAL HUNDRED OF 16 SPECIES. ALSO, A DROWNED FIELD NEAR ROSWELL ON SEPTEMBER 15 ATTRACTED ABOUT 300 SHOREBIRDS OF 7 SPECIES.

THERE WERE REPORTS OF BOREAL SPECIES INTRUDING THE LOWLANDS, WITH SIGNS THAT THIS MIGHT BE ANOTHER OF THOSE INFREQUENT YEARS WHEN HIGH-ALTITUDE SPECIES ARE PRESENT IN LOW ELEVATIONS.

EARED GREBE

2 AT WILLOW LAKE, EDDY CO., IN JUNE (SW), AND 1 AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE ON 6/4 ARE LATE RECORDS FOR THE SEASON (VM).

WESTERN GREBE

1 WAS AT LA JOYA STATE GAME REFUGE 10/22 (WCT); 6 AT LAKE ROBERTS 10/27 WAS AN UNUSUAL NUMBER (WG); AT LEAST 1 WAS ON MCALISTER LAKE, SAN MIGUEL CO., 10/30 (DM); 3 WERE SEEN NEAR LAS VEGAS 11/15 (ES); 1 WAS AT HARROUN LAKE 11/19 (SW) AND 11/25 (JP. SW).

PIED-BILLED GREBE

YOUNG WERE RECORDED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE DURING THE SUMMER (EVK); 1 WAS AT SAN ILDEFONSO PUEBLO POND, NEAR LOS ALAMOS, 9/28 (PRS); AT LEAST 24 WERE AT LA CUEVA STATE GAME REFUGE, NEAR MORA, 10/30 (DM); COMMON ON LAKE ROBERTS DURING OCTOBER, WITH A MAXIMUM OF 30 BIRDS (WG).

WHITE PELICAN

ARRIVED AT LAKE AVALON IN EARLY OCTOBER AND BUILT UP TO 200 IN NOVEMBER (SW); 75 AT BITTER LAKE REFUGE 10/15 TO 11/20 (VM).

GREAT BLUE HERON

3 NESTS WERE IN PONDEROSA SNAG ON THE HEART BAR RANCH, CATRON CO., BUT THE EXACT NUMBER OF YOUNG WAS NOT ASCERTAINED; AT LEAST 2 IMMATURE WERE NOTED IN THE AREA IN LATE SUMMER AND FALL (WG) 11 WERE COUNTED NEAR LAS VEGAS 8/28 (ES); 1 WAS AT GARTON LAKE, NEAR ALAMOGORDO, OTERO CO., 9/4 (JRD); 3 WERE SEEN AT ESPANOLA 8/25 (PRS, SW), AND 1 WAS THERE 11/1 AND 11/30 (MAC, PRS); HALF A DOZEN WERE SEEN AT LA CUEVA REFUGE 10/30 (DM).

GREEN HERON

NUMBERS WERE UP IN THE EDDY CO. AREA THIS SUMMER WITH FROM 1 TO 4 BIRDS SEEN AT ONE TIME (DF, SW); 1 WAS AT ESPANOLA 8/25 (PRS, SW).

COMMON EGRET

1 WAS AT HARROUN LAKE 8/1 AND 10/26 (SW); ABSENT FROM BITTER LAKE REFUGE WHERE IT IS EXPECTED REGULARLY (VM); 1 AT ESPANOLA 8/25 WAS NORTH OF ITS USUAL RANGE, ALTHOUGH THERE IS AT LEAST ONE PREVIOUS RECORD FOR THIS VALLEY: BIRD WAS BIGGER, SLIMMER THAN A SNOWY EGRET, HAD A YELLOW BILL, BLACK FEET (PRS, SW).

SNOWY EGRET

3 SEEN 8/28 AT MORGAN LAKE, SAN JUAN CO., WAS THE FIRST FALL RECORD TRERE; 1 WAS PRESENT ON 9/3 AND 2 ON 9/10 (APN); NUMBERS WERE LESS AT ROSWELL IN SEPTEMBER (VM); 1 WAS AT ESPANOLA 9/10 (WBL, WCT).

BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON

NOTED NESTING AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE IN THE SUMMER (EVK); PARTIALLY RECOVERED IN EDDY CO. FROM RECORD LOW NUMBERS IN 1965 (SW); 5 IMMATURES WERE AT LOWDERMILK POND, ESPANOLA, 7/2 (WCT), AND 1 WAS SEEN AT LAKE ROBERTS 7/10 (RAF).

AMERICAN BITTERN

1 WAS SEEN 9/10 AT RIVERSIDE, RIO ARRIBA CO. (WBL, DR, WCT).

CANADA GOOSE

27 NOTED AT LA JOYA STATE GAME REFUGE 10/24 WERE THE FIRST WINTER SEASON ARRIVALS THERE (JLS); FIRST ONES SEEN AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE WERE ON 10/25 WITH A PEAK OF 1805 (VERY LOW) ON 12/2 (EVK).

BLACK BRANT

APPEARED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 10/31 AND REMAINED UNTIL 11/25 FOR WHAT IS APPARENTLY THE FIRST STATE RECORD; THE BIRD WAS PHOTOGRAPHED, AND A BLACK AND WHITE PRINT IS ON FILE AT THE MUSEUM OF SOUTHWESTERN BIOLOGY, U.N.M. (EVK); 1 WAS LATER FOUND AT BERNARDO WATERFOWL REFUGE IN A SICK OR INJURED CONDITIONS AND IS RECUPERATING IN A PEN AT TESUQUE UNDER THE CARE OF W. S. HUEY; THE PLUMAGE OF THIS BIRD IS IN SUCH POOR CONDITION THAT SPECIES CANNOT BE ACCURATELY DETERMINED UNTIL MOLT TAKES PLACE.

WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE

1 WAS SEEN AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 10/23 (WCT), AND 3 WERE THERE 12/2 (EVK).

SNOW GOOSE

33 WERE COUNTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 9/29, WITH A PEAK OF 1882 ON 12/2; THIS NUMBER HAS INCREASED EACH YEAR, AND THIS IS THE HIGHEST COUNT YET; IN 1956, 400 WAS A NEW HIGH (EVK).

BLUE GOOSE

2 WERE AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 9/29, AND A PEAK OF 26 ON 12/2 (EVK).

MALLARD

NUMBERS INCREASED IN THE SOUTHEAST SECTION OF THE STATE WHERE AT LEAST 10 PAIR WERE REPORTED TO HAVE NESTED ON THE PECOS RIVER FROM SIX—MILE DAM TO HARROUN LAKE (SW); NESTING AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE WAS REPORTED TO BE AVERAGE (EVK); 500 WERE COUNTED ON MORGAN LAKE, SAN JUAN CO., 10/19 (APN); 200 WERE COUNTED AT LA JOYA 10/22 (WCT); 15 WERE AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS); 3 WERE SEEN 11/26 ON PARTIALLY FROZEN SAN GREGORIO LAKE, JEMEZ MTS. (DMN); OTHER NESTINGS WERE REPORTED FROM FT. BAYARD (RAF) AND CLAYTON (AK).

NEW MEXICAN DUCK

A NEST AT HAYDEN LAKE, RIO ARRIBA CO., AT FIRST PRESUMED TO BE THAT OF MALLARDS, PROVED TO BE THIS SPECIES WHEN THE DOWN FEATHERS WERE ANALYZED (LYNDON HARGRAVE, WWH).

GADWALL

3 SEEN ON A RAIN POND WEST OF MALAGA, EDDY CO., ON 6/14 IS ONE OF THE FEW SUMMER RECORDS FOR EDDY CO. (LP, SW); OVER 100 WERE SEEN AT LA JOYA 10/23 (WCT); MORE THAN 200 WERE AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

GREEN-WINGED TEAL

350 WERE ON MORGAN LAKE, SAN JUAN CO., 10/18 (APN); 1 WAS AT SAN ILDEFONSO PUEBLO 11/1 (PRS).

BLUE-WINGED TEAL

120 WERE AT THE SALT PONDS 20 MILES EAST OF CARLSBAD 8/28 (SW).

CINNAMON TEAL

2 WERE AT THE CARLSBAD SALT PONDS 8/28 (SW); 7 WERE IN SANTA FE 8/17 (PRS)

AMERICAN WIDGEON

1 WAS SEEN AT SAN ILDEFONSO PUEBLO 9/28 (PRS); 100 WERE COUNTED ON MORGAN LAKE 10/18 (APN); 60 WERE IN THE ESPANOLA VALLEY 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

SHOVELER

1 WAS AT SANTA FE ON 8/24 (PRS, SW), AND 27 WERE SEEN AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

WOOD DUCK

6 MALES AND 3 FEMALES WERE REPORTED AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE 11/22 BY THE REFUGE FOREMAN DOYLE DAY.

REDHEAD

5 WERE SEEN ON MORGAN LAKE 9/10, 10 ON 10/3, AND 300 ON 10/18 (APN); 1 MALE WAS AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

CANVASBACK

150 WERE ON MORGAN LAKE 10/18 (APN); 12 WERE AT LA JOYA REFUGE 10/22 (WCT); A PAIR WAS AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

LESSER SCAUP

A FEW WERE AT MCALLISTER LAKE 10/30 (DM); ABOUT 25 WERE NOTED AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

BUFFLEHEAD

NUMBERS WERE UP IN ALL REPORTS: 900 AT MORGAN LAKE 10/18 (APN); DOZENS ON MCALLISTER LAKE 10/30 (DM); 11 ON 11/1 AT SAN ILDEFONSO PUEBLO AND ESPANOLA

(MAC, PRS); 300 REPORTED IN THE LAS VEGAS AREA IN NOVEMBER (ES).

RUDDY DUCK

NO BREEDING PAIRS NOTED THIS YEAR IN THE CARLSBAD AREA (SW); 2 WERE AT LAKE ROBERTS 10/20, AND 15 WERE THERE 10/27 (WG); NUMEROUS ON MCALLISTER LAKE 10/30 (OM); ABOUT 50 AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

HOODED MERGANSER

3 FEMALES WERE AT A POND NEAR ROSWELL ON 11/10 (ANC).

COMMON MERGANSER

A FEMALE WITH 5-6 YOUNG WAS SEEN FREQUENTLY DURING EARLY SUMMER ON THE WEST FORK OF THE GILA RIVER (FROM VERY YOUNG TO 3/4 GROWN); TWO PAIR HAD BEEN SEEN HERE FREQUENTLY THE PREVIOUS WINTER AND SPRING (WG).

TURKEY VULTURE

LAST NOTED IN SANTA FE ON 9/29 (PRS); 3 FLOCKS WITH ABOUT 50 BIRDS IN EACH WERE SEEN BETWEEN BELEN AND BERNARDO 9/29 (MCK, JLS); 6 WERE SEEN FLYING NEAR BELEN 10/9 (CLL); 2 NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM LINCOLN COUNTY (JMC).

MISSISSIPPI KITE

PRESENT IN ROSWELL IN SMALL NUMBERS THROUGHOUT THE SEASON; ONLY ONE NEST FOUND, TEN FEET FROM THE TOP OF A FIFTY—FOOT LOCUST TREE, NEAR WATER IN AN ISOLATED GROVE ABOUT EIGHT MILES FROM ROSWELL; ON 8/13 THE NEST HAD ONE LARGE YOUNG STANDING ON THE NESTS, WHISTLING FOR MORE GRASSHOPPERS; ALL BIRDS WERE GONE BY 9/15 (VM); 2 YOUNG WERE IN A NEST 6/22 IN CORRALES, SANDOVAL CO. (TS).

GOSHAWK

1 SEEN JUST BELOW LOS ALAMOS RESERVOIR 6/30 (WCT); SEEN IN THE CUMBRES PASS AREA 8/14 (PRS); SEVERAL NOTED FROM SANDIA CREST 9/17 (TS); 1 NORTH OF CHAMA 9/22 (ENW).

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK

1 WAS SEEN OVER SANTA FE SKI BASIN 8/24 (PRS, SW); 1 WAS IN CHAMA 9/21 ([NW); 1 IN SANTA FE 10/4 (PRS); 1 AT GILA CLIFF DWELLINGS 10/23—24 WAS UNUSUAL (WG); ARRIVED IN ROSWELL AREA 11/10 (VM).

COOPER'S HAWK

FIRST RETURN TO ROSWELL NOTED 10/7 (VM); 1 WAS SHOT AT GILA CLIFF DWELLINGS 11/2 (WG); A FEMALE WAS SHOT EIGHT MILES NORTH OF FARMINGTON 11/18 (APN); 1 WAS SEEN CAPTURING A SCALED QUAIL IN DESERT AREA NEAR RODEO, HIDALGO CO 11/22 (SAR); NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM GRANT CO. (RAF) AND BERNALILLO CO.(DD).

RED-TAILED HAWK

ABUNDANT ALL FALL IN THE MAGDALENA AREA (JAB); MORE THAN A DOZEN COUNTED BETWEEN LOS ALAMOS AND LA JOYA 10/22 (WCT); FIRST SEEN NEAR ROSWELL 10/27 WHERE MORE THAN THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF IMMATURES WAS NOTED (VM); NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM GRANT AND CATRON COUNTIES (RAF, WG), SOCORRO CO. (EBH), AND TORRANCE CO. (JMC).

SWAINSON'S HAWK

A NEST NEAR LOVING WAS DESTROYED BY HEAVY RAIN 6/10-11; THIS WAS POSSIBLY THE FIRST EDDY CO. NEST RECORD IN WHICH THE ACTUAL NEST WITH EGGS OR YOUNG WAS FOUND (SW); NUMBERS LESS THAN USUAL IN THE ROSWELL AREA IN THE FALL (VM); NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM GRANT CO. (APN), LINCOLN AND ROOSEVELT COUNTIES (PRS), SOCORRO AND TORRANCE COUNTIES (JMC).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK

REPORTED TO HAVE APPEARED ONCE AT LOS ALAMOS, WHERE IT HAS NESTED IN RECENT YEARS, THEN DISAPPEARED, POSSIBLY FOR A MORE REMOTE CANYON (FIDE JRT).

ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK

REPORTED NUMEROUS THIS FALL NEAR FARMINGTON (APN); FIRST SEEN NEAR ROSWELL 11/10 (VM).

FERRUGINOUS HAWK

NOTED SOUTH OF LOS ALAMOS 10/16 (PRS); FIRST SEEN AT ROSWELL 10/27 (VM); 1 WAS NEAR PENA BLANCA 11/6 (BJH, PRS); NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM SOCORRO AND DEBACA COUNTIES (JMC).

HARRIS' HAWK

SEEN MORE FREQUENTLY THAN USUAL NEAR ROSWELL THIS SUMMER, WHERE SEVERAL TIMES 2 OR 3 WERE SEEN TOGETHER (VM); 2 NESTS WERE FOUND NEAR LOVING (SW).

BLACK HAWK

SUCCESSFUL NESTING REPORTED AGAIN FROM GRANT CO.; 1 SEEN SOARING AT REDROCK, GRANT CO., 10/8 (RAF).

GOLDEN EAGLE

2 WERE SEEN IN THE LADRON MTS. 11/14, BUT THE SPECIES IS REPORTED STILL RARE: IN THE MAGDALENA AREA (JAB); 1 SUCCESSFUL NEST WAS REPORTED FROM RIO ARRIBA CO. (ENW).

BALD EAGLE

NONE WERE SEEN OR REPORTED ALL FALL NEAR FARMINGTON (APN).

MARSH HAWK

A NEST WAS REPORTED FROM BITTER LAKE REFUGE WHERE THE SPECIES NESTS REGULARLY BUT SPARINGLY (VM); 1 SEEN 8/18 ON THE SAN AUGUSTINE PLAINS WAS EARLY (JAB); 1 WAS AT MORGAN LAKE 9/3 FOR THE FIRST FALL RECORD HERE, AND 4 WERE SEEN 10/18 (APN); 1 WAS SOUTH OF THE PENITENTIARY 10/30 (PRS), AND 1 WAS AT ESPANOLA 11/1 (MAC, PRS).

OSPREY

FIRST SEEN NEAR ROSWELL 10/15 (VM); NOTED AT LAKE ROBERTS 10/25-27 (WG).

PRAIRIE FALCON

REPORTED FROM SAN AUGUSTINE PLAINS 7/18 (PRS), SANDIA CREST 9/17 (TS), CHAMA 10/11 (ENW), MORGAN LAKE 10/18 (APN), SOUTH OF SANTA FE 10/22 (PRS).

PEREGRINE FALCON

1 WAS SEEN IN THE SANDIA CREST AREA IN SEPTEMBER (TS, ET AL.).

PIGEON HAWK

1 WAS SEEN OVER SANDIA CREST 9/17 (TS); 1 WAS SEEN IN GILA CLIFF DWELLINGS 10/24 (WG).

SPARROW HAWK

SEEN CONSTANTLY NEAR ROSWELL ALL FALL (VM); ABUNDANT IN THE MAGDALENA AREA ALL FALL (JAB); PEAKS AT SANTA FE WERE 4 ON 8/17 AND 10 ON 9/1, WHICH IS EARLY (PRS); NESTS WERE REPORTED FROM BERNALILLO CO. (WWH) AND SANTA FE CO. (PRS).

BLUE GROUSE

A FEMALE WITH 3 ALMOST GROWN YOUNG WAS SEEN AT CHAMA 7/31; 6 WERE COUNTED AT

9000' IN THAT AREA 9/22 (ENW).

SCALED QUAIL

REPORTED NUMEROUS IN THE FALL IN FARMINGTON AREA (APN) AND IN SOCORRO CO. (JAB); NUMBERS SEEM TO HAVE RETURNED TO NORMAL IN THE SOUTHEAST (SW), AND ARE INCREASING IN THE CLAYTON AREA (AK); 1 NEST WAS RECORDED IN SOCORRO CO. (JLS).

GAMBEL'S QUAIL

GOOD NUMBERS REPORTED FROM GRANT CO., WITH SEVERAL NESTS RECORDED (RAF, WG); NESTED ON THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE REFUGE (EVK); ABUNDANT IN ITS HABITAT NEAR MAGDALENA ALL FALL (JAB).

HARLEQUIN QUAIL
