FROM THE EDITORS:

The Aplomado Falcon had not been reported in New Mexico since Becember of 1978. Thus a possible sighting at Holloman Lake on May 25 demanded attention, though details were scant. This was reinforced in early summer by reports of an immature Aplomado on the nearby White Sands missile range.

A sampling of other interesting sightings, rare or out of place: Very rare Carolina Wren in the Sandias, Red-shouldered Hawk at Rattlesnake Springs, Purple Gallinule at Bosque NWR, and American Woodcock in Gatron Gounty. Common Black Hawk near Rio Grande Nature Center, Bridled Titmouse in the Sandias, and Clayton's first Blackburnian Warbler were far out of placa. Other scarcities, a Yellow-throated Warbler and a Le Conte's Sparrow. An oddity was a Common Ground Dove that wintered in Postoffica Canyon.

HAWKWATCH INTERNATIONAL'S 1991 spring count in the Sandias of northbound raptors extended from February 14 through May 10. Of the 3,359 raptors observed, 3,232 were identified as to species, as tabulated below. The total of 3,359 was the second greatest since the count was inaugurated in 1984.

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK -- unusual: 1 at Clayton feeder 3/16 and 3/31 (WC).

NORTHERN GOSHAWK -- Breeding: In Grant County, female on nest unoccupied for previous 399s, on 5/30, plus another possible Grant County nest.... 1 "resident" in Three Gun Canyon 3/24 (DS).

COMMON BLACK HAWK -- unusual: Singles near Albuquerque Nature Center 4/27 (BV) and 5/16 (CAH) were well north of usual range. Breeding: Numbers were possibly the highest ever in southwest N.M., with as many as 14 nesting pairs in San Francisco, Gila and Mimbres Valleys (RF).

HARRIS' HAWK -- 3 or 4 in the southwest (SWi)...,"Numbers in Eddy County appear to be stabilizing after a very sharp drop over the past several years" (SW).

RED-SHOULDERED HAWK -- unusual: An individual possibly of this species was at Rattlesnake Springs 5/7 (SW). Very few documented records in N.M.

BROAD-WINGED HAWK -- Singles at Percha Bam SP 4/27 (CB**, JB1) and at Rattlesnake Springs 5/2 (CB) and 5/7 (SW).

SWAINSON'S HAWK -- 1 in Las Uvas Valley 4/2 (PSt) was first of season. First at Carlabad 4/4 (SW) was later than usual....3 at Texes-N.M. border (US62/180) 4/20 (JH)....1 at Isleta exit of I-25 4/22 (JH, RWD).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK -- 1 at Post Office Canyon 4/10 was first record there (RS).... A pair at established nest site in Pine Canyon, Gray Ranch, and 1 at Pueblo Park campground, Catron County, 4/25 (SWi).

RED-TAILED HAWK -- Melanistic single at Caballo Dam 3/7 (JH) and at San Simon Cienega 4/5 (SWi)....l erythritic (reddish-brown) at Apache Creek 3/23 (JH).

FERRUGINOUS HAWK -- One at I-25 Levy exit in Mora County 5/1 (JH); 1 along Mula Creek Road, Grant County, 4/14 (RF) was late.

ROUGH-LEGGED HAWK -- 1 at Zuni 3/10 (DC).

MERLIN -- Only 3 reported, the latest at Bosque NWR 4/29 (PSn).

APLOMADO FALCON -- 1 possibly of this species reported with scant details at Holloman L. 5/25 (Tim McKimmie and P. Malchow). Species long absent from New Mexico. (see introductory note)

LESSER PRAIRIE CHICKEN -- 4 in the traditional Mescalero Sanda area west of Caprock 3/31 (JPa, BDP).

WILD TURKEY -- 2 in San Mateo Mts. 4/15 (TH); 54 at Bosque NWR 4/22 (CR); several near Queen, Guadalupe Mts., 4/20-22 (JH+); 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/9 (CR); 12 in the Animas Mts. 4/26 (SWi).

MONTEZUMA QUAIL -- Pair in San Mateo Mts. 4/15 (TH) and 2 others 4/10; absent from Mangas Springs (RF); 1 or 2 pairs in the Peloncillo and Animas Mts.(SWi) and in Gusdalupe Canyon in April (CB).

NORTHERN BOBNHITE -- 2 at Fort Summer 5/11, and 1 heard at Rattlesnake Springs 5/25-27 (JPa).

SCALED QUAIL -- 1 at Lag Vegas NWR 5/7 was possibly the first there since the 1970s (CR).

GAMBEL'S QUAIL -- 1 near Madrid 5/23 (CR), where few if any previous records exist.

VIRGINIA RAIL -- 8 at Bosque NWR 6/20 (DSm).

SORA — Up to 12 at Bosque NWR 4/29 (CR, PSn); β remained 5/20 (DSm)...singles at Rettlesnake Springs, where seldom agen, 4/14 and 4/29 (Sm, TJH, LH).

PURPLE GALLINULE -- unuqual: 1 adult at Boaque NWR 5/28 was well described (CR, SWi+). Very rare in N.M.

FORSTER'S TERN -- Reported from Las Vegas NWR, Holloman L. and the Rio Grande and Pecos valleys 4/26-5/20; maximum of 29 at Bosque NWR 5/20 (DSm).

LEAST TERN -- 5 adults returned to Bitter L. 5/10 (LM).

BLACK TERN -- 55+ at Las Vegas NWR 5/21, but only 17 next day (CR); 2 at Bosque NWR 5/18 (LG, fide JPa); 1 at Bitter L. 5/11 (JPa).

WHITE-WINGED DOVE -- Breeding: 1 on nest on N.M. State University campus 3/12 seemed early (GE)....A pair in Albuquerque north valley beginning 5/2 (BO) and 1 in central Albuquerque 5/20 (BV), plus other recent records, suggest the species is becoming regular there....105 on Gila count was high.

INCA DOVE -- Small numbers persist in Carlsbad (SW).

COMMON GROUND DOVE -- unusual: 1 all winter in Postoffice Canyon began calling on 3/14 and was last seen 4/13 (RS).

GREATER ROADRUNNER -- None seen in southwest during entire
period; only 2 found on spring migration count (RF).

GROOVE-BILLED ANI -- 1 near Garfield (details) 3/10 (Bryan Nygren).

 $\underline{\rm BARN}$ OWL -- 2 or 3 south of Clayton 3/15 and 5/14 (HS). Wes Cook of Clayton says it is rare in the Kiowa area.

<u>GREAT HORNED OWL -- Breeding:</u> 1 adult on nest near Cotton City 3/13, 4/5 (SWi).

WHISKERED SCREECH OWL -- 1 or 2 singing in Clanton Canyon 3/13, 14, and 2 calling together in the Peloncillo Mts. canyon n. of Clanton 4/5, 6. 22 (SWi).

NORTHERN PYGMY OWL -- 1 calling in Black Range n. of Kingston 4/25 (SWi).

ELF OWL -- unusual: 1 in Water Canyon was northeast of usual range 5/2 (JPa)....5 in Peloncillo Mts. canyon n. of Clanton 4/22 (SWi)....1 in Black Range s. of kingston 5/16 (SWi).

BURROWING OWL -- unusual: A record 5 on Espanola count... Breeding: "Numbers seem up this spring in Eddy County, with at least 6 nest sites located" (SW). SPOTTED OWL -- Breeding: 2 on nest ledge in Zuni area 5/11 (DC)....Singles in Magdalena Mts. 3/8 (JB1) and at Gray Ranch 4/24 (SWi).

LONG-EARED OWL -- Breeding: Pair at nest on Las Vegas NWR 4/17, single there 5/22, and owlets present 5/31 (CR)....1 near Zuni 4/20 and 1 adult with 1 to 3 immatures 5/18, 19, 30 (DC**).

SHORT-EARED OWL -- unusual: 1 n. of Moriarty 5/22; sketchy details &&.C. Parkes, RWD).

NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL -- unusual: 2 heard, 1 seen at Capulin Springs, Sandia Mts., 4/17 (JPa, AK, LG); 1 heard in upper Water Canyon 4/26 (CB, JB1).

LESSER NIGHTHAWK -- Early were 1 at La Joya SGR 4/27 (JPa, LG), 25 over Bosque NWR 4/28 and 1 s. of Williamsburg 5/23 (PSn).

COMMON NIGHTHAWK -- 2 at Santa Rosa 5/10 (JPa) were early. POORWILL -- 4 in Canyon n. of Clanton 4/22 (SWi).

BUFF-COLLARED NIGHTUAR -- Active search in Guadalupe Canyon on 2 nights did not result in any response from this species

WHIP-POOR-WILL -- 1 in Jemez Mts. 5/25 was northerly (Terry Johnson); his first record of the species in this area....
1 at Dripping Springs Natural Area 2/24 (KSk); 4 in Pelon-

<u>SWIFTS sp.</u> -- 4 to 5 Chaetura swifts at Guadalupe Canyon 4/19-20 (CB) may have been Chimney Swifts or Vaux's Swifts. Vaux's have not yet been verified in New Mexico.

cillo Mts. canyon n. of Clanton 4/22 (SWi).

CHIMNEY SWIFTS -- 2 in Roswell residential area 5/24 (JPa);
7 near Clayton 5/15 (HS).

WHITE-THROATED SWIFT -- Arrived in numbers in White Rock Canyon 4/4 and in Frijoles Canyon 4/11 (PSn); 3 at Sitting Bull Falls 4/20 (JH).

BROAD-BILLED HUMMINGBIRD -- Numerous in Guadalupe Canyon, with 4 or 5 males apparently establishing territories 4/19-21 (CB).

 $\frac{\text{VIOLET-CROWNED HUMMINGBIRD}}{\text{Canyon 4/19-21 (CB).}}$ -- Seemed absent from Guadalupe

MAGNIFICENT HUMMINGBIRD -- Female gathering spider web for nesting in McMillan Canyon 5/16 (RF).

LUCIFER HUMMINGBIRD -- A female returned "on schedule" to Post Office Canyon 3/25; a male came 3/26, with 10 to 12 present thereafter (RS).

ANNA'S HUMMINGBIRD -- 1 male in Peloncillo Mts. canyon n. of Clanton 4/23, with details (SWi).

COSTA'S HUMMINGBIRD -- 1 male in Peloncillo Mts. canyon
n. of Clanton 4/5, 6 (SWi).

BROAD-TAILED HUMMINGBIRD -- Singles near Pleasanton 3/13 and in Cottonwood Canyon, Peloncillo Mts., 3/15 (SWi).

RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD -- unusual: 1 adult male at Post Office Canyon 3/25; males present through 4/14 (RS).

NORTHERN BEARDLESS TYRANNULET -- 2 singing in Guadalupe Canyon 4/19-21 (CB) and 5/26 (CR+).

GREATER PEWEE -- 1 at Gray Ranch 4/24 (SWi); a pair at Mc-Millan campground 4/29 (H&RW), and singles singing there 5/5 (CR) and 5/6 (RF); 2 singing at Meadow Creek, Grant county, 5/24 (Hiram Parent, fide RF).

HAMMOND'S FLYCATCHER -- 1 singing in Sulphur Canyon, Sandias, 5/30 (HS), where not known to breed.

GRAY FLYCATCHER -- 1 singing in Guadalupe Mts. 4/21 (JH, RWD) was southerly.

<u>VERMILION FLYCATCHER</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: Female completing a nest 30 feet up in a cottonwood at San Simon Cienega 4/5 (SWi).

CASSIN'S KINGBIRD -- Earliest migrants: 2 to 5 in Santa Fe 4/22-25 (JH), 2+ at Queen 4/21 (JH+), 1 near Stanley 4/20 (CR), 1 at San Simon Cienega 4/5 (SWi), and 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/14 (SW+).

WESTERN KINGBIRD -- Singles at Jornada 3/26 (CSa), at Artesia 3/30 (T. J. Hines) and at Truth or Consequences 4/6 (DM) were early.

EASTERN KINGBIRD -- Singles on Española Count and at Albuquerque 4/29 (BO).

SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER -- Vagrant at Ribera 4/25 (CR).

NORTHERN ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW -- An early 2 at Percha SP 3/7 (JH).

BANK SWALLOW -- A colony of 100 to 200 burrows in Albuquerque in late May (JH) was noteworthy, as this species nests only locally in N.M. Planned development of the area was delayed until young had fledged.

CAVE SWALLOW -- Number at Carlsbad Caverns NP peaked at 3,200
4/26 to 5/12 (SW).

BARN SWALLOW -- 3 at Jornada 3/26 (CSa) were earliest reported. GRAY JAY -- 3+ on Tesuque Peak 5/28 (JH).

STELLER'S JAY -- unusual: 8 at Dripping Springs, where rare, on 4/26 (KSk).

<u>BLUE JAY</u> -- 20 at Fort Sumner 3/9 and 15 there 5/11 were the highest numbers reported for the Pecos Valley (JPa).

SCRUB JAY -- 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/9 (CR).

CLARK'S NUTCRACKER -- 1 in San Mateo Mts. 5/11 (TH).

AMERICAN CROW -- Breeding: A pair at a nest in Santa Fe 4/14 (JH).

CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN -- Breeding: A calling pair with 1 at nest near Stanley 4/20 (CR, LH).

 $\underline{\text{COMMON RAVEN}}$ -- 1 was chased by a Chihuahuan Raven on Carrizo Creek near Clayton 4/20 (HS).

BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE -- 35 on Española count was a high total.

MEXICAN CHICKADEE -- 2 at Aspen Spring, Animas Mts., 4/24 (SWi).

BRIDLED TITMOUSE -- unusual: 1 at Sandia Hawkwatch station 4/7 (Paul McConnell) was far northeast of range; no details available. Nearest confirmed reports in Magdalena Mts.

BROWN CREEPER -- 3 on Española count; several in Manzano Mts. 4/26 (PSn); 1 at upper Cherry Creek 5/6 (RF); 1 in Animas Mts. 4/24 (SWi).

CAROLINA WREN -- unusual: 1** at Waterfall Canyon, Sandia Mts., photographed 5/2 (HS) and 5/5 (JB1, CB) and heard singing from early April to early June (HS). Very rare in N.M.

 $\frac{\text{WINTER WREN}}{\text{NM }3/9}$ -- 1 (no details) on Falls Trail in Bandelier NM 3/9 (Bernard Foy).

BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER -- First reports 4/13 on the Zuni Reservation (DC) and at Cochiti L. (CR).

BLACK-TAILED GNATCATCHER -- 1, no details, at Dripping Springs 4/20 (KSk); another at Guadalupe Canyon 4/19-21 (CB).

EASTERN BLUEBIRD -- 1 or 2 from Santa Fe 3/18 in the north (JH) to Rattlesnake Springs 4/30 in the south (LH); at Zuni 3/9 (DC) and Cliff 5/4 (fide RF) in the west; a pair at San Miguel 4/25 (CR).

<u>WESTERN BLUEBIRD</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: Pair feeding 3 young in nest cavity on Española count.

 $\underline{\sf SAGE\ THRASHER}$ -- 1 at Eldorado 3/8 (SWi) was the year's first; 3 on Fence Lake BBS 5/26 (DC).

BENDIRE'S THRASHER -- 1 on Horse Springs BBS 5/25 (DC); 1 at Petroglyph NM 5/5 (HS); 2 w. of Los Lunas 4/6 (JPa); 2 sw. of Lordsburg 5/25 (CR+); 1 at Radium Springs 5/22 (PSn); 1 singing near Cotton City 3/13 (SWi).

CRISSAL THRASHER -- 1 at Petroglyph NM 5/5 (HS) was unusual there.

AMERICAN PIPIT=In lowlands statewide to mid-May, with "hundreds" at Percha SP 3/1 (PSt), 1 on Gray Ranch 4/24 (SWi), and 2 in the Magdalena Mts. 5/20 (JH).

CEDAR WAXWING -- Small numbers in north. Higher counts, 47 at Corrales 5/16 (CR), 65 on Gila count, 20 on NMSU campus 4/10 (GE), and 30 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/7 (SW).

PHAINOPEPLA -- 2 at Aguirre Springs SP 5/22 (PSn); 22 in N.M. portion of Guadalupe Canyon 5/26 (SWi).

NORTHERN SHRIKE - Only report, 2 near Raton 3/6 (PL, Shawneen Finnegan).

<u>LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE</u> -- <u>Breeding:</u> Adults feeding clutches of 3 or 4 fledglings at Jornada 5/21 (CSa).

<u>WHITE-EYED VIREO</u> -- 1 singing and seen well at Black Rock bosque 4/13-14 (DC).

BELL'S VIREO -- Only 2 on Gila count; 1 singing at Rattle-snake Springs 4/8 (CR) and 3+ there 5/25-27 (JPa); 1 at San Simon Cienega 4/19 (CB); 6+ in Guadalupe Canyon 4/19-21 (CB).

 $\frac{\rm GRAY\ VIREO}{\rm Sandias\ in\ May\ (HS)}$, continuing recent sightings there; 2 at Slaughter Canyon 5/27 (JPa).

SOLITARY VIREO -- Earliest arrivals, 1 at Dripping Springs 4/20 (KSk) and 5 in Guadalupe Mts. 4/21 (JH, RWD).

HUTTON'S VIREO -- 1 at mouth of Sacaton Creek in Grant County 3/27 (JH) and 5/21 (SWi), who also saw a pair gathering nest material in the Black Range n. of Kingston 5/5, 1 s. of there 5/16, and 2 in Animas Mts. 4/24.

WARBLING VIREO -- Earliest was 1 at Percha dam 4/28 (PSn+).

RED-EYED VIREO -- 1 singing at Clovis 5/18 (BO).

ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER -- Earliest, 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/9 and 4 in Villanueva area 4/25 (CR).

NASHVILLE WARBLER -- 1 at Black Rock 5/12 (DC).

 $\frac{\text{VIRGINIA'S WARBLER}}{\text{at Bosque NWR 4/22}}$ -- 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/9 and 2 at Bosque NWR 4/22 (CR).

LUCY'S WARBLER -- 1 or 2 at Bosque NWR 4/7 (LG, Carol Davis) and 4/29 (PSn, CR) were near the north edge of the species' range (breeding has been recorded n. to the Bernardo area); arrived at Mangas Springs 4/5 (RF); 66 on Gila count.

NORTHERN PARULA -- A female at Bitter L. 5/4 (CB).

YELLOW WARBLER -- 5 singing at San Simon Cienega 4/5 (SWi) indicated how early the species appears in the area; other arrivals, at Rattlesnake Springs 4/14 (SW) and Bosque NWR 4/22 (CR).

MAGNOLIA WARBLER -- 1 probably of this species near Clayton 5/16 (HS).

BLACK-THROATED BLUE WARBLER -- Female at Rattlesnake Springs
5/20 (CB).

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER -- Several males at Corrales 4/14 (BF); 2 on Gila count; a male in Animas Mts. 4/25 (SWi).

TOWNSEND'S WARBLER -- Generally rare in spring. A female at Water Canyon 5/10 (BF); 2 on Gila count; a male in Animas Mts. 4/25 (SWi).

HERMIT WARBLER -- unusual: 1 male w. of Melrose 5/3 (JB1, Anne Farley) was very far east; singles along upper Cherry Creek 5/6 and in Clanton Canyon 4/20 (CB, Charles Troup).

<u>BLACKBURNIAN WARBLER</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 male reported, and apparently photographed, east of Clayton 5/16 (Alvina Frye, fide WC). This would be the area's first record.

YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER -- Singing male with white lores at Rattlesnake Springs 5/25 (JPa) meticulously described. Scarce in New Mexico.

PALM WARBLER -- 1 seen well at San Mateo Peak 4/25 (TH).

BLACKPOLL WARBLER -- 1 probable male at Nambe 5/11 (Clint Scovil, JD), and another male the same day at Boone's Draw (JB1, CB).

AMERICAN REDSTART -- Female at Rattlesnake Springs 5/26 (JPa) was the only report.

PROTHONOTARY WARBLER -- Singing male with no tail seen on Española count.

WORM-EATING WARBLER-1 was singing at 'Rattlesnake Springs 5/12 (LG+ **); another seen s. of Melrose on Highway 88 5/3 (JB1, Anne Farley).

OVENBIRD -- 1 well seen at Rio Grande Nature Center 5/17 (JPa); another was west of Melrose 5/10 (JB1, CB).

NORTHERN WATERTHRUSH -- At least 1 at Tesuque on and off 5/1-24 (DS+); 1 at Zuni 5/11 (DC).

CONNECTICUT WARBLER -- 1 possibly of this species reported from Corrales Bosque 5/17 (TB). Details under review. There is one other sightrecord for New Mexico.

MacGILLIVRAY'S WARBLER -- 1 at Santa Fe 5/3 (JH) was the season's first report.

COMMON YELLOWTHROAT -- 3 at Bosque NWR 4/22 and 1 at Villanueva 4/25 (both CR) were the earliest sightings.

WILSON'S WARBLER -- Earliest, 3 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/9 (CR), and 1 at Dripping Springs 4/13 (KSk); 105 on Gila count.

RED-FACED WARBLER -- 1 in Waterfall Canyon 5/12 (GP, fide HS) was the first for the Sandias since they nested there in 1982. 2 singing in Water Canyon 4/27 (LG); present in San Mateo Mts. 4/15 (TH); 1 in Karr Canyon 5/25 (CSa).

PAINTED REDSTART -- 1 in San Mateo Mts. 4/4 (TH).

YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT -- 10 on Gila count.

OLIVE WARBLER -- 1 female at upper Cherry Creek in the Piños Altos Mts. 5/5 (CR+), and a pair there 5/6 (RF).

 $\underline{\text{SUMMER TANAGER}}$ -- A first-year male at Las Vegas NWR 5/22 (CR) was northerly.

WESTERN TANAGER -- At least 223 passed through on Española

NORTHERN CARDINAL -- 25 on Gila count was high; singles on Gray Ranch at Animas Creek 4/24 and Double Adobe Creek 4/26 (SWi); 1 or 2 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/1-5/29 (v. o.). Singles at Black R. valley 5/16 and at OW1 Spring, Eddy County, 4/24 (SW).

ROSE-BREASTED GROSBEAK -- Four singles: female at Las Vegas NWR 5/7 (CR); males at Bosque NWR 5/18 (LG, JPa) and Truth or Consequences 5/23 (DM), and a female at Rattlesnake Springs 5/26 (JPa).

BLUE GROSBEAK -- unusual: 1 male at 7,250 feet at Los Alamos 5/16 (Barbara Peaslee, fide BL).

INDIGO BUNTING -- 1 male at U. of New Mexico golf course
5/16 (JPa); adult male at Silver City 5/7-9 (MZ); 1 at La Luz

VARIED BUNTING -- Male in Guadalupe Canyon 3/26 (CR+).

CANYON TOWHEE -- 2 all winter at Los Alamos until 3/19 (PSn) were higher than usual at 7,600 feet.

ABERT'S TOWHEE -- Only 1 on Gila count, but 3 pairs at San Simon Cienega 4/5 (SWi).

CASSIN'S SPARROW -- Singing birds: hundreds s. of Clayton 5/16 (HS); singles near Truth or Consequences 4/29 (SWi), Percha Dam 4/27 (JPa, LG), Jornada 5/8 (CSa), Brantley L. 4/30 (LH), and Hope 4/22 (JH, RWD).

<u>RUFOUS-CROWNED SPARROW</u> -- 1 near Clayton 4/6 (WC) at a new area; previously only at Clayton L. and Paradise Canyon.

AMERICAN TREE SPARROW -- 25 at Maxwell NWR 3/6 (PL) and 1 at Fort Sumner 3/9 (JPa).

FIELD SPARROW -- Only report, 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/1 (JPa, BPa).

 $\underline{\rm BLACK-CHINNED}$ SPARROW -- 1 near Madrid 5/23 (CR) was northerly and a local first.

GRASSHOPPER SPARROW -- Common on Kiowa National Grasslands, with 6 at Unit 33 on 5/15 (HS); 2 at Gray Ranch headquarters 5/27 (CR+).

<u>LE CONTE'S SPARROW</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 probable vagrant at Taos 5/8 (CR) was late.

SONG SPARROW -- Breeding: 2 carrying nest material at Las Vegas NWR 4/17 (CR) and 2+ singing there 4/30 (JH+); first record of breeding there.

<u>SWAMP SPARROW</u> -- <u>unusual</u>: 1 at Glenwood, where scarce, 3/25 (JH); singles at Bosque NWR 4/7 (LG) and 4/27 (LG, JPa), and about 25 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/1 (JPa, BPa).

GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW -- Only report, 1 all winter at Post Office Canyon; last seen 5/5 (RS).

<u>HARRIS' SPARROW</u> -- Singles at Bitter L. 5/17-18 (SB+), Bosque NWR \(\frac{15}{5}/4-5 \) (JPa, BV), and Las Cruces 5/3 (CSa).

McCOWN'S LONGSPUR -- Hundreds at Moriarty and Los Lunas sod farms in March (v. o.); latest, 1 on 4/21 (JPa).

<u>LAPLAND LONGSPUR</u> -- 1 on 3/2 and 2 on 3/16 at Los Lunas sod farm (JPa).

EASTERN MEADOWLARK -- 1 at Zuni 4/20 (DC) and 2 near Fence L. 5/26 (DC). A fair number singing s. of Clayton 5/14-17 (HS) well north of the previously reported N.M. range.

GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE -- Increasing in irrigated areas of Union
County (fide WC).

 $\underline{\text{COMMON GRACKLE}}$ -- $\underline{\text{Breeding}}$: 9 nests with young at Albuquerque 5/31 (BO).

 $\frac{\text{BRONZED COWBIRD}}{\text{(DM), at Mangas}} - \text{Single males at Truth or Consequences 5/6} \\ \text{(DM), at Mangas} \text{ Springs 5/15 (RF) and Las Cruces 5/18 (GE).}$

HOODED ORIOLE -- Male at Mangas Springs 4/1 (RF).

NORTHERN ORIOLE -- First males seen: 1 at Truth or Consequences 4/6 (DM), 3 at Mangas Springs 4/10 (RF), 3 at Las Cruces 4/21 (CSa), and 1 at Bosque NWR 4/22 (CR).

SCOTT'S ORIOLE -- Single males at Petroglyph NM 5/11 (HS), Mangas Springs 4/11 (RF), Jornada 4/9 (CSa), and Dripping Springs 4/8 (KSk).

ROSY FINCH (black) -- 23 at Red R. cross-country ski area 3/2 (CB, JB1).

PURPLE FINCH -- unusual: 1 or 2 males at Glenwood 3/25 (JH)
may have wintered there.

RED CROSSBILL -- A few in Jemez, Sangre de Cristo and Sandia ranges (v. o.); 20 in Manzano Mts. 4/26 (CR, PSn), and several in the San Mateo Mts. 4/30 and 5/7 (TH).

<u>PINE SISKIN</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: An adult feeding a recently fledged young near Doc Long Picnic Area, Sandia Mts., 5/18 (HS).

LAWRENCE'S GOLDFINCH -- unusual: At least 1 female at Pancho Villa SP 4/22 (CB, Charles Troup).

 $\underline{\text{AMERICAN GOLDFINCH}}$ -- 10 pairs in full breeding plumage at Glenwood fish hatchery 4/24 (RF).

EVENING GROSBEAK -- Widespread in low to moderate numbers in and near montane areas. Noteworthy were 25 at Zuni 4/20 (DC), 117 in Ribera-Villanueva area 4/25 (CR), and 6 at Pleasanton 3/28 (JH).
