Another species was added to the New Mexico list when a female Gargany, a Eurasian dabbling duck, was shot at Bitter L. during an authorized hunting period. The season's rarities were our fourth Piping Plover, our third Great Kiskadee, and the second modern documented Cerulean Warbler. A likely Eurasian Wigeon also was remarkable. And the Boreal Owl kept moving south.

Unusual sightings were numerous. A Common Black Hawk at Albuquerque and a Harris' Hawk at Bosque NWR were out of place. Hummingbirds at the "wrong" place or time included Rufous at Post Office Canyon and Pleasanton, a Broadbilled at Hobbs, and a Calliope and two Magnificents at Silver City feeders. A Le Conte's Sparrow was near Caprock. A probable record high for the species was a congregation of 27,000 Violet-green Swallows at Navajo Dam. Continuing their northward and westward march, Bronzed Cowbirds showed up at Roswell, Socorro, Percha Dam and Mangas Springs. Terms at unaccustomed sites included two Caspians at Bluewater L., a Common at Holloman L., and a Lasat at Bosque NWR.

Seven vireo species were seen, and 31 warblers (notably Golden-winged, Worm-eating, Kentucky, and the Cerulean). A Varied Thrush in Carlabad was notable.

Bill Howe noted that, as the new Brantley Dam near Carlsbad fills, the water level at upstream L. McMillan has fallen, drying up a marsh at its north end that "was an important area for marsh birds and shore birds in the Pecos Valley."

The spring count in the Sandias of northward-bound raptors, February 1 through May 9, recorded 2,780 birds of 18 species, plus 122 not identified as to species. Hawkwatch International (latest name) managed the count.

RED-THROATED LOON -- unusual: 1 at L. McMillan 3/25 (BZ+); uncertain because the bird -- rare in N.M. -- was a quarter mile away and in winter plumage.

COMMON LOON -- 2 at Maxwell NWR 5/31 (PSt).

EARED GREBE -- 7 to 8 at Bosque NWR 4/8 (PSt).

WESTERN GREBE -- 4 at Maxwell NWR 5/30-31 (PSt).

CLARK'S GREBE -- 12 at Maxwell NWR 5/3D-31 (PSt). Up to 3 in the Pecos basin from Las Vegas to L. McMillan 3/25-5/14. Approximately 20 pairs on the Rio Grande south of San Marcial 5/23-24 (JH+). 2 at Bitter L. 5/6 (SW).

AMERICAN WHITE PELICAN -- 1 seen 3/26 and 16 on 4/16 (AN+) at Morgan L. 25 on 5/6 at L. McMillan (SW) and 8 at Maxwell NWR 5/30-31 (PSt). Unexpected were 30+ over the Magdalena Mts. 4/8 and 55 over the San Mateos 4/14 (PJ+). Up to 55 near Alamogordo 3/24-4/3 (JTa).

OOUBLE-CRESTEO CORMORANT -- breeding: Found nesting s. of San Marcial 5/23 (JH)....l or 2 at Zuni 3/22 and 5/14 (OC). 1 possible at Snow L. 5/12 (PJ).

OLIVACEOUS CORMORANT -- 3 or 4 at Bosque NWR 5/13-14 (MH).

AMERICAN BITTERN -- 2 at Bosque NWR 4/9 (PSt).

GREAT BLUE HERON --breeding: Some observed in a cormorant nesting colony in upper Caballo L., including one that appeared to be incubating (C. S. Wells, fide W. Pulich). Active nest sites in southern Eddy County in early March (SW).

GREAT EGRET -- 1 at Bitter L. 3/8 and 2 at Caballo L. 3/29 (PSt).

SNOWY EGRET -- breeding: Up to 400 nesting in s. Eddy County in early March (SW)

LITTLE BLUE HERON -- 2 to 4 seen near Socorro (GH), s. of San Marcial (JH) and at Bitter L. (SB+) 4/16-5/23.

TRICOLORED HERON -- Singles at Bosque NWR 5/2 (PM) and near Loving 5/7 (SW).

CATTLE EGRET -- Up to 30 in the Socorro area 4/4-5 and 29 (JH+), 10 at Bosque 4/9 (PSn) and 8 there 4/26 (PJ). 1 at Sevilleta NWR 5/29 (RT). Many small flocks at San Marcial 5/24 (JS+); a few also at Bitter L. (SB+). 9 on Gila count. 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/17 (fide PC).

BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERON -- breeding: 30 to 32 active nests near Espanola 5/25 (CR). Up to 500 nesting in s. Eddy County in early March (SW).

WHITE-FACED IBIS -- 2 at Bosque NWR 3/6 (RT) and 20 on 4/9 (PSt). 18 near Tularosa 3/10 and 3/28, plus 22 in April (JSNHt, GSm +). 35 at Holloman L. 4/9 (SW).

GREAT WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE -- Up to 15 at Bosque NWR 3/6-4/14 (RT+).

SNOW GDOSE -- 1 on Farmington count. 1 at McAllister L. 4/23 (PSt). Up to 16 near Clayton through 4/17 (WC). About 340 on 3/10 (PJ, JS), 7 on 5/13-14 (MH) and 3 on 5/23 (PM) at Bosque NWR.

CANADA GOOSE -- 4 on Chama R. below El Vado L. 5/13-14 (CR)....Goslings seen 5/6 at Bitter L. (SW) and 5/22 at La Joya SGR (JH, JV).

MALLARO -- Pairs of Mexican form at Bosque NWR 4/8 and at Redrock 3/31 (SW).

189-2 (spring 189)

GARGANEY -- unusual: The first N.M. record of this small Eurasian dabbling duck -- a common breeder from Britain to Siberia -- was belatedly analyzed in the NMOS Bulletin (Vol. 18, No. 3-4, 1990) by C. Gregory Schmitt. It was shot at Bitter L. during a hunting season by James B. Montgomery, Jr., who sent the left wing to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, which identified it as an immature female Garganey. This difficult identification was confirmed by Schmitt, who made sure that it could not have escaped from any licensed breeding flock in N.M. A rare wanderer to North America, the species has been sighted in the interior only on 16 other occasions, end only 2 other females have been reported outside Aleska. Schmitt's detailed account in the Bulletin is a model well worth reading.

 $\overline{\text{CINNAMON}} \times \overline{\text{BLUE-WINGED TEAL}}$ -- This hybrid at Bosque NWR 3/21-4/25 may have been the same one present there the previous spring.

NORTHERN SHOVELER -- 400+ at Holloman L. 4/9 (SW).

EURASIAN WIGEON -- unusual: One at L. Avalon 3/25 (PJ, JS).

CANVASBACK -- Pair at Las Vegas NWR 4/23 (PSn).

RING-NECKED DUCK -- 7 at Holloman L. 3/30 (EW, LHS); 1 near Abiquiu on Rio Chama 4/22 (PSn); 1 to 20 at Randall Davey in April (CR).

GREATER SCAUP -- Up to 4 at La Joya SGR 3/30 (PJ, JS) and Bear Canyon L. 5/22 (RF).

LESSER SCAUP -- Up to 52 at Boaque NWR 3/9-5/23 (PM).

COMMON GOLDENEYE -- 2 at Las Vegas NWR 4/23 (PSn) and 1 to 3 there 4/2-30 (CR).

BUFFLEHEAD -- 2 at Selt Lakes near Loving 4/5 (SW); first report for area.

COMMON MERGANSER -- 2 n. of Alcalde on Rio Grande (Española count).

RED-BREAST%ED MERGANSER -- 4 at Bill Evens L. 3/21 (RF).

OSPREY -- breeding: Pair reported nesting at Elephant Butte L. (J. Koons, fide RF). Verification lacking.

BLACK-SHOULDERED KITE -- unusual: 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/14 (Cathy Cook+).

<u>BALD EAGLE</u> -- <u>breeding</u>: Pairs at Bolack's Farm (Farmington) and et Navajo L. built neets (AN), but both were abandoned in May with no young fledged. A nest with 2 fledgling and a "pippling" in Sierra County 3/20 (K. Stinnatt , fide JH)....1 adult and 1 immature in Catron County 3/3 (JS, JH+); 1 possibly of this species at Bosque NWR 4/6 (JS, PJ) was late; details sketchy.

NORTHERN HARRIER- unusual: Late individuals near Española 5/18 (BL+_); Zuni 5/26 (DC); near Tularosa S/27 (JSNHt), and at Mangas Springs 5/14 (RF).

COMMON BLACK HAWK -- breeding: 1 at nest on Mogollon Creek 5/6 (PI)....1 at Albuquerque 5/17 (WH, JH)...."I am real happy with the number of Black Hawks this year." 6/6 (RF) -- nesting pairs: 1 or 2 in Redrock area, 7 or 8 in Gila Valley, 1 on San Francisco R., 1 new nest at Glenwood fish hatchery.

HARRIS' HAWK -- unusual: 1 at Bosque NWR, with details, 3/10, 11 (PJ, JS) and 4/4 (PM).

 ${\tt BROAD-WINGED\ HAWK}$ -- unueual:1 adult at Boone's Draw 5/5 (PJ, JS); details sketchy.

<u>SWAINSON'S HAWK</u> -- Earliest arrivals, singles at Nutt 3/3D, near Hachita 4/4 (PSt), and in Eddy and Lea Counties 3/28 (SW).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK -- breeding: Pair on active nest on Bitter Creek, Grent County, 5/5, adult on nest and adult soaring over the same area 5/18 (SWi)....l in Guadalupe Canyon 5/7 (SWi).

RED-TAILED HAWK -- breeding: With one exception, all nests observed in the Gila Valley produced only single fledglings (RF).

LESSER PRAIRIE CHICKEN -- Heafd at Boone's Draw 5/4 (JS); 10+ at Caprock 3/24 (PJ, JS).

WILD TURKEY -- 1 at San Antonio 4/21 (PJ) and 2 at San Marcial 5/24 (JH) probably derived from the population at Bosque NWR, where 78 were seen 3/11 (RT, PB). 1 near San Jon 5/14 (SW), well east of usual range, was probably a released or escaped bird; singles at Rattlesnake Springs 4/14 and 5/18 (fide PC); present at Dog Canyon 4/23-24 (SF+).

 $\underline{\text{MONTEZUMA QUAIL}}$ -- A pair at Mangas Springs 3/29+ (RF); seen regularly at Rodeo all season (RS).

NORTHERN BOBWHITE -- 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/20 (MF) and 1 nearby at Washington Ranch 5/9 (SW).

SCALED QUAIL -- Numbers still low in Eddy and Lea Counties (SW).

<u>VIRGINIA RAIL</u> -- 1 at Percha Dam SP 5/11 (PJ). At Bosque NWR, singles seen 4/21, 4/30 and 5/11 (GH), and a few 5/3, 13 and 16 (PM).

SORA -- 1 on Española count. 4/14-5/23 at Bosque NWR (v.o.). Seen 3/1-5/21 in Gila Valley (RF).

COMMON MOORHEN -- 1 seen 5/15 at Clayton L., n. of usual range (AK).

SANDHILL CRANE -- Late 3 at Las Vegas 4/2 (CR). Late singles at Bosque NWR 4/4 (PM) and Las Cruces 4/22 (Barbara & Harold Harrison).

WHOOPING CRANE -- Last one at Bosque NWR 3/4 (PM).

BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER -- 9 at Bitter L. 5/6 (PJ, JS); 3 at Holloman L. 5/10 (MH).

SNOWY PLOVER -- Young first seen 5/6 (PJ, JS) at Laguna Grande; 1 or 2 at Laguna Plata, Lea County, 3/9 and 3/28 (SW).

SEMIPALMATED PLOVER -- 8 et Bosque NWR 3/18 (PB, RT).

PIPING PLOVER -- unusual: 1 at Bitter L. 5/6 (SW); state's 4th report.

MOUNTAIN PLOVER -- 1 near Hatch 4/22 (80).

BLACK-NECKED STILT -- 2 to 17 at Bosque NWR 3/6 to 5/18(RT, PB+); 19 near Carlsbad 5/5 (SW).

WILSON'S PHALAROPE -- First eighted were 9 at Bosque NWR 3/21 (PM). Moderate numbers moved throughout the state (v.o.).

RED-NECKED PHALAROPE -- 2 at Holloman L. 5/10 (MH).

FRANKLIN'S GULL -- Present in Rio Grande Valley 4/5-5/4. High count 82 near Bosque NWR 5/1 and 5/4 (PJ, JS). Other reports included 1 at Farmington 5/13 (AN); 5 at Tierra Amarilla 5/12 (CR+), 65 at Las Vegas NWR 4/25 (CR+), 14 at Blackrock L. 4/23 (DC),7 at Holloman L. 5/1 (Jeff Bickle), and 10+ at Bitter L. 5/4 (PJ, JS).

BONAPARTE'S GULL -- 1 at Las Vegas NWR 4/2 (CR), 2 at Cochiti L. 4/8 (CR+), 1 at Bosque NWR 3/17 (PM) and 30 there 4/8 (SW), 10 at Caballo L. 4/9 (SW), and 35 at L. McMillan 3/24 (PJ, JS).

BLACK TERN -- 6 at Bosque NWR 5/14 (MH) and 2 there 5/16 (PM); 60 at Bitter L. 5/6 (SW). None seen at L. McMillan, totally dry this spring because of fixing of the new Brantley L.

BAND-TAILED PIGEON -- 2 at McMillen Canyon, Gila area, 5/10 (RF) ware first arrivals; 1 at Apache Creek, western Grant County, 5/17 (SWi).

RINGED TURTLE-DOVE -- unusual: 1 stayed in Las Cruces 12/30-5/9 (LHS).

WHITE-WINGED DOVE -- unusual: 1 in w. Albuquerque (Paradise Hills) 4/25 (Roy Tomlinson); 1 in Monticello at the Three Gun Spring trailhead (Sandia Mts.) 5/30 (HS) -- where vary rare -- and 2 at Cherry Creek, Pinos Alton Mts.; 5/24 (MH)...Up to 15 at Socorro 5/3 (PJ), 2 or 3 at Bitter Creek, Grant County, 5/4-5 (SWi), at Alamogordo March through May (William Wells, Naomi Dobbins, RJ, GSmi), w. of Tularosa March-May (JSNHt), 1 early at Mangas Springs 3/6 (RF), several at Redrock 3/28 were late first arrivals (AF), common in Carlsbed all spring (SW).

MOURNING DOVE -- breeding: Fledgling at Carlsbad 3/21 was very early (Gerald Duran, SW).

INCA DOVE -- unusual: 1 at Santa Fe 3/11-4/2 (LH) was far north of reage... 2 at Socorro 4/29 (PJ), 3 near La Luz 5/6 (OCBC count), but only singles reported at Alemogordo 3/12 and 4/15 (William Wells).

COMMON GROUND DOVE -- unusual: 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/20 (80).

GREEN PARAKEET (Aratinga holochlora)? -- unusual: An all-green parakeet, well described, with long tail and over-all length of about 12 to 14 inches, seen in Carlsbad 5/20 (SW) was probably genus <u>Aratinga</u> and most likely an escape. But the species <u>A. holochlora</u> ranges in the wild to southwest Chihuehua in Mexico, only 300 miles from Carlsbad.

YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO -- unusual: 1 near Virden 5/4-5 (SWi) was early.

<u>ELF OWL</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 in Water Canyon 4/29, with details (CB); at northern limit of species' range....Also 1 to 4 on 5/11 (PJ) at Glenwood, where they are more regular; 1 or 2 heard calling inGuadalupe Canyon early 3/19-20 and 5/8 (SWi).

BURROWING OWL -- breeding: Numbers still on rise in Carlsbad, with species seen nearly daily. At least 1 nest in Carlsbad, plue more in surrounding countryside. (SW).

<u>SPOTTED OWL</u> -- 1 on 3/18 and 2 (possibly a pair) near Zuni 4/16, 22, 29 (0C); 1 photographed in McMillan Canyon 3/31 (RF) and seen there following week-end (HSRW).

SHORT-EAREO OWL -- 1, with details, at Las Vagas NWR 4/15 (CR).

BOREAL OWL -- unusual: 1 in the Pecos Wilderness at 10,800 feet was a new southerly occurrence of the species (OS+).

LESSER NIGHTHAWK -- 1 at Zuni 5/26 (JT), north of usual range.

COMMON NIGHTHAWK -- 1 at Bell L. 5/6 and 2 along a Lea County road 5/6 (PJ, JS) were first reports of season.

COMMON POORWILL -- 1 or 2 at Bell L. 5/6 (PJ, JS) were early.

WHIP-POOR-WILL -- unusual: 1 in Water Canyon 4/29, with details (CB), and 8 to 10 there and in Big Rosa Canyon (Magdalena Mts.) 5/19-20 (PJ+) were north of usual range....1 at P. O. Canyon 4/1-10 (RS). 1 in Guadalupe Mts. was first reported in Eddy County since 1984 (SW).

CHIMNEY SWIFT -- unusual: West of normal range was 1 at Albuquerque 4/20 (LG)...2 or 3 at Clovis 4/23-5/3 (MH). Returned 5/8 to Clayton, which seems to be the only reliable N.M. location for the species.

WHITE-THROATEO SWIFT -- unusual: Early arrivals et Zuni 3/18 (OC), Sandia Mts. 3/9 (HS), 20 at Bandelier NM 3/13 (PSt) and at various sites in northwest Grant County 2/28 and later (SWi).

BROAD-BILLED HUMMINGBIRD --Single maies at Hobbs (details) 6/2 (Jeanne Hayes) and in Guadalupe Canyon 3/20 (SWi), early.

MAGNIFICENT HUMMINGBIRD -- unusual: 2 at Silver City feeders in early May (fide RF).

<u>LUCIFER HUMMINGBIRD</u> -- First male at P. O. Canyon 3/24, female 4/3; up to 10 present throughout the season (RS).

BLACK-CHINNEO HUMMINGBIRD -- First arrivals at feeders: 2.3 (14/13 at Fermington (lete) (AN); 4/14 (late) at Albuquerque (RT); 3/27 at Pleasanton (BMc); 4/4 in Socorro (PJ, JH); 3/28 in Alamogordo (OCBC); 4/1 in Silver City (RF).

CALLIOPE HUMMINGBIRO -- unusual: 1 et Silver City feeder 3/28-31+ (RF photo).

BROAD-TAILED HUMMINGBIRD -- unuauel: 1 at Bell L. 5/6 was east of normal range (PJ, JS)....Single early arrivals at feeders: Zuni 4/12 (DC); Bandelier NM 4/4 (CJe); Los Alamos 4/13 (PSn)Randall Oavey 4/17 (CR); Cedar Crest 4/5 (PSt); Sevilleta NWR 4/13 (RT, PB); Alamogordo 3/26 (OCBC); Truth or Consequences 4/26 (DM); Silver City 5/13 (RF), plus 2 at Carlsbad Caverns 4/20 (PC).

<u>RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: Male at Pleasanton feeder before 3/29; 1 at P.O. Canyon 4/7-10 (RS).

LEWIS' WOODPECKER -- 2+ at Clayton 3/23 (WC); eastern limit of range.

ACORN WOODPECKER -- 2 at Apache Creek (western Grant County, not Catron County) 5/16-17 and a pair at Bitter Creek (western Grant County) 5/19 (SWi) probably neating in a sycamore, were inference areas near Arizona-New Mexico border rarely visited by observers.

GILA WOODPECKER -- breeding: Adult feeding young at a cavity at same Bitter Creek 5/5, a remote area...10 on Gila spring count was double usual number.

YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER -- An immature at Silver City 3/2 (DSMZ) was well west of normal range.

GREATER PEWEE -- 1 in Guadalupe Canyon 5/7-8 (SWi) was maybe the first record there; 1 at McMillen campground (Grant County) 5/10 (RF).

EASTERN WOOD-PEWEE -- 1 singing at Boone's Drew 5/6-7 (MH).

WILLOW FLYCATCHER -- 1 to 2 singing at Zuni 5/14 and later (DC).

LEAST FLYCATCHER -- 2 at Boone's Draw end 1 at Clovis 5/6 (MH).

HAMMOND'S FLYCATCHER -- 3 singing in Zuni Mts. 5/28 (JT).

GRAY FLYCATCHER -- 1 singing in Magdalena Mts. 5/4 (JB1+).

EASTERN PHOEBE -- 1 near Redrock 3/24 (RF) was westerly; 1 near Villanueva 5/12 (PSt); 1 near Whites City 4/30 (BO).

VERMILION FLYCATCHER -- 2 at Bosque NWR 4/9 (PI+).

ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHER -- 1 near Carlsbad 3/30 (W. Dunmire, SW) was early.

<u>GREAT KISKADEE -- unusual</u>: 1 at Clayton 5/13-14 (WC) was perhaps the third state record.

CASSIN'S KINGBIRD -- Early were singles in the Peloncillo Mts. 3/18-19 (SWi) and near Redrock 3/31 (PSt).

EASTERN KINGBIRD -- 1 at Horse Springs (Catron) 5/6 (80) was west of usual range.

SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER --Singles near Nara Visa 5/10 (80+), Elida (Roosevelt) 5/14 (SW), and on Roswell count were northerly.

<u>VIOLET-GREEN SWALLOW</u> -- Estimated 27,000 in five hours below Navajo Dam 4/26 (JB1, WB1) was one of the highest counts ever in New Mexico.

BANK SWALLOW -- breeding: 20 at new site near Alcalde 5/21 (BL+). Old site at San Juan Pueblo was destroyed by construction activities.

CAVE SWALLOW -- High count at Carlsbad Caverns NP was 3,000 as of 5/8 (SW).

BARN SWALLOW -- breeding: 22 nests n. of Rodeo 5/17 (RF) in an area where species is a very local breeder.

BLUE JAY -- Singles occasionally seen in Clayton in May were apparently migrants, but the species was common in Carlsbad residential areas (SW).

STELLER'S JAY -- breeding: A pair nested in a pyracentha bush in Los Alamos, with young present 5/24 (Merle Bunker).

PINYON JAY -- A flock of about 20 near Glenwood 3/2 (JH+) and 10 near Cliff on the Gila Valley count were at the southern limit of their range.

GRAY-BREASTED JAY -- Fairly common 3/14 in small groups on Apache Creek (western Grant County, not Catron) in a remote area (SWi).

CLARK'S NUTCRACKER -- 5 between El Vado and Abiquiu Reservoirs 5/12-14 (CR+) along the Chama R.; 4 in Zuni Mts. 4/8 (OC).

AMERICAN CROW -- breeding: Pair nested at Mangas Springs and were feeding young in May (RF) for the first time in about 50 years....200 at Bosque NWR 3/11 (PB, RT).

BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE -- 24 on Farmington count was high.

BRIDLED TITMOUSE -- 2 at Water Canyon 5/3 and 5/17, and 5 in the San Mateos 4/14 (PJ, JS).

RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH -- 1 or 2 along Chama R. at Aragon 5/13-14 (CR+); 1 on Española count; 2 in Six-Mile Canyon, near Socorro, 4/8 (PJ,Gene Beck).

CANYON WREN -- breeding: Nest with 3 fledglings at Apache Creek (western Grant County)5/18 (SWI).

BEWICK'S WREN -- breeding: Adults feeding young in cavity on Bitter Creek (Grant County) 5/5 and in Guadalupe Canyon 5/7-8 (SWi).

MARSH WREN -- Late were 2 pairs with both males singing at Mangas Springs 5/18 (RF) and 1 at Zuni 5/29 (DC).

AMERICAN DIPPER -- breeding: 19 adults and 2 nests counted along the Chama R. between El Vado and Abiquiu Reservoirs 5/12-14 (CR).

GOLDEN-CROMMED KINGLET -- 1 on Espanola count.

BLUE GRAY GNATCATCHER -- 1 carrying nest material near Aragon, along
Chama R., 5/13 (CR+)....6 on Farmington count, 1 at Water Canyon 5/3 (PJ).

<u>EASTERN BLUEBIRD</u> -- 2 at Watrous 5/12 (PSn, LH, Joyce Takamine) and 1 near Cliff 5/6 (RF, CR+) were westerly.

WESTERN BLUEBIRD -- 4 at Bell L. 3/25 (PJ, JS) were easterly.

SWAINSON'S THRUSH -- A male at Blackrock, Zuni, 5/29 (DC, JT).

HERMIT THRUSH -- 22 at Boone's Draw 5/6 (MH), a high migrant count.

VARIED THRUSH -- unueual: 1** that appeared in Carlsbad in January (Field Notes, Vol. 28, No.1,p. 9) lingered until 3/12 (Shirley Swayze+, photo SW). Fourth confirmed state record.

<u>SAGE THRASHER</u> -- 3 at Cochiti 4/8 (CR+); 5 at Bosquecito and 4 near Socorro 4/8 (PJ); 5D at Bosque NWR 4/6 (BO); 4+ at Caprock 3/23 and 4 or 5 at Bell L. 3/25 (PJ, JS).

BROWN THRASHER -- 1 remained at Socorro through 3/10 (PB). Singles at Percha Dam 3/3D (PJ), Glenwood (no date -- BMc), Las Cruces 3/11 (Gordon Ewing, fide EW) and Rattlesnake Springs 3/25 (PJ, JS).

CEDAR WAXWING -- 39 at Española 5/21 (CR+); 10 on Gila count.

PHAINOPEPLA -- 1 at Socorro 4/26 and 3 at Glanwood 5/12 (PJ); 1 at Walnut Canyon, Carlabad Caverna NP, 5/15 (fide PC).

EUROPEAN STARLING -- "One in my yard is very good at imitating a Pinyon Jay" (PSn)... (Starlinga are noted for their wide variety of chirps, squeaks, whistles and songs, and are accomplished mimics, adept at imitating not only other birds, but some mammals and mechanical sounds." -- Ross Tauber.

CASSIN'S SPARROW -- Up to 3 at Zuni 5/16-17 (OC). Early singing birds: 3 s. of Silver City 3/5 (DSMZ), 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 3/9 (PSt), and 1 near Rodeo 3/11 (RF).

CHIPPING SPARROW -- 2 in Santa Fe 3/25-26 (JH) were early.

BREWER'S SPARROW -- 1 singing near Bosque NWR 4/6 (LG).

FIELD SPARROW -- unusual: 1 ne. of Clayton 5/1 (WC).

BLACK-CHINNED SPARROW -- Singing birds s. of Mule Creek 3/1 (SWi), in the Sandia Mts. 3/24 (HS) and near Carrizozo 3/30 (SW). Also, a bird was gathering nest material in the Magdalena Mts. 4/8 (PC, Gene Beck).

VESPER SPARROW -- First arrival at Zuni 3/25 (DC).

LARK SPARROW -- 2 at Bosque NWR 3/11 (PB, RT) were very early.

BLACK=THROATED SPARROW -- breeding: Pair building nest in Embudito Canyon 4/14 (FSRS).

GRASSHOPPER SPARROW -- 3 singing at Las Vegas NWR 5/20 (CR).

<u>LE CONTE'S SPARROW -- unusual</u>: 1 singing at Waldron rest stop in a plains area near Caprock (JB1).

SWAMP SPARROW -- About 10 reports from usual areas along Pecos R. and Rio Grande. Others: 1 at Las Vegas NWR 4/30 and 5/5 (PI, CR); 1 near Gallup 4/29 (SI); 1 at Zuni 5/31 (DC); 2 in Cliff-Mangas Springs area 3/7-5/18 (RF+).

GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW -- Singles at Santa Fa 4/28 (CR) and Bosque NWR 3/30 and 4/6 (JB1).

HARRIS' SPARROW -- 1 near Socorro 4/22 (RF).

CHESTNUT-COLLARED LONGSPUR -- 6+ at Zuni 3/5 (DC).

BOBOLINK -- 1 near Gallup 5/12 (SI).

<u>GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE</u> -- Peripherals: 1 in the western Sandias foothills 4/26 (HS) and at Queen in the Guadalupe Mts. (SW). Also up to 6 at Zuni (DC), 30 near San Rafael 5/12 (DC), and small numbers in the Gila Vallay vicinity as early as 3/21 (RF+).

COMMON GRACKLE -- unusual: 1 at Glenwood 3/1 (JH)....5 on Farmington count, 1 or 2 at Zuni 3/1-5/3 (OC). The species continued to increase at Carlbad, with one carrying food there 5/22 (SW).

CASSIN'S FINCH - Generally sperae and limited to montane areas, though common in March and April in Waterfell Canyon in the Sandias (HS). Other notable records: several at Chama 5/19-31 (LHS), up to 8 in the Zuni Wtts. s. of Gallup 5/20 and 27 (DC. JT), and 6 at Alemogordo 3/2 (William Wells).

RED CROSSBILL -- breeding: 2 family groups in Zuni Mts. 5/20 (OC, JT)....
Only other reports: 2 pairs in the Jemez Mts. near La Cueva 4/20 (MS, F. Crisler), and 8 at Zuni 4/30 (DC).

LESSER GOLDFINCH -- Common at Zuni (OC), but almost unreported elsewhere.

AMERICAN GOLDFINCH -- Somewhat more widespread and more numerous than usual (v.o.).

EVENING GROSBEAK -- Common in Waterfall Canyon, Sandias, in March and April (HS), and 2 on west, side of this range 5/23 (PSt). GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW -- 1 adult at Santa Fe 5/1, 7 (JH).

HARRIS' SPARROW -- Only reports: 1 that wintered at Las Cruces was last seen 5/3 (CSa); 1 immature at Albuquerque 4/7 (LG).

McCOWN'S LONGSPUR -- 20 on 3/4 (OC) and about 100 on 3/25 at Green Chaparral turf farm near Moriarty.

CHESTNUT-COLLARED LONGSPUR -- 75 on 3/4 (OC) and 100 on 3/25 (LG) at Green Chaperral turf farm.

BOBOLINK -- unusual: 1 at Los Alamos 5/19 (Joyce Tajamine, fide 8L).

GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE -- A few pairs at Silver City throughout the period were carrying food late in May (DSMZ).

COMMON GRACKLE -- 3 pairs at McGaffey L. 5/26 were a local first. 25 on Española count, 3 at Bosque NWR 5/24 (RT, PB) and dozens at Truth or Consequences 4/24 (DM).

<u>BRONZED COMBIRD</u> -- Up to 6 in mid-May in Truth or Consequences, where the species has evidently become regular (DM). 1 at Las Cruces 5/2 (Gordon Ewing), 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/28 (SW), a male at Glenwood 5/18 (JH), a pair at Manges Springs 5/2 (RF), and 1 male at Post Office Canyon 5/8 (RS).

NORTHERN (BALTIMORE) ORIOLE -- unusual: 1 at Chama 5/12-15 (LHS).

SCOTT'S ORIOLE -- A male at Mangas Springs 4/6 (RF) was early.

CASSIN'S FINCH -- Well into May in southern and submontane areas from the Rio Grande valley westward -- 5 on Gila count, in Silver City to early May with high of 16 on 4/24 (DGMZ), and in Post Office Canyon through May (RS). At Socorro, peaked at over 50 before declining to the last 3 birds on 5/2 (PJ, JS).

PINE SISKIN -- A few into April or May in submontane areas, including 4 or 5 at Socorro 4/22 (PJ), 30 on Roswell count, 7 at Percha dam SP 5/14, and 40 at Silver City 4/5 (DSMZ) with the lest on 5/11.

EVENING GROSBEAK — Conspicuous into April or May in lowlands almost statewide. In the west, 20+ at Gallup 5/3 (SI), 3 at Zuni 4/27 (DC), 15+ at Glenwood in mid-May (JH), and 9 on Gila count. The 15 to 20 througout the period at Silver City (DSMZ) were the first wintering flock there in 33 years. Also notable were an estimated 1,200 in Santa Fe 5/5-6 (Will & Jan Risser), and 30 plus in Socorro 4/22 (PJ).
