INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY

CONTRIBUTORS DURING THIS PERIOD PROVIDED INCREASED COVERAGE OF SEVERAL POORLY-KNOWN AREAS OF THE STATE, ESPECIALLY FOR THE EASTERN PLAINS AND ALSO

IN THE CENTRAL—WESTERN AREA AND LUNA COUNTY. THIS ISSUE CONTINUES THE PRECEDENT OF CHINK—FILLING AND OF PRESENTING THE MANY DETAILS THAT ARE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE AND UPDATE A WORTHWHILE ORNITHOLOGICAL RECORD. SEVERAL UNUSUAL RECORDS SHOULD BE NOTED: THE VEERY AND THE GRAY—CHEEKED THRUSH WERE COLLECTED NEAR CLAYTON FOR THE FIRST VERIFIED RECORDS IN THE STATE; REPORTED WITH SUPPORTING DETAILS AND/OR PHOTOS WERE RUSTY BLACKBIRD AND BLUE JAY IN THE ESPANOLA—LOS ALAMOS AREA; OLD—SQUAW AT THE BOSQUE DEL APACHE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE; BLACK—BELLIED TREE DUCK, WHITE—TAILED HAWK, AND GOLDEN—CROWNED SPARROW IN THE SILVER CITY AREA; AND RUDDY TURNSTONE AND MAGNOLIA WARBLER IN THE ROSWELL AREA. SEVERAL OTHER UNUSUAL RECORDS WERE RECEIVED WITHOUT SUPPORTING DETAILS OR PHOTOGRAPHIC EVIDENCE, BUT SOME MAY PROVE ACCEPTABLE, E.G., WINTER DICKCISSELS AT FARMINGTON, AND FIRST STATE RECORDS OF SHORT—BILLED MARSH WREN AT BITTER LAKE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE. CAREFUL IDENTIFICATION AND DOCUMENTATION OF ALL RECORDS IS URGED, WITH SPECIMEN OR PHOTOGRAPHIC SUBSTANTIATION WHEN POSSIBLE.

FROM THE AVAILABLE DATA THE GENERAL WINTER AND MIGRATIONAL SCENE APPEARED TO BE WITHIN NORMAL LIMITS FOR MOST SPECIES, WITH VARIOUS EXCEPTIONS. WHITE-WINGED DOVES WINTERED AT LAS CRUCES, AND BAND-TAILED PIGEONS AT FT. BAYARD, AND THERE WERE REPORTS OF OTHER GENERALLY MIGRATORY SPECIES LINGERING INTO THE WINTER SEASON, E.G., TURKEY VULTURE AND OSPREY IN THE SOUTHEAST, AND TREE SWALLOW AT ESPANOLA. IT APPEARS THAT SEVERAL SPECIES OF SWALLOWS RETURNED EARLIER IN SPRING THAN AVERAGE, WHILE SPECIES SUCH AS WHITE-FACED IRIS WERE AT LEAST LOCALLY TARDY IN DEPARTURE. THE DIVERSITY OF MIGRATORY SPECIES WAS MARKED IN SOME GROUPS, NOTABLY IN SHOREBIRDS (20 PLOVERS AND SANDPIPERS), WARBLERS (24 SPECIES), AND FINCHES (49 SPECIES). NOTABLE AMONG SHOREBIRDS WERE SEMIPALMATED PLOVERS IN SEVERAL AREAS, STILT SANDPIPER, SANDERLING, AND WHIMBREL (UNCONFIRMED) AT BITTER LAKE N.W.R., AND STILT SANDPIPER (UNCONFIRMED) AT EMBUDO. WARBLERS INCLUDED BLACK-AND-WHITE IN SEVERAL AREAS, PARULA WARBLER AT BONITO LAKE, PALM AND HERMIT WABBLERS NEAR SILVER CITY, BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER AT BOSOUE DEL APACHE N.W.R., AND OVENBIRD BANDED AT KIRTLAND. FINCH RECORDS INCLUDED ABOUT A DOZEN WIDESPREAD SPRING RECORDS OF ROSE-BREASTED GROSBEAK, AND TERRITORIAL SAVANNAH SPARROWS IN THE CENTRAL-NORTHERN AREA. EVENING GROSBEAKS STAGED A MODERATE INVASION, WITH LESSER NUMBERS OF CASSIN'S FINCHES AND AMERICAN GOLOFINCHES. OTHER INTERESTING RECORDS INCLUDED A FLAMMULATED OWL BANDED NEAR PORTALES, WHIP-POOR-WILL HEARD AT CEDAR CREST, SPRAGUE'S PIPIT AND ORCHARD ORIOLE REPORTED AT CABALLO LAKE, CALLIOPE HUMMINGBIRD AT SILVER CITY, AND A DIPPER SEEN IN LUNA COUNTY. THERE WERE ALSO LITTLE BLUE HERONS IN TWO AREAS OF THE SOUTH.

AMONG BREEDING SPECIES, THE ESTABLISHMENT OF NESTING OF THE BOAT—TAILED GRACKLE AND YELLOW—HEADED BLACKBIRD AT TUCUMCARI AND KIRTLAND WAS RECORDED, WHILE THE COMMON GRACKLE CONTINUES TO CONSOLIDATE ITS RANGE IN THE NORTHEAST. THE LARGE COLONY OF DOUBLE—CRESTED CORMORANTS AND BLACK—CROWNED NIGHT HERONS WAS ACTIVE AGAIN THIS YEAR AT CABALLO LAKE, BUT SNOWY EGRETS DID NOT RETURN TO NEST AT BITTER LAKE N.W.R. NESTING RECORDS FOR GREAT BLUE HERONS ARE ASSUMING GREATER IMPORTANCE: THIS SPECIES HAS BEEN SINGLED OUT FOR SPECIAL STUDY BY CORNELL UNIVERSITY, AND ALL RECORDS, AFFIRMATIVE AND NEGATIVE, ARE REQUESTED.

NINE AUDUBON CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNTS WERE HELD IN THE STATE IN THE 1970 SEASON. WHAT APPEARS TO BE A NEW STATE HIGH IS THE 105 SPECIES (PLUS TWO ADDITIONAL DURING THE COUNT PERIOD) AT ROSWELL ON 12/22, WITH TOTALS FROM OTHER COUNTS AS FOLLOWS: LOVING 86 (+9) ON 12/30; ESPANOLA 72 ON 12/27; FARMINGTON 68 (+2) ON 12/26; SILVER CITY 64 (+2) ON 1/2; LAS VEGAS 63 ON 1/1; BOSQUE DEL APACHE N.W.R. 51 ON 1/1; CLAYTON 46 (+3) ON 1/1; AND CHACO CANON 14 (+2) ON 1/1.

THREE SPRING COURTS WERE HELD IN THE STATE, INCLUDING THE ANNUAL ONES IN THE GILA VALLEY AND AT BITTER LAKE N.W.R., BOTH ON 5/8, AND ONE AT FARMINGTON ON 5/15. THE GILA COUNT RECORDED 139 SPECIES, THE FARMINGTON COUNT 96, THE BITTER LAKE N.W.R. COUNT 79 SPECIES. REPORT OF A COUNT MADE ON 11/15 IN LUNA COUNTY WAS RECEIVED LATE, BUT IN VIEW OF THE DEARTH OF INFORMATION FROM THIS AREA THE RECORDS ARE INCLUDED IN THIS REPORT.

EDITORS' NOTE

REPORT OF A FERRUGINOUS OWL IN GUADALUPE CANON, NEW MEXICO, IN JULY, 1970, WAS PUBLISHED IN <u>AMERICAN BIRDS</u> (VOL. 24, PP. 657, 704; 1970). SINCE THEN, THE OBSERVER HAS RETRACTED HIS REPORT, WHICH WAS BASED ON CALL NOTES AND HABITAT. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT CLIFF CHIPMUNKS HAVE BEEN MISTAKEN FOR PYGMY OWLS, AND HABITAT IDENTIFICATION OF BIRDS OUTSIDE THEIR NORMAL RANGE IS RISKY.
