CORRIGENDA to Field Notes Vol. XII, No. 2, 1973-2:

GRAY HAWK: Record was second, not third for 1973 (pp. 26, 30)

PINYON JAY: 1000 seen on 10/21 were at Santa Fe, not Ft. Sumner (WS), p. 39

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW: 1 reported at Rodeo 9/28 was actually a White-crown (RS), p. 47

Before recounting some of the highlights of the present reporting period (December 1973 through May 1974), it seems worthwhile to reinterate a point that continues to be emphasized in this issue: the need to detail all records of rare or unusual species reported. The reasons for this emphasis on details are several, but mainly they revolve around the need to provide present and future users of our records with some means of evaluating them. For example, someone compiling data 20 years from now will be hard-pressed to know how good our records are if all we do is list them without comment. Even saying things like "all fieldmarks noted" or "observer familiar with species from eastern U. S." may not prove very helpful, and all of us should be willing to take a few extra moments in doing our reports to provide good details. Furthermore, we urge that the information be provided in initial reports to save the editorial staff the time and effort of having to query reports. The cooperation of everyone is essential in keeping our Field Notes a worthwhile enterprise.

Winter birding essentially began with the Christmas Counts, of which 15 were held in the state. Surprisingly, the highest species count was recorded on the Gila River (Cliff area) count, where the total of 93 edged out Roswell (92 species)—the traditional leader. Bosque del Apache NWR was next with 90, followed by two counts in the seventies (Lakes Avalon-McMillan, Farmington), five in the sixties (Las Vegas, Loving, Espanola, Albuquerque, Santa Fe), one in the fifties (Carlsbad Caverns NP), three in the forties (Silver City, Rodeo, Sandia Mts.), and one in the thirties (Clayton). Highlights of these counts are given in the Christmas Count issue of American Birds, but some are mentioned below.

Winter incursions were evident in several species, including Red-breasted Nuthatches (mountains), Robins, bluebirds, Cedar Waxwings, Evening Grosbeaks, Cassin's Finches, and juncos. Starlings were also much in evidence, including over 750,000 on the Roswell Christmas Count, where over 375,000 each of Brewer's and Red-winged Blackbirds were also counted. Among the more unusual winter reports (some not detailed) were Brown-capped Rosy Finch in the Jemez Mts., Ash-throated Flycatcher and Verdin at Albuquerque, Olivaceous Cormorant and Oldsquaw at Bosque del Apache NWR, and White-tailed Hawk and Rivoli's Hummingbird at Las Cruces. A Ferruginous Owl report from south of Las Cruces was too sparsely detailed to be accepted definitely as this species by the Records Committee. Two exetics, an unidentified parrot and possibly the Saffron Finch were also reported, both from Albuquerque.

Spring brought with it the usual spate of unusual reports, interspersed with early breeding records. Among the latter were Double-crested Cormorants, Snowy Egrets, and Black-crowned Hight Herons at Klephant Butte Lake, the state's most important breeding area for these species. Unfortunately, although Olivaceous Cormorants continue to be seen at the lake, no evidence of breeding was found there.

Among the umusual records (again not all detailed) were White Ibis and Dunlin at Bosque del Apache NWR; White-tailed Kite near Deming; Whimbrel, Yellow-throated Warbler, and Scarlet Tanager at Roswell; Northern Phalarope at La Cueva and Cuba; Inca Dove and Rufous Hummingbird at Albuquerque, White-winged Dove at San Ildefonso; Calliope Hummingbird at Silver City; Rivoli Hummingbird at Pleasanton; Black-and-white Warbler at Farmington; Tennessee Warbler, Hooded Warbler, and Baltimore Oriole at Cedar Crest; Blue-winged Warbler at Ute Lake; Cape May Warbler at Cliff; Kentucky Warbler at Las Vegas; Hooded Warbler at Pinos Altos; and Golden-crowned Sparrow at La Joya State Game Refuge. All in all, this was a most interesting reporting period.

Spring reports include Farmington area 5/11 (AN+), La Cueva SGR on 5/26 (WH), and 1 near Cliff on 5/4 (DZ+).

PIED-BILLED GREBE

Winter reports include 1-5 near Farmington 12/15 (AN+), near Las Vegas 12/30-2/17 (WH+), and near Cliff 12/15-1/19 (RF+); also 39 at Bitter Lake NWR on 12/8 (DB+). 4 at Roberts Lake 5/30 (DZ) and 1 at White Sands NM 5/6 (CM).

WHITE PELICAN 40 at Bitter Lake NWR 3/20 and up to 4 there 3/26-5/6 (DB+); unusual were 6 at Evans Lake south of Cliff on 3/20 (D. G. Hunt, $\underline{\text{fide}}$ DZ).

Winter reports include 13 at Bitter Lake NWR 12/1 and through 4/5 (DB+) and singles near Las Vegas on 12/30 (JG, ES) and Carlsbad 12/21 (JC+). 100 pairs nesting at Elephant Butte Lake 4/27 (CE); also 1-2 seen at Tucumcari 5/11 (CH. ESw) and Bosque del Apache NWR 3/2-4/2 (GZ).

OLIVACEOUS CORMORANT
2 immatures photographed (NMOS files) at Bosque del Apache NWR on 12/18 (GZ) and 2 seen at Elephant Butte Lake 4/27 (CH).

Winter reports include 4 near Fermington 12/15 (AN+), 9 at Espanola 12/29 (WBL+), 1 at Las Vegas 12/30 (JG, ES), 3 at Albuquerque 12/29 (AE+), 16 at Bitter Lake NWR 12/5 (DB), and 30-40 at Bosque del Apache NWR (GZ). Present at Cliff and Gila Cliff Dwelling heronries in latter half of March and 3 nests found near Redrock on 4/7 (RF); also 10 birds at Navajo Lake 4/21 (CS) and 1 near Alma 4/14 (McK).

Reports include 1-3 at Espanola 12/29 (WEL+) and 4/25 (WS), Tucumcari on 5/11 (CH), Ritter Lake NWR 5/11 (DB+), Fleasanton 12/1 and 4/14 (LS), Cliff-Gila area on 12/15, 2/16-17, and 5/4 (RF+), 1 during winter at Gila Hot Springs (RF), and at Loving on 12/28 (JCh, LSm).

LITTLE BLUE HERON

Reported without details was an adult at Bosque del Apache NWR on 4/29 and 5/3 (GZ).

CATTLE EGRET

1 reported at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/1-4 (GZ).

Winter reports were 1-2 at Bitter Lake NWR on 2/1, near Carlsbad 12/21 (JC+), and Loving 12/28 (JCh, LSm). Two nests at Elephant Butte Lake on 4/27 and 5 on 5/18 (CH); single birds seen at Bosque del Apache NWR on 3/22-31 (GZ) and near Cliff 5/4 (VM+).

To pairs nesting at Elephant Butte Lake on 4/27 and 5/18 (CH); migrants — typically singles — at Morgan Lake 5/26 (AN), near Las Vegas 4/28 and 5/25 (WH), near Gila 5/4 and near Lordsburg 4/25 (DZ+), near Rodeo 5/22 (RS), and at White Sands NM 4/2 (GM).

<u>HLACK-CROWNED</u> NIGHT HERON 200+ pairs nesting at Elephant Butte Lake on 4/27 and 5/18 (CH); winter birds and migrants include 3 at Espanola 4/22 (SN), 10 at Tucumcari 5/11 (CH), 1 near Cliff 5/4 (RF+), and 4 south of Las Cruces 2/23 (fide GW).

Reports include 1 near Farmington 12/15-23 and 5/11 (AN+) and 1 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/21-1/4 (GZ).

WHITE-FACED IBIS

Records include reports of 1-9 birds at Morgan Lake 5/27 (AN), La Cueva SGR on 4/21 (WH), Tucumcari 5/11 (CH), Isleta 5/25 (RT), Bosque del Apache NWR 5/27 (JD), and Rodeo 5/3-4 (RS).

An adult at Bosque del Apache NWR on 3/9-31, details including white plumage, except for black wingtips, and reddish bill and legs (GZ+); photographs were reportedly taken of this bird, which represents the second record of the species in the state.

WHISTLING SWAN 1 near Cliff 12/15 (SO+) and 32 at Bitter Lake NWR 12/28-1/4, with the last being there on 1/8 (DB+).

Winter reports include peaks of 3650 near Las Vegas 12/30 (JG, ES) and around 1200 at Bosque del Apache NWR on 1/6 (GZ) and Bitter Lake NWR on 1/16 (DB). Nesting at Bosque del Apache NWR by 3/28, with broods in April and May (GZ); 67 at Farmington 5/11 (AN+).

WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE

Up to 4 near Las Vegas on 1/20 (WH), Bosque del Apache NWR 12/20 (GZ), and at Roswell on 12/15 (JC+), with a late bird there to 5/11 (TB).

Winter peaks included 16,000-of which 65% were immatures and 400 were the blue morph—at Bosque del Apache NWR in December (GZ), 4400 near Carlsbad on 12/21 (JC+), and 3200 at Bitter Lake NWR on 12/7 (DB); also up to 4 at Morgan Lake 12/4 and 2/9 (CS), and in April (AN), 1 of blue morph near Cliff on 12/15 (SO+), last near Las Vegas was 1 on 4/28 (WH), 2 at Bosque del Apache NWR on 4/22 (CZ), and 5 at Bitter Lake NWR on 5/16 (DB).

150-200 at Bosque del Apache NWR in December -- with 49 taken by hunters -- and 1 lingering until 3/21 (GZ).

MALLARD

Winter peaks included 31,800 at Bitter Lake NWR on 1/16—but down to 155 on 3/15 (DB), 20,000 at Bosque del Apache NWR 1/18 (GZ), and 16,877 in the Farmington area 12/15 (AN+). Brood on Fenton Lake by May (MS); spring migrants include 18 near Los Alamos on 2/24 and 3/2 (WCH), 100 near Columbus 4/13 (McK), and 4 at White Sands NM 5/6 (CM).

MEXICAN DUCK

10 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/1, with 22 plus 2 broods in April and May (GZ), 1-2 reported at Bitter Lake NWR in winter (DB), 2 near Animas 5/30, and a female paired with a Mallard male near Rodeo on 5/20 and 5/31 (RS).

93 near Las Vegas on 12/30 (JG, ES) and 4 near Portales 3/12 (JH).

Winter peaks included 4000 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/11 and 2/11 (GZ), 3800 near Carlsbad 12/30 (JC+), and 950 near Las Vegas 12/30 (JG, ES); also up to 30 at White Sands NM 2/2-3/4 (GM) and 6 near Rodeo 1/6 (RS).

Late migrants were singles at Bosque del Apache NWR on 5/27 (JD) and in the Mimbres Valley 5/30 (DZ); also 20 near Portales 3/12 (JH).

BLUE-WINGED TEAL

Winter records include 4 near Farmington on 12/15 (AN+) and 10 at Loving on 12/28 (JCh, LSm). First of spring at Bosque del Apache NWR was 1 on 3/20, with a brood seen on 5/31 (GZ); 2 at Tucumcari 5/11-12 (CH).

CINNAMON TEAL

Winter reports include 1 at Bosque del Apache NWR on 1/3 and 500 on 2/21 (GZ). 16 near Cliff 2/16 (BH), and 2 near Rodeo 1/13 (RS); also 7 at Roberts Lake 3/30 (RF).

AMERICAN WIGEON Winter peaks include 2750 near Carlsbad on 12/21 (JC+) and 855 near Las Vegas on 12/30 (JG, ES); also up to 5 at Farmington 12/15 (AN+), Silver City 12/22(SO+), and Rodeo 1/1 (RS+).

NORTHERN SHOVELER 2000 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/20 and 2/21 (GZ) and to 75 at White Sands NM 1/18-3/29 (GM).

WOOD DUCK 2 near Cliff on 2/16 (BH) and 1 south of Les Cruces 12/15 (fide CW).

REDHEAD
Winter reports include 350 near Las Vegas on 12/30 (JG, ES), 30 at Bosque del
Apache NWR 2/21 (GZ), and 8 near Cliff on 12/15 (SO+); spring reports include
1 at Farmington 5/11 (AN+), Las Vegas on 5/26 (WH), 5 at Tucumcari 5/11 (CH), 15 near Portales 3/12 (JH), 8+ at Bosque del Apache NWR 5/31 (GZ), 2 at Roberts Lake 3/30 (RF), and 2 in the Mimbres Valley 5/30 (DZ).

RING-NECKED DUCK

18 at Roberts Lake 3/30 (RF), 1 near Rodeo 1/19 and 5 on 2/3-4 (RS), and 4 at White Sands NM on 5/11 (GM).

CANVASBACK

Winter reports include 434 at Bitter Lake NWR on 12/15 (JC+), 352 near Carlsbad on 12/21 (JC+), 40 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/1 (GZ), many near Les Vegas on 1/20 (WS), 5 near Cliff 12/15 (SO+), and 4 near Farmington 12/15 (AN+); also 2 at Roberts Lake 3/30 (RF) and 1 at Bosque del Apache NWR on 5/31 (GZ).

<u>LESSER SCAUP</u> 12 at Roberts Lake 3/30 (RF) and several at La Cueva SCR 5/26 (WH).

COMMON GOLDENEYE
20 at Clayton on 12/15 (WC, AK).

BUFFLEHEAD
Winter reports include 2 each on 12/15 at Farmington (AN+) and Clayton (WC, AK); also 2 at La Cueva on 3/20 (MS) and 3 at White Sands NM on 5/1 (GM).

LESSER PRAIRIE CHICKEN

1 at Bitter Lake NWR on 1/26-30, a vagrant in an area 40 miles west of the nearest population of the species (DB, BS).

Winter reports confined to southern area, including Bosque del Apache NWR (CH+), Cliff (SO+), Rodeo (RS+), and Carlsbad (JC+); 2 near Redrock on 5/4 (BH+).

Winter reports-but lacking any details-included 18 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/22 (CH+), 2-3 near Rodeo 1/24 and 2/20 (RS), and 1 near Carlsbad 12/21 (JC+). Nesting at Kirtland 5/29 (CS), while early spring dates included Ia Cueva SGR 4/21 (WH) and San Ildefonso 4/30 (WS).

RUFOUS-CROWNED SPARROW

Winter reports included an undetailed 30 near Albuquerque 12/29 (AE+), 7 near Cliff 12/15 (SO+), 3 at Silver City 12/22 (SO+), 1 near Rodeo 1/1 (RS+), and 46 near Carlsbad 12/28 (KE+).

CASSIN'S SPARROW

Hundreds singing near Caprock on 5/4 (JS) and 17 present at Bitter Lake NWR 5/11 (DB+).

BLACK-THROATED SPARROW

Winter reports confined to Bosque del Apache NWR (CH+), Cliff (SO+), Rodeo (RS+), and Carlsbad (JC+).

SAGE SPARROW

Winter reports included 17 at Albuquerque 12/29 (AE+), 113 at Bosque del Apache NMR 12/22 (CH+), 1 at Rodeo 1/1 (RS+), and 4 at Loving 12/28 (JCh, LSm).

1-2 White-winged Juncos were reported at Farmington 12/15 (fide AN), La Cueva 1-2 White-Winged Juncos were reported at rarmington 12/17 (110 mm), he does 1/9-10 (MS), and Santa Fe 12/16 (RW+). 1-6 Slate-colored Juncos reported in winter at Farmington (AN+), Clayton (AK+), Albuquerque area (AE+, McK, DDL), and Roswell (JC+), plus 11 at Santa Fe 12/16 (RW+) and 21 at Espanola 12/29 (WEL+). Oregon Junco winter peaks included 1420 at Espanola 12/29 (WEL+), 700 in the Sandias 12/15 (RT+) and 489 at Albuquerque 12/29 (AE+)—with last of spring on 5/30 (CH), 454 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/22 (CH+), 327 at Rodeo 1/1 (RS+), 91 at Carlsbad Caverns NP 12/30 (KE+), and 27 at Clayton 12/15 (WC, AK).

GRAY-HEADED JUNCO

winter peaks included 500-700 at Espanola 12/29 (WBL+), Santa Fe 12/16 (RW+), and in the Sandias 12/15 (RT+), 353 at Albuquerque 12/29 (AE+), 252 at Las Vegas 12/30 (JG, ES), 102 Farmington area 12/15 (AN+)-with last of spring on 5/28 (GS), 103 Bosque del Apache NWR 12/22 (CH+), and less than a dozen at Clause 12/15 (MR), AN December 12/16 (MR), AN December 13/16 (MR), AND Decem Clayton 12/15 (WC, AK), Roswell 12/15 (JC+), Rodeo 1/1 (RS+), and near Carlsbad 12/30 (KE+). In spring 2 were banded at Columbus on 4/28 (McK), 1 seen near Redrock 5/4 (BH+), and present at White Sands NM 4/3 and 4/26 (GM).

TREE SPARROW

Reports include 3 at Clayton 12/15 (WC, AK). 2 near Las Vegas 12/30 (JG, ES), 1 at Roswell 12/15 (JC+), and 1 at La Joya SGR 1/6 (RR).

CHIPPING SPARROW

Winter reports include 11 at Santa Fe 12/16 (RW+), 1-2 at Bosque del Apache NWR 2/17 (RR), 7 near Cliff 12/15 (SO+), and 95 in the Carlsbad area 12/21-30 (JC+); spring reports include 4 at Bitter Lake NWR 3/22-26 (JC), Albuquerque 4/9 (PB), and many in Guadalupe Canyon 4/26-28 (CA) and Columbus 4/27-28 (McK).

BREWER'S SPARROW

Winter reports restricted to the south, i.e. Cliff (SO+), Rodeo (RS+), Roswell (JC+), and Carlsbad area (JC+). Many at Columbus 4/27-28 (McK).

8 reported near Loving on 12/28 (JCh, LSm).

BLACK-CHINNED SPARROW

Winter reports were of 2 at Rodeo 1/1 (RS+) and 8 in Carlsbad Caverns NP 12/30 (KE+); 1 near Carrizozo 5/26 (MR).

HARRIS' SPARROW

Singles at Alameda 1/13 (CH) and Albuquerque 12/11-3/6 (PB).

WHITE-CROWNED SPARROW

Winter peaks included 1067 at Bosque del Apache NWR 12/22 (CH+), 872 at Roswell 12/15 (JC+), 700+ at Espanola (WBL+) and Albuquerque (AE+) 12/29, 441 at Farmington 12/15 (AN+), and 200+ at Santa Fe 12/16 (RW+) and Cliff 12/15 (SO+). Late dates in spring included 1-2 at Cedar Crest 5/19 (McK), Apache Creek 5/25 (McK), and Albuquerque 5/26 (PB).

GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW

1 reported at La Joya SGR on 4/28; details include size larger than nearby White-crowns, grayish neck and black crown with yellow stripe through it (RR).

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW

2 winter at Bosque del Apache (GZ), 5 at Roswell 12/15 (JC+), and 1 at Plessanton 4/14 (LS).

2 at Roswell (JC+) and 1 near Cliff (SO+) on 12/15.

LINCOLN'S SPARROW Winter reports included 1 at Espanola--reported with details--on 12/29 (Jim Travis), 3 near Cliff 12/15 (SO+), and 1 at Loving 12/28 (JCh, LSm); later reports, perhaps representing early spring migrants, included 1-2 at Rodeo 2/20-22 (RS), Bosque del Apache NWR 3/10 (WS), and Cedar Crest 3/12 (McK).

SONG SPARROW Winter reports included figures of 93-156 at Espanola 12/29 (WBL+), Bosque del Apache NWR 12/22 (CH+), and Roswell 12/15 (JC+), 20-30+ at Farmington 12/15 (AN+) and in two Carlsbad area counts, 12/21 (JC+) and 12/30 (KE+), and 2-3 at Clayton (WC, AK) and in the Sandias (RT+) 12/15. Late dates in spring include 2 each at Bitter Lake NWR (DB+) and Farmington (AN+) on 5/11.

Reports limited to eastern third of state, including in December at Clayton (AK) and in the Carlsbad area (JC+).
