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CORRIGENDA TO FIELD NOTES VOL. XI, No. 1:

PEAK COUNT AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR FOR WINTER 1971–72 was 10,641, not 18,641. SANDHILL CRANE

BENDIRE'S THRASHER 1 REPORTED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR ON 5/15 (GRZ) WAS ACTUALLY A BROWN THRASHER.

BREEDING RECORDS FOR THE SUMMER PERIOD CONSISTED OF 975 CARDS COVERING 126 SPECIES. SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE THE BLACK HAWK NESTING AGAIN NEAR ALBUQUERQUE, AND FIRST ACTUAL NEW MEXICO NESTS OF THE GRAY JAY (AT TRUCHAS PEAK), WILSON'S WARBLER (COSTILLA, TAOS CO.), AND VARIED BUNTING (CARLSBAD CAVERNS NATIONAL PARK). OTHER RECORDS OF INTEREST INCLUDED ROCKERIES OF GREAT BLUE HERONS AT WATROUS AND ON THE GILA RIVER, NESTING OF THE TREE SWALLOW AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE, AND BREEDING COLONIES OF YELLOW-HEADED BLACKBIRDS AT TUCUMCAR!, CENTER-FIRE BOG, AND APPARENTLY AT ZUNI AND THE PATTERSON RANCH. GRACKLES CONTINUED TO SPREAD AND TO CONSOLIDATE THEIR RANGES IN THE STATE, WITH BOAT-TAILS NESTING AT KIRTLANO, TUCUMCARI, AND APPARENTLY VIRDEN (AND SEEN IN SUMMER NEAR REGINA); AND COMMON GRACKLES NESTING AT PHILMONT Scout Ranch, Again Near Los Lunas, and apparently at Ft. Sumner (AND SEEN IN SUMMER AT HAYDEN LAKE AND PARKVIEW NOW LOS 0J057). Numbers OF WESTERN GREBES WERE PRESENT IN SUMMER AT STONE LAKE AND LA CUEVA, BUT DEFINITE EVICENCE THAT THEY BREED IN THE STATE IS STILL LACKING. THE CORMORANT ROOKERY AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE WAS FOUND TO HAVE SUFFERED TOTAL MORTALITY AMONG THE YOUNG IN JUNE, PERHAPS OUE TO RAIN OR HAIL, AND NO OLIVACEOUS CORMORANTS WERE REPORTED IN THE AREA UNTIL OCTOBER. REO CROSSBILLS WERE PRESENT WIDELY IN THE MOUNTAINS DURING THE SUMMER. AND WHILE THE MANY JUVENILES SUGGESTED BREEDING, NO NEST HAS YET BEEN FOUND IN THE STATE. CASSIN'S FINCHES SUMMERED NEAR JEMEZ Springs and srought young to feeders in late June; other cardueline FINCHES PRESENT IN THE NORTH IN THE BREEDING SEASON WERE AMERICAN GOLD-FINCHES, BROWN-CAPPEO ROSY FINCHES (TRUCHAS PEAK), AND PINE GROSBEAKS, BUT AS WITH THE CASSIN'S FINCH NO ACTUAL NESTS OF NON-FLYING YOUNG HAVE EVER BEEN REPORTED FROM THE STATE. EVENING GROSBEAKS WERE REPORTED ONLY VERY LOCALLY IN SUMMER (INCLUOING IN THE PINOS ALTOS MTS.), BUT LATER IN THE YEAR A MODERATE INFLUX OCCURRED AT MIDDLE ELEVATIONS AND DOWN TO LOWER ELEVATIONS IN THE NORTH, E.G., FARMINGTON, ALBUQUERQUE, AND CLAY-TON. NINE FLAMMULATED OWLS WERE NETTED AT WATER IN THE PINOS ALTOS MTS. IN VERY DRY WEATHER IN JULY, BUT AFTER RAINS LATER IN THE MONTH NONE COULD BE CAUGHT. SAW-WHETS WERE FOUND THERE IN SUMMER AND IN THE MAN-ZANO MTS. PARTICULAR NOTE WAS MADE OF THE DISTRIBUTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS OF THE TWO MEADOWLARK SPECIES DURING SUMMER, WITH THE RESULT THAT SEV-ERAL DEPARTURES WERE FOUND IN THE STATUS AS OUTLINED IN THE CHECK-LIST. FOR EXAMPLE, WESTERNS WERE FOUND AS FAR SOUTH AS FENCE LAKE AND THE CARRIZOZO AREA IN DRY GRASSLAND (THE SPECIES OCCURS EVEN FARTHER SOUTH IN SUCH HABITATS AS ALFALFA FIELDS), WHERE THEY OCCURRED WITH EASTERNS. THE VARIED BUNTING WAS PRESENT IN SUMMER IN GUADALUPE CAÑON, WHERE SEEM-INGLY ABSENT IN SOME YEARS, AND A MALE WAS BANDED AND PHOTOGRAPHED FOR THE FIRST "HARD" EVIDENCE OF THE SPECIES! OCCURRENCE IN THE SOUTHWESTERN PART OF THE STATE.

AMONG THE INTERESTING SUMMER RECORDS WERE SEVERAL OF VAGRANTS OR OUT-OF-SEASON MIGRANTS. THESE INCLUDED COMMON LOON AT BITTER LAKE NWR, SNOW GOOSE AT FENTON LAKE, MISSISSIPPI KITE AT KIRTLAND, OSPREY NEAR CARLSBAD, BROWN THRASHER AT FENCE LAKE, ALBUQUERQUE, AND NEAR SILVER CITY (TWO AT FT. SUMNER WERE PROBABLY BREEDING), VEERY IN THE MANZANO MTS. (SONG AND CALL NOTES RECORDED ON TAPE), WATER PIPITS AT HAYDEN LAKE, CENTERFIRE BOG, AND IN THE GILA WILDERNESS, PARULA WARBLER NEAR LAS VEGAS, ROSE-BREASTED GROSBEAK AT PLEASANTON AND NEAR SILVER CITY, AND HARRIS' SPARROW IN ALBUQUERQUE. A SCOTT'S ORIOLE AT EL PUEBLO MAY INDICATE A NEW NORTHERN BREEDING AREA, WHILE A REPORT OF A BLACK HAWK NEAR HONDO IN THE SACRAMENTO MTS. SEEMS QUESTIONABLE (MEN OF THE CALIBER OF BENDIRE, AND JOURNALS OF THE CALIBER OF THE CONDOR HAVE ERRED IN THE IDENTIFICATION OF THIS HAWK).

The autumn brought the usual share of vagrants to the state, including well-fescribed Kittiwake at the Bosque del Apache NWR, (Groovebilled) Ani and Anna's Hummingbird (Photographed for the first state record) at Silver City, Carolina Wren at Rattlesnake Springs, Black-andWHITE WARBLER AT BITTER LAKE, PROTHONOTARY WARBLER AT ALBUQUERQUE, PARULA WARBLER AT DIXON, MAGNOLIA WARBLER FOUND DEAD AT FARMINGTON (IF PRESERVED, IT IS THE FIRST STATE SPECIMEN), AND DICKCISSEL MEAR CLIFF.

CATTLE EGRETS ARE MORE REGULARLY REPORTED IN THE STATE, BUT SEVERAL PHOTOGRAPHED NEAR BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR IN NOVEMBER ARE THE FIRST SUBSTANTIATED RECORDS ON FILE WITH THE N.M.O.S. INCA AND GROUND DOVES, LOCAL RESIDENTS OF THE SOUTH, WERE ALSO ON THE MOVE: INCA DOVES WERE FOUND AT FARMINGTON, CARLSBAD, AND BAYARD (THE NEARBY SILVER CITY COLONY IS STILL DOING WELL), AND GROUND DOVES WERE SEEN AT CLIFF, SAN SIMON CIENEGA, AND IN SIERRA COUNTY. RED-BREASTED NUTHATCHES AND GOLDEN—CROWNED KINGLETS WERE MORE COMMON THAN USUAL, INCLUDING IN THE LOWLANDS EAST INTO THE PLAINS, AND INDICATIONS ARE THAT BLUEBIRDS AND SOLITAIRES WERE MORE WIDESPREAD AND NUMEROUS. THE BIG EVENT OF THE AUTUMN WAS THE VIRTUALLY UNPRECEDENTED INVASION OF CORVIDS (STELLER'S, SCRUB, AND PIÑON JAYS, NUTCRACKERS) INTO THE STATE, INCLUDING INTO THE LOWLANDS OF THE SOUTH AND THE EAST (E.g., CLAYTON, PORTALES, LAS CRUCES).

MOST UNUSUAL WAS ONE REPORTED (WITHOUT DETAILS) AT BITTER LAKE NWR 7/20 (DLB); ALSO 1 THERE 9/18-23 (DLB) AND 2 NEAR CLAYTON 10/15 (WC, AJK); 1 IN WINTER PLUMAGE AT LAKE AVALON 11/18 (SW).

HORNED GREBE

1 REPORTED WITHOUT DETAILS AT BEAR CANON LAKE 10/9 (RAF).

EARED GREBE

Summer reports include 43 at Hayden Lake 6/29 (JW) and others there and at Stone Lake on 7/29 (JND, PF). Also 1 near Los Alamos 10/15 (PRS), 1 at Snow Lake 10/7-8 (BJH), 14 at Lake Roberts 10/2 and 2 on 10/9 (RAF), and at Bitter Lake NWR 10/26-11/10, with peak count there 38 on 11/10 (DLB).

WESTERN GREBE

SUMMER REPORTS INCLUDE 15-20 AT STONE LAKE 7/29 (JND, PF) AND 4 AT LA CUEVA SGR 6/11 (WH). ALSO NUMEROUR IN THE FARMINGTON AREA IN AUTUMN, WITH 24 THERE 11/4 (APN), 1 NEAR CLAYTON 1-/15 (AJK), SEVERAL AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 10/29 (JND) AND 1 THERE ON 11/8-11 (GRZ), 1 AT BITTER LAKE NWR 11/17 (DLB, JCC), 1 AT LAKE ROBERTS 10/9 AND 3 AT EVANS LAKE 11/19 (RAF).

PIED-BILLED GREBE

SUMMER RECORDS INCLUDE 2 AT KIRTLAND THROUGH JULY (GS), LA CUEVA ON 6/11 (WH), 1 AT NUTRIA LAKE 6/19, 4 AT DULCE LAKE 7/28, 7 AT CENTERFIRE BOG 6/1 AND 10 ON 7/18, 5 INCLUDING SMALL YOUNG AT PATTERSON RANCH ON 6/6-7

and 1 on 6/22, and 1 at Glenwood on 6/27 (JPH). Also near Clayton 9/23-11/9, with peak 4 on 10/13 (AJK), peak of 24 at Bitter Lake NWR on 11/17 (DLB), and 8 at Lake Roberts on 8/12 (RAF).

WHITE PELICAN

REPORTED IN AUTUMN IN THE RIO GRANDE AND PECOS VALLEYS, WITH SINGLES AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR ON 10/10 (GRZ), AND 11/25 (CAH ET AL.), 10 AT ELE-PHANT BUTTE LAKE ON 8/20 (BAE, CAH) AND AT LEAST 200 ON 10/25 (JD), AT BITTER LAKE NWR 10/2-11/10, WITH PEAK 200 ON 10/17 (DLB, LGK), AND 190 AT LAKE MCMILLAN ON 11/8 (SW).

DOUBLE-CRESTED CORMORANT

ON 6/16 THE ROOKERY AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE WAS DISCOVERED TO HAVE SUFFERED A COMPLETE LOSS OF YOUNG (ALL DEAD IN THE NESTS), POSSIBLY DUE TO HAIL OR RAIN STORMS THAT OCCURRED IN THE AREA; ABOUT 50 ADULTS WERE SEEN IN THE AREA, INCLUDING ONE INCUBATING FRESH EGGS (JPH). MANY ADULTS PRESENT THERE ALSO ON 8/19-20, WITH NO EVIDENCE OF NESTING (BAE, CAH). SINGLES IN THE FARMINGTON AREA 10/21-11/18 WERE THE FIRST LOCAL RECORDS—ALL OF IMMATURES (APN). AT BITTER LAKE NWR 10/2-11/10, WITH PEAK OF 200 ON 10/17 (DLB, LGK).

OLIVACEOUS CORMORANT

None seen at Elephant Butte Lake (where nesting in May) on 6/16 (JPH) or 8/19-20 (BAE, CAH); reported there on 10/23 (JD).

GREAT BLUE HERON

NESTED AT WATROUS (WH) AND IN THE GILA VALLEY (RAF) AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS; OTHER SUMMER RECORDS INCLUDE UP TO 5 IN THE SAN JUAN VALLEY 6/1-8/22 (GS) 1 AT SAN SIMON CIENEGA 7/16 (JW), 1 AT APACHE CREEK ON 6/6, 3 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE 6/16, AND 1-2 IN THE PLEASANTON AREA 6/2-7/6 (JPH). ALSO, 3 AT LAS VEGAS 8/20 (WH), 1 AT SNOW LAKE ON 10/7-8 (BJH), 30 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE 8/19-20 (BAE, CAH), 5 AT LAS CRUCES 11/2 (DLH), AND AT BITTER LAKE NWR 8/18-11/30, WITH PEAK OF 24 ON 11/30 (DLB).

GREEN HERON

2 NEAR KIRTLAND 6/12 (GS), 1 NEAR FARMINGTON ON 8/12 (APN), 2 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE ON 8/19 (BAE, CAH), AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 8/25 (DLB), AND 1 AT HARROUN LAKE 9/3 (SW).

LITTLE BLUE HERON

4 ADULTS NEAR ALBUQUERQUE ON 6/7, WITH DETAILS INCLUDING HALF THE SIZE OF GREAT BLUE HERON AND DARK GRAYISH BLUE IN COLOR WITH DARK REDDISH NECK (MEE); 2 ADULTS AND 6 IMMATURES, INCLUDING 2 WHITE MOTTLED WITH BLUE, AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 10/16 (GRZ).

CATTLE EGRET

9 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 11/13-16 (GRZ); AT BITTER LAKE NWR THERE WERE 9 ON 9/8 AND 17 ON 10/5 (DLB. LGK). ATTEMPTS TO PHOTOGRAPH THE BITTER LAKE BIRDS WERE UNSUCCESSFUL.

COMMON SEGRET

1 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE 8/19 (BAE, CAH) AND SINGLES AT BITTER LAKE NWR 7/20-21, 9/28, and 10/19 (Fide JCC).

SNOWY EGRET

Summer records include 2-5 near Kirtland 6/1-28 (GS), 3 at Tucumcari on 6/13 and 10 at Elephant Butte Lake on 6/16 (JPH). Last in autumn at Bosque del Apache NWR were 3 on 11/12 (GRZ); 1 at Lake McMillan 8/4 and 5 there on 9/21 (SW); present at Bitter Lake NWR 8/18-10/19, with peak of 48 on 9/29 (DLB).

BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON

NEST AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 6/16, WHERE LAST OF AUTUMN WAS ON 11/30 AND PEAK WAS 14 ON 8/18 (DLB, J&C); 1 AT KIRTLAND 7/25 (GS), 6 AT ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE ON 6/16 (JPH) WITH 96 THERE ON 8/19 (BAE, CAH); 8, MOSTLY IMMATURES, AT 6-MILE DAM 7/31 (SW).

YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT HERON

AN ADULT ASSOCIATING WITH AN IMMATURE, PRESUMED TO BE THIS SPECIES, SEEN AT BITTER LAKE NWR ON 8/6; THE IMMATURE REMAINED THERE FOR SEVERAL DAYS AND SHOWED WHITE ON THE CHEEKS SUGGESTING THAT OF THE ADULT (DLB ET AL.).

1 AT KIRTLAND 8/22-23 (GS); NESTING REPORTED FROM BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR (GRZ) AND ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE (CAH).

AMERICAN BITTERN

SUMMER RECORDS INCLUDE UP TO 3 NEAR KIRTLAND 6/1-7/26 (GS), 1 NEAR CARLSBAD ON 7/31 (SW), 3 IN THE KIRTLAND AREA 7/26-28 AND 1 AT TUCUMCARI LAKE ON 6/13 (JPH), AND PRESENT AT BITTER LAKE NWR (JCC); ALSO, 1 AT GALISTEO LAKE 9/23 (JDL et al.).

WHITE-FACED IBIS

AUTUMN RECORDS INCLUDE 2 AT GALISTED LAKE 9/23 (JDL ET AL.), 40 MEAR BITTER LAKE NWR ON 8/24 (LGK), AND 4 ABOUT 20 MILES EAST OF CARLSBAD ON 8/7 (KARL ELERS); LAST AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR WERE 3 ON 10/22 (BLH).

WHISTLING SWAN

1 AT BITTER LAKE ON 11/24 (LGK) WAS THE ONLY REPORT.

5 BROODS COUNTED AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR, WHERE PEAK COUNT OF AUTUMN WAS 1000 ON 11/18 (GRZ); 2 NEAR NAVAJO LAKE 6/2 (GS); FIRST MIGRANTS AT BITTER LAKE NWR WERE 40 on 10/6, WITH AUTUMN PEAK OF 700 on 11/30 (LGK).

WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE

AUTUMN REPORTS INCLUDE 2 NEAR LAS VEGAS ON 10/22 (WH), 5 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR on 11/12 (GRZ), AND 7 THERE ON 11/26 (PRS), AND 2 AT BITTER LAKE NWR 11/3-10 (DLB).

SNOW GOOSE

Most unusual were 2 at Fenton Lake 6/2 and 6/8 where 1 remained 6/9-9/3 (MBS). FIRST OF AUTUMN AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR WERE 2 ON 9/16, WITH AUTUMN PEAK 8000 ON 11/9 (GRZ); FIRST AT BITTER LAKE NWR 1 ON 10/6, WITH PEAK 4500 ON 11/30 (DLB). ALSO 15 NEAR FARMINGTON ON 11/1 (APN).

BLUE GOOSE
PRESENT AT BITTER LAKE NWR 10/19-11/30, WITH PEAK OF 25 ON 11/17 (DLB); ALSO 4-5 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 10/22 (DLH) AND 30 THERE ON 11/25 (CAH ET AL.).

ROSS' GOOSE 30 AT BOSQUE DEL APACHE NWR 11/9 (GRZ).

BLUE JAY
