FROM THE EDITORS:

The spring season was remarkable for well-substantiated reports of species extremely rare in New Mexico. A first-ever sighting for the state was a Black-capped Vireo. A well-documented Great Kiskadee provided New Mexico's second and "most reliable" account. Described as the "most credible yet" was the account of a Red-shouldered Hawk and a Buff-breasted Sandpiper was the "first well-substantiated" in New Mexico. There were the second acceptable record of a Heermann's Gull, a second probable Louisiana Waterthrush, and the second Costa's Hummingbird since 1876.

There was broader fundamental significance in the inauguration of the first season-long spring raptor migration count in western North America. Under the leadership of Steve Hoffman, a team of observers kept watch 10 miles east of Albuquerque in the Sandia Mountains for 44 days between February 22 and May 5. A total of 1,640 raptors of 17 species were recorded, with a peak of 232 of 14 species on April 14. The total included 120 individuals not identified as to species.

RED-SHOULDERED HAWK -- unusual: 1 adult at Randall's Pool 4/15 (BZ, JDo). Photo not conclusive, but accompanying details make this the most credible report to date of this species in N.M., according to John Hubbard.

BROAD-WINGED HAWK -- 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/23 (JE); few details.

ELF OWL -- 1 at Glenwood 4/5 (BMc).

CHIMNEY SWIFT -- Now a regular at Clayton; first arrival seen 5/5; after 5/11, 4 to 7 daily (WC, AK)....Probable sightings include 2 at Rio Grande Nature Center about 4/22 (Buck Cully), and these by WH: 2 or 3 at Madrone Ponds 5/16, and 5/25 (with PL); 1 at Bosque Bridge 4/29, and singles at Bosque NWR 4/29 and 5/25 with PL. COSTA'S HUMMINGBIRD -- unusual: 1 male in side canyon near Gila Bird Habitat 5/5 on Gila Count (Tom Brake, Wendy & Warren Shaul); good details. Second sighting of species in N.M. since 1876.

CALLIOPE HUMMINGBIRD -- A female in Karr Canyon 5/9 (HM, BP); possible but thinly documented.

BROAD-TAILED HUMMINGBIRD-- 3 males on 5/3 at Randall's Pool, where unusual (BZ).

RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD -- A male in Socorro 4/21-23 (PB); rare in N.M. in spring.

LEWIS' WOODPECKER -- Numbers were up in the MRGV, with 1 at Cochiti L. and Santa Fe R. 5/9 and 1 at Bernalillo 4/17 (WE), plus 3 at Corrales 5/26 and 2 at Belen 5/28 (WH).

ACORN WOODPECKER -- 1-2 at Las Animas Creek 5/13 (RH), 1 on OCBC Census 5/5-6, and 5 in Guadalupe Canyon 5/19 (WH, WE).

GILA WOODPECKER -- 2 on Gila Count 5/5, a low number, and 5 in Guadalupe Canyon 5/19 (WE, WH).

YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER -- 2 on Gila Count 5/5 was high.

DOWNY WOODPECKER -- 2 at Bosque NWR 4/29 (WE) was a southerly record for the season. 1 at Estancia 4/15 (PI).

BLACK PHOEBE -- At Zuni, high of 7 on 4/8 and 1 on 5/26 (JT, TR). In upper Pecos Valley, on 5/2, pair at Sena, pair at El Pueblo bridge (JH).

 $\underline{\text{EASTERN PHOEBE}}$ —Also on 5/2 on upper Pecos R., 1 at La Fragua and 1 being chased by a Black Phoebe at El Pueblo bridge (JH).

 $\overline{\text{THICK-BILLED KINGBIRD}}$ -- breeding: 8 birds, including pair building nest, in Guadalupe Canyon 5/19 (WH, WE).

WCSTERN KINGBIRD -- 1 (early) on 4/8 at Bosque NWR (PI+).

EASTERN KINGBIRD -- 1 at Shady Lakes 5/7 (DS); 1 on 5/25 at Isleta marsh, where species breeds (WH).

SCISSOR-TAILED FI.YCATCHER -- 1 at Carlsbad 5/8 and 3 at Caprock 5/11 (HM,TW,BP).

PURPLE MARTIN -- A male 4/25 at Tesuque ponds (JDm).

ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW -- An early first at Glenwood 2/25 (RSk).

GRAY-BREASTED JAY -- 4 in Guadalupe Canyon 5/19 (WH, WE).

PINYON JAY -- breeding: 1 young being fed by adult at Cottonwood Gulch 5/15 (AM).

 $\underline{\text{CLARK'S NUICRACKER}}$ -- 1 on Gila Count 5/5 near Gila cliff dwellings (BH, Bill Rogers).

CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN -- breeding: Bird on nest 14 mi. se. of Belen (NM6) 5/18, another on nest 11 mi. se. of Belen 5/18, 2+ small young and 2 adults 9 mi. se. of Belen 5/18 (JHi), and 2 young and 4 eggs 17 mi. se. of Belen 5/16 (R.Precek); 3 of the 4 nests were on power poles.

 $\frac{\text{COMMON RAVEN}}{\text{village in May}}$ - breeding: Pair nested again near gas pipelines n. of Bosque $\frac{\text{Village in May}}{\text{WH}}$.

BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE -- Numbers down in MRGV from previous year. Nesting pairs: 1 at Madrone, 2 at Bosque village, 1 at Bernardo (WH).

MOUNTAIN CHICKADEE -- Half as many as year earlier. Nesting pairs: 2 at Bosque village, 1 s. of Belen (WH).

BRIDLED TITMOUSE -- At Las Animas Creek, 3 on 3/3 (KZ) and 1 on 5/13 (RH).

PLAIN TITMOUSE -4 near river at San Ildefonso 3/30 were many for a riparian habitat (WE).

BUSHTIT -- 2+ at Three Rivers 4/10 (RH).

BROWN CREEPER -- breeding: Nest at Cottonwood Gulch was first for locale (AM). Latest in MRGV was 1 at Bernardo 4/14 (WH).

<u>CACTUS WREN -- breeding:</u> Nest with 2 eggs, 5 feet up in cholla cactus at San Simon Cienega 4/11 (JH).

ROCK WREN -- Male singing at University of New Mexico medical school building $\frac{1}{100}$ Albuquerque 5/1 (WH).

WINTER WREN -- unusual: 1 collected 0.5 mi. s. of Rosque bridge along Rio Grande 4/19 (WH) \leftarrow rare and irregular statewide.

BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER -- 1 at San Ildefonso 3/30 was an early migrant (WE).

<u>HLUEBIRDS</u> — A lengthy competition for a nest box at JH's home in Santa Fe: A pair of Mountains were at the box from 3/3, with the male carrying nesting material 4/25 as the female watched. Meantime a female Western was seen at the box 3/21 and again 4/25. Finally, pairs of the two species fought over the box between 5/6 and 5/12, and on 5/13 the Mountains were gone.

GRAY-CHEEKED THRUSH -- unusual: 1* at Clayton 5/10 (AK).

SWAINSON'S THRUSH -- 1 killed flying into a window at Clayton 5/29 (AK). 1 on \overline{n} . side of Albuquerque along Rio Grande 5/26 (PL), 1 singing in Albuquerque 5/26 (WH), 1** at Durling's Farm 5/1-7 (BZ+), and 2 on David Ligon's property in Cibola National Forest in mid-May (Jeff Hill, Ross & Clara Teuber).

HERMIT THRUSH -- 1 at Caprock 4/29 (RH).

GRAY CATBIRD -- 2 at Zuni 5/22 (JT), 1 at Clayton feeder 5/4-9 and 5/15-18 (fide AK), and 1 at Owen's Farm 4/30 (BZ, Scott Wilson).

NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD -- In a "virtual explosion," commonest in 10 years in Sandias, up to 8,200 feet (HS).

BROWN THRASHER-- Singles at Durling's and Owen's Farms 4/22, 5/1, 5/2 and $\overline{5/7}$ (BZ+).

<code>HENDIRE'S THRASHER = 1</code> on 4/8 at Very Large Array and 2 on 4/10 at Lordsburg playa 4 mi. s. of I-10 (JH).

CURVE-BILLED THRASHER -- breeding: Nested in cholla cactus at Owen's Farm from mid-March; species declining in El Paso area. 19 on Gila Count 5/5.

CRISSAL THRASHER -- 2 seen 5 mi. se. of White Rock 5/20, and 1 seen there twice in next week (JDm); 45 mi. n. previous N.M. sightings.

WATER PIPIT -- 1 on 5/30 at Zuni was late (IT). 30 to 50, unusually many, through March at Mangas Springs (RF).

CEDAR WAXWING -- spring flock of 10 at Cottonwood Gulch was last seen 6/4, very late (AM). 2 at Bosque village 5/31 also were late. On 5/9 there were 9 at Rattlesnake Springs and 2 at Durling's Farm (PL).

PHAINOPEPLA -- Pair at Mangas Springs 5/18, a first for there.

BELL'S VIREO -- breeding: 2 males and 1 female feeding just-fledged young were among 8 in Guadalupe Canyon 5/19 (WH, WE)....1 singing at Bosque village 5/7 (WH, D&SH) and 2 on Gila Count 5/5.

 $\underline{BLACK-CAPPFD\ VIREO}$ -- unusual: First good N.M. record was a detailed description by GP of one at Rattlesnake Springs 5/11.

GRAY VIRED -- Survey by D&BMc in Glenwood area found 2 at Glenwood and a total of 9 at Herve Canyon, Red Colt Canyon and S. Dugway between 4/16 and 4/19.... Singles singing at Pleasanton 5/2 and at Frisco Hot Springs 5/20 (JH).

NORTHERN PARULA -- 1 female at Madrone Ponds 4/19 (WH). 1 at Bitter L. 5/5 (KW). Female* at Randall's Pool 4/15 (KZ, SW).

YELLOW WARRLER -- breeding: Becoming commonest warbler in lower Gila Valley, with many nesting (RF).

CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER -- A male w. of Cochiti marsh 5/17 (BL).

CAPE MAY WARBLER -- unusual: 1 at Bitter L. 5/1-2 (KW). Rare in N.M.

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER -1 at Zuni 4/8 was early (JT). 1 at Caprock 4/24 (RH).

TOWNSEND'S WARRLER -- 2 on Gila Count. 1 at Bosque NWR 4/29 (early) (WE).

GRACE'S WARBLER -- 1 on Gila Count.

BLACK-AND-WHITE WARBLER -- 1 singing n. of Bosque village 5/25 (WH, PL). 1 at Bitter L. 5/1 (KW). 1 at Durling's Farm 5/1 (KZ, SW).

AMERICAN REDSTART -- Singles at Zuni 5/22-29 (JT, TR). A female at Little Tesuque Creek 5/16 (WE). 1 adult male at Isleta marsh 5/25 (WH, PL), 1 second-year bird n. of Bernardo 5/24 (WH), and pair at Bosque NWR 5/19 (JND).

WORM-EATING WARBLER -- 1** at Durling's Farm 4/10 (KZ, SW).

OVENBIRD -- 1 at Lone Butte 5/10 (Curtis Schaafsma).

MORTHERN WATERTHRUSH -- 1 or 2 at Zuni 5/22-23 (JT). 1 at Tesuque ponds 4/29 (JDm). Singles s. of Belen 5/25 and at Bosque village 5/16 (WH, PL). Up to 3 daily 5/7-15 in eastern Dona Ana County (KZ+).

LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH -- unusual: 1 at Owen's Farm 5/7; details and photo (KZ). Second good record for N.M.

PAINTED REDSTART -- 2 on west fork of Gila R. 5/5 and 2 on east fork 5/6 (BH, Bill Rogers). 1 at Bosque NWR 4/29 (WE+).

YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT -- High of 55 at Zuni 5/23 (JT).

OLIVE WARBLER -- None in usual locale on Signal Peak road (RF).

HEPATIC TANAGER -- 1 on Espanola Count 5/13 (PI+).

PYRRHULOXIA -- Seen 5/8, 5/10 at Percha Dam SP (DM).

DICKCISSEL -- 1 at Santa Fe 5/14-16 (PI); no details. 1 at Black R. 4/23 (JE).

CASSIN'S SPARROW -- breeding: 2 nests with eggs (1 with a cowbird egg) on Jornada in late May (KZ).

AMERICAN TREE SPARROW-- 1 at Bitter L. 4/14 (PI+). Seen by many at Rio Grande Nature Center in spring.

SWAMP SPARROW -- 1 at Zuni 5/24 (JT); 2 at Percha Dam SP 5/1 (DM).

HARRIS' SPARROW -- 1 at Socorro 1/6 to 5/3 (PB). Seen at Rio Grande Nature Center in spring.

BOBOLINK -- 1 male at Socorro 5/17 (PB).

EASTERN MEADOWLARK -- Singles singing at San Simon Cienega 4/11 and 5/22 (JH).

GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE -- 1 migrating male at McGregor Range 4/10 (RH). 2 near Moriarty 3/31 (PI+); moving into new area. 2 to 6 in Blackrock L. area of Zuni 4/24-5/26 (TR). 2 at Dulce 5/5 (DS).

COMMON GRACKLE -- 16 (early) in Moriarty area 3/31 (PI+); 1 at Zuni 4/8 (JT).

RRONZED COWBIRD-- At Las Cruces feeder 5/22, 27 (EW); 1 female at Durling's Farm (BZ, SW).

ORCHARD ORIOLE -- A male at Aguirre Springs 5/29 (BZ).

MORTHERN ORIOLE -- 1 of Baltimore race at Bitter L. 5/10 ((HM+)....Bullock's race in Truth or Consequences included male 4/12, an early arrival; 5 males, 1 female 4/28, and 3 males, 3 females and several young 5/6 to 5/31 (DM).

SCOTT'S ORICLE -- 2+ birds of both sexes at hummingbird feeders in Pajarito area of Los Alamos 5/5-31 (Maxine Lewis). Pair and 3 additional males 5 mi. se. of White Rock 6/5 (JDm, BL). 1 at Bosque village 4/29, unusual for MRGV, but 2 or 3 others heard during spring (WH). 1 male, first of season, at Las Cruces 4/8 (EW). 1 male in Corrales area 5/6 (WE).

LESSER COLDFINCH -- Several in Clayton area 5/9, 13, 14, 15 (Neland Gray+).
