Before summarizing the highlights of this reporting period (December 1976 through May 1977) we must again reiterate the need for contributors to follow some basic guide-lines. We would appreciate it if all reports were put together as follows: (1) Type or print if at all possible. Many times valuable data is lost because the editorial staff can not read the report. (2) List all birds in taxonomic order. (3) Always furnish details on unusual species and at the time of the initial report. (4) The name of the contributor and the location (s) being reported should be on each page. In many instances locations are given as "John Smith's house". Please avoid this, take time to report the actual location. Also, when reporting from a new location not readily found on a standard road map such as a ranch stock-tank which you assign a name, please give a few details on its location including the county. (5) For filing purposes, reports should be on at least a minimum sized sheet of paper (8% x 11) even if just one bird species is being reported. If people will adhear to this basic format records can be compiled more accurately and quickly.

This reporting period was one of the most interesting in recent years. Noteworthy were first state verification of the Trumpeter Swan and the Costa Hummingbird; with a new addition to the hypothetical list of a Nutting Flycatcher near Evans Lake. Also, there were major winter invasions of Bald Eagles, Bohemian Waxwings, and Northern Shrikes. Other unusual sightings during the winter period included Olivaceous Cormorants at Las Cruces, Barrow's Goldeneye near Bloomfield, Surf Scoters at Evans Lake, 2 Ospreys in the Rio Grande Valley, and a Solitary Vireo at Las Cruces. In addition, 6 Whooping Cranes successfully wintered in the central Rio Grande Valley; leaving in late February and early March.

Spring was just as interesting with such noteworthy records as a Louisiana Heron near Las Cruces, an immature Broadwinged Hawk near Portales, an Aplomado Falcon reported just across the state line in Arizona near Rodeo, Red Knots near Roswell, Sanderlings near Alamogordo, and an adult California Gull at Charette Lake.

Perhaps one of the most interesting features of the period was the great influx of eastern warblers in the state which brought the total number of warbler species recorded during the period to 27. Some of the most unusual species included Prothonotary, Worm-eating, Parula, Cape May, Chestnutsided, Bay-breasted, Blackpoll, Palm, and Hooded.

Other noteworthy records during the period included a Bobolink at Stone Lake, Bronzed Cowbirds at Glenwood and Socorro, Grasshopper Sparrows near Loving, single Golden-crowned Sparrows at Tesuque and Farmington, and at least 3 reports of Harris Sparrows.

GOSHAWK win/rec--3 adults near Canyon Largo 12/21 (DC), a single 40 mi N of Holloman AFB in late December or early January (PP), and an adult in the Mangas Mts. 4/16 (KG).

BROAD-WINGED HAWK uns/rec--an im. near Portales 5/12 (JH+).

SWAINSON HAWK win/rec--a light phase adult was reported at Tesuque 2/6 (P.Shultz); a drawing made at the time tends to support the identification.

ZONE-TAILED HAWK con/rec--1 at Bandelier NM 4/16 (LH).

BLACK HAWK sp/rec--a pair in the Mimbres Valley March-May (RF).

BALD EAGLE win/rec--at least 28 reports in the period 12/4 to 4/17 with the following county breakdown: Socorro 10, San Miguel 6, San Juan 4, Sierra 2, Torrance 2, Colfax 1, Chaves 1, Grant 1, and Hidalgo 1. Late date of 4/17 in Torrance (OV) and the peripheral area of Clanton Canyon in Hidalgo County (D.Hunt).

OSPREY win/rec--single birds fitting the description of this species were seen N of Truth or Consequences 12/28 (RT) and on the Rio Grande near Rincon 1/14 (RW).

<u>APLOMADO FALCON</u> <u>uns/rec--1</u> was reported to have been seen and well described just across the state line in Arizona near Rodeo 3/8 (RS).

MERLIN win/rec--at least 9 reported statewide; most were seen between 12/18 and 1/13.

LESSER PRAIRIE CHICKEN uns/rec--1 at Bitter Lake NWR 5/23 (JC.DB).

CHUKAR con/rec--present in the Farmington area 5/14 (AN+).

TURKEY uns/rec--1 in Alamogordo 4/15 was low and miles from the nearest habitat (possibly an escaped unpinioned bird) (Alamogordo Daily News). Also, reports for Guadalupe Canyon (birds heard) relate to domestic birds. The single bird reported there last year for this period was a flying bird; subsequent checking with local residents confirmed that it was not one of their birds (WB).

WHOOPING CRANE CON/rec--6 wintered successfully in the central Rio Grande Valley leaving in late February and early March with several seen passing over Los Alamos; 5 of these birds were seen in the San Luis Valley of Colorado by 3/18 (fide JT), the other bird (a Bosque del Apache NWR bird) went S and showed up in the Uvas Valley in late March (WW,D.Shifletts).

NORTHERN SHRIKE uns/rec--prior to this winter some 52 records of this species had accumulated since 1846; however, this winter brought at least 20 more. Some of these include 1 N of Estancia 2/27 (RT), 1 N of Luna 1/10-11 (TJ), and 1 near Loving 12/28 (SW).

WORM-EATING WARBLER uns/rec--1 at Boone's Draw 5/8 (JE). Details include "head streaked-striped, including through eyes, buffy underneath, pinkish legs, foraged on the ground, along trunks, limbs, and branches as close as 20 ft. Two to three high chirps were given occasionally when flying from tree to tree."

VIRGINIA'S WARBLER con/rec--1 at Roswell 5/2 (MW) and 1 at Boone's Draw 5/8 (JE).

LUCY'S WARBLER con/rec--92 reported on the Gila River spring count of 5/7 (RF+).

PARULA MARBLER uns/rec--a male was seen 3/3 and 4/10 W of Deming (WW). Details include "bright yellow chin and throat to the breast, grayish head, yellow-green patch on back, rest of the back gray, 2 white wingbars, belly white, and a white eye-ring."

OLIVE WARBLER con/rec--3+ in the Animas Mts. 3/23 (JH).

CAPE MAY WARBLER uns/rec--1 seen at Rattlesnake Springs 5/21 (MW). Details include "orange cheeks, yellow-rump, large white wing patch, yellow breast and sides with black spots."

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER sp/rec--a male in the Animas Mts. 3/23 was early (JH).

HERMIT WARBLER con/rec--a single female or im. male in the Animas Mts. 5/29 (WB,GS).

GRACE'S WARBLER sp/rec--1 N of Lindrith 5/30 (0V).

CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER uns/rec--1 at Boone's Draw 5/12 (JH) and a male at Cottonwood Gulch 5/28-29 (AM). Details include "yellow cap and black facial mark connecting with chestnut side stripe."

BAY-BREASTED WARBLER uns/rec--a female or im. male was seen 5/30 along the lower Mimbres River (RF). Details include "two prominent white wingbars, whitish area on the sides of the neck, and the wash of a pinkish color along the sides of the white underside, especially forward of the bend of the wing and just forward of the crissum."

BRONZED COWBIRD uns/rec--1 at Socorro 5/16-20 (PB). Details include "a pale dull blackish-brown bird with red eyes and long thick finch bill. Head, chin, and longish nape a grayer blackish color which could be puffed at will." Also, 2 males and a female at Glenwood 5/23 were only the second local records (JH).

CHIPPING SPARROW uns/rec--8 at Farmington 12/18 (AN+).

HARRIS SPARROW con/rec--2 at Las Vegas 12/7 to 5/10 (WH), 10 in the Farmington area in December (AN+), and 1 at Espanola 12/18 (EE).

GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW uns/rec--1 adult at Tesuque from 1/10 to 2/14 (BI) and an im. that molted into adult plumage present through 4/11 at Farmington for the first local record (J.Nordstrum+).
