## FROM THE EDITORS:

Noteworthy winter records for the reporting period include sightings of several species rarely seen in the state. These included a Red-necked Grebe near Loving, a Brown Pelican near Cliff, a Harlequin Duck at Bitter Lake National Wildlife Refuge, Red-breasted Mergansers reported from three different localities, two Harris Hawks near Hatch, a Caracara near Columbus, Sprague Pipits near Rodeo and at Percha Dam State Park, a Hutton Vireo at Rodeo, and a Solitary Vireo near Cliff. Unusual wintering records included two Rivoli Hummingbirds near Albuquerque, and an immature male Anna Hummingbird at Las Cruces. In addition, several Cassin Sparrows were reported near Rodeo during January and February.

Spring records included the discovery of a male Coppery-tailed Trogon in the Animas Mountains, a White-winged Crossbill at Sandia Crest near Albuquerque, and the state's first Roseate Tern was photographed near Roswell. Additional noteworthy spring records included a Louisiana Heron at Roswell, a Wood Thrush at Las Vegas, a Le Conte Sparrow in southern Dona Ana County, and a Golden-crowned Sparrow near Silver City.
