WALL LAKE -- CATRON Co. WILLOW LAKE--EDDY Co. WHITE LAKES -- SANTA FE CO. WINTER BIRDING IN NEW MEXICO WAS USHERED IN WITH THE CHRISTMAS COUNTS, OF WHICH THERE WERE 12 IN THE STATE, PLUS ONE SHARED BETWEEN NEW MEXICO AND TEXAS. SEVERAL COUNTS WERE IN THE AREA OF 80 SPECIES, WITH TOP HONORS GOING TO THE ROSWELL AREA (88 SPECIES), FOLLOWED BY LAKES AVALON-MCMILLAN (82), BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (80), AND LOVING (79). SOME OF THE MORE INTERESTING REPORTS WERE BLUE GROSBEAK (SPECIMEN) AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR, GOSHAWK AT CLAYTON, WOOD DUCK AT ESPAÑOLA, GOSHAWK AND HARRIS'S SPARROW AT FARMINGTON, LECONTE'S SPARROW ON TWO OF THE CARLSBAD AREA COUNTS, EASTERN BLUEBIRD AT ROSWELL, AND GRAY-CROWNED ROSY FINCH IN THE SANDIA MOUNTAINS. THERE WERE THE USUAL QUESTIONABLE REPORTS OF SPECIES, BUT FEWER THAN IN YEARS PAST. THE FUTURE PROMISES TO BE BETTER IN THIS REGARD WITH THE ADDITION OF REGIONAL EDITORS FOR ALL CHRISTMAS COUNTS STARTING THIS YEAR.

Three major counts were held in the spring of 1972, all continuing from past years. First was the Bitter Lake NWR count on 29 April, with 114 species (5735 individuals) and interesting records including sprague's Pipit and Black-chinned Sparrow. Second was the Gila Valley count on 6 May, with 124 species (2767 individuals——Low) and Coues' Flycatcher and Fox Sparrow among the interesting reports. Last was the Farmington count on 13 May, with 137 species (8283 individuals) and several interesting reports including Northern Phalarope and Palm Warbler. The spring also produced a number of other interesting records, including first state specimens of the White—eyed Vireo and Yellow—throated Vireo near Hermanas in Luna County. Notable sight records for the period included Purple Gallinule, Costa's Hummingbird, Black—and—White Warbler, Parula Warbler, Golden—winged Warbler, Blackpoll Warbler, and the now—usual spring Rose—sreasted Grosbeaks. Banded birds included Vereies and Kentucky Warbler near Clayton, and a Fox Sparrow at Cedar Crest.

THE HIGHLIGHT OF SPRING BREEDING REPORTING WAS THE DISCOVERY OF OLIVACEOUS CORMORANTS NESTING AMONG THE DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANTS ON ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE. THE AREA HAS BEEN WITHDRAWN FROM PUBLIC USE AND MADE INTO A BIRD SANCTUARY BY THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE CORMORANTS, HERONS, AND OTHER WATERBIRDS THAT BREED THERE. OTHER REPORTS INCLUDED THE FIRST BREEDING RECORDS FROM CATRON COUNTY OF THE YELLOW-HEADED BLACKBIRD WHICH, ALONG WITH BOAT-TAILED GRACKLES, ALSO BRED AGAIN AT TUCUMCARI LAKE. GREAT BLUE HERONS WERE REPORTED BREEDING ONLY IN THE G!LA VALLEY, ALTHOUGH BIRDS WERE SEEN IN OTHER AREAS WHERE THEY MIGHT BE SOUGHT AS BREEDERS.

Spring arrival and departure dates for migrant species were more widely submitted this year than last, although this aspect of bird study is still not satisfactorily covered in the Field Notes. Arrival times seemed to be somewhat earlier in some species than in past years, perhaps due to unseasonably warm weather in late winter and spring. Exhamples include Turkey Yulture, Common Nighthawk, Western Wood Pewee, and Western Tanager. Late lingering migrants were less conspicuous this year than in the past, perhaps for the same reasons as advanced above.
