#### SPRING 1992 HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE EDITORS:

"Winter's mild, moist conditions continued through spring. Most areas experienced above-normal temperatures and some received record precipitation. These conditions yielded high water levels in most streams and lakes and abundant production of cover and wild food. This served to disperse birds more thinly over the countryside. Migration was generally not spectacular, although concerted efforts at several 'hot spots' provided a nice sprinkling of rarities." (SOW).

The Yellow-billed Loon remained at least till March 20. A Black-shouldered Kite was in the Animas Valley and two Broad-winged Hawks were at Rattlesnake Springs. There is an increasing number of reports of Peregrine Falcons. On the Gray Ranch was a hybrid Scaled x Gambel's Quail.

The first verified Mew Gull at Conchas Lake remained into mid-March. Well out of range were two Least Terns on the Jicarilla Reservation.

Boreal Owls expanded their range southward to near Santa Fe. A Northern Saw-whet Owl was heard in the Manzano Mts. Chimney Swifts were unusual at Las Vegas and Carlsbad and a Costa's Hummingbird appeared at Mangas Springs.

American Crows are now nesting regularly in the Rio Grande bosque; both Chihuahuan and Common Ravens have been found nesting in grassland habitats east and west of Albuquerque, in some cases within several miles of each other.

Carolina Wrens continue to appear in the Sandia Mts., another was reported at Socorro. Less than five verified reports of Wood Thrushes have been recorded for N.M., two more unverified reports were received this spring.

Large numbers of Cedar Waxwings were present in Eddy County. A Phainopepla at Alameda was very far north; normal extremes occur around Bernardo, 60 miles to the south.

Seven species of vireos were reported, including new distributional information for Gray and Hutton's vireos.

An impressive 31 warbler species were seen, including a number of eastern rarities as Magnolia, Blackburnian, and Yellow-throated. Hermit and Grace's warblers were reported from the eastern plains, well east of their normal range. Warbler migration at Silver City was "really sick." (RAF) Botteri's Sparrows were found in the Hachita Valley.

#### COMMENTS ON THE RARE BIRD ALERT:

There is a disturbing trend developing of people reporting birds to the Rare Bird Alert, but not following up by sending in reports with details. As is known, an RBA is merely meant as a vehicle to let people know what's around so they can go see and verify it. By nature, information on Rare Bird Alerts is often fragmentary, with inexact dates and names, and occasionally unsubstantiated. Details of unusual sightings should be submitted by observers at all times, whether or not they have called in the records to the Rare Bird Alert. It is impossible for the editors to evaluate the accuracy of reports on the Rare Bird Alert unless written reports are also submitted. (William Howe)

OSPREY -- Migrants were scattered through N.M. (v.o.); 4 to 7 were on 3 lakes on the Jicarilla IR 4/8-25 (DWS); 1 was early at L. Roberts 3/31 (EUL); 1 was at Loving on 4/24 (SOW);...late singles were at Clayton L. 5/4 (fide WEC), near Vadito 5/30 (JJP, LAG), and on the Jornada 5/23 (CIS).

<u>BLACK-SHOULDERED KITE</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 in the Animas Valley 3/16,29 (AMC+), the state's first report since 1989.

MISSISSIPPI KITE -- A pair at Mesilla 5/9 (HHH, fide CIS); 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/15 (JJP, BJP).

BALD EAGLE -- Last seen at Clayton L. 3/9 (WEC); 1 adult at the Laguna Huerfana 3/13 (PRS, ECE); while 3 were 10 miles n. of Aragon 3/2 (BAM,DAM).

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK -- More than usual at feeders in Clayton in March (WEC); a bit late was 1 near the St. Peter's Dome Road in the Jemez Mts., Santa Fe NF, 5/29 (WBL).

NORTHERN GOSHAWK -- 1 flying over Los Alamos on 4/8 (JYT); 1 in the Animas Mts. 5/23 (JJP, LAG, NCM) was a first local report.

COMMON BLACK-HAWK -- Unusual: An immature was in the s. Animas Mts. 5/5 (AMC\*, NCM);....Breeding: 10 active nests were along the Gila River (nest record cards) including 1 at Mangas Springs that "may be the first ever" (RAF);....3 on the Gila River between Red Rock and Virden 4/18 (CIS).

HARRIS' HAWK -- Breeding: The population suffered a setback when a Hidalgo Co. nest with 2 chicks was found empty 4/21 (RAF, EUL);....northerly was 1 below Red Rock 4/18 (CIS); none were found in their usual southwest locations during May (EUL); populations in the southeast, however, seem to be bouncing back from earlier serious declines (STW).

BROAD-WINGED HAWK -- Unusual: 1 adult and 1 immmature at
Rattlesnake Springs 4/25-26 (CHB, JJP\*, LAG\*\*, details
good). The immature seen 5/3 (LAG\*\*); it's rare in N.M.

<u>SWAINSON'S HAWK</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: a nest with incubating adult near Willard 5/28, 3 downy chicks visible on 6/17 (HRS);... flock of 9, with 1 dark phase, in Curry Co. 4/4 (CHR, NIS).

ZONE-TAILED HAWK -- Breeding: 1 nest in the San Francisco Mts. 4/30, an active nest 4/23 in the Capitan Mts. east of the usual range (both SOW); and 1 near Cliff (RAF);.....3 on the lower Gila River 4/18 (CIS); 2 on 4/1-5 at the San Simon Cienega (BJH, CHP, fide RWD); 1 adult in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (JJP, LAG, AMC, NCM).

 $\underline{\text{FERRUGINOUS HAWK}}$  --  $\underline{\text{Breeding}};$  5 nests in the Clayton vicinity, one occupied by 1 dark morph and 1 light morph adults (fide WEC).

PRAIRIE FALCON -- 1 near Willard 3/15 (JPH, RWD); 2 in the Animas Mts. 3/6, 1 on 3/24 and 5/7 (AMC, NCM).

<u>PEREGRINE FALCON</u> -- Increasing numbers of individuals reported from scattered locations around the state (v.o.)

<u>CHUKAR</u> -- 1 at the Corrales bosque 3/1 (PRS+) was obviously an escape from somewhere.

RING-NECKED PHEASANT -- 51 on the Bosque NWR BBS 5/31 (PAB+).

<u>LESSER PRAIRIE-CHICKEN</u> -- A lek with 8 to 12 males was seen 4/18 on the Mescalero Sands near Caprock, Chaves Co. (PRS+)

<u>WILD TURKEY</u> -- Heard at Water Canyon 4/23 (ALS+); 4 or 5 were at Rattlesnake Springs in April and May (STW+). The <u>Gould's</u> subspecies reported from several Animas Mts. locations 5/5-6 (AMC, NCM) and 5/23-24 (JJP, LAG, AMC+).

Count 5/9 (RAF+, location not given); 1 at Silver City 4/26-27 (EUL); 1 at Red Rock on 5/1 had been there since October (RAF); 1 at Culberson Camp, Animas Mts., 5/20-22 (AMC, NCM); 2 on Mesilla BBS 5/28 (DDL); 3 at Carlsbad 5/11,13 (JJP) and "still present in small numbers" 5/31 (JWH, fide STW).

ELF OWL -- 2 heard in the Animas Mts. 4/30 (AMC, NCM).

BURROWING OWL -- Unusual: 3 two miles w. of Field on N.M. Hwy. 288 in Curry Co. 4/4 (CHR, NIS).

<u>SPOTTED OWL</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: 4 heard in the Animas Mts. (3 pair on territories possibly) 5/23-24 (JJP, AMC, NCM, LAG).

LONG-EARED OWL -- 1 at Ben Slaughter Spring 3/21. "The species is rarely recorded in Eddy Co." (STW).

BOREAL OWL -- Unusual: singles calling at 2 sites in n. Rio Arriba Co. 3/12, another calling near Santa Fe 3/13, eight miles south of the previous southernmost record (DWS).

NORTHERN SAW-WHET OWL -- Unusual: rare was 1 heard in the Manzano Mts. 5/19 (HRS); 3 were along the south fork of the Jemez River, Sandoval Co. 3/16 (DWS).

LESSER NIGHTHAWK -- First of spring in Carlsbad 4/13 (STW).

<u>COMMON POORWILL</u> -- Early individuals calling in the Animas Valley 3/15 (AMC, NCM); singles were banded in Carlsbad 4/15 and at Ben Slaughter Spring, Eddy Co., 4/17 (STW).

<u>WHIP-POOR-WILL</u> -- Several in the Gallinas Mts. near Corona northeast of its usual range 5/14 and 6/4 (HRS); 1 to 10 heard in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (JJP, AMC, NCM, LAG).

CHIMNEY SWIFT -- Unusual: singles at Las Vegas 5/24 (CHR\*)
and Carlsbad 5/11 (JJP, BJP).

WHITE-THROATED SWIFT -- Early birds in Frijoles Canyon, Bandelier NM, 4/2 (PRS); 4 were at Carlsbad Caverns NP 5/17 -- "where not usually found at that time of year" (STW, TJH). MAGNIFICENT HUMMINGBIRD -- 1 female in the Pinos Altos Mts. 5/26 (EUL) and 5/31 (BRZ), where more frequently reported; also 1 there at Cherry Creek CG 5/31 (BRZ); 3 to 8 in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

<u>LUCIFER HUMMINGBIRD</u> -- Returned to Post Office Canyon in the Peloncillo Mts. 4/4, with up to 4 pairs present by the end of the season (RTS).

RED-HEADED WOODPECKER -- Unusual: 1 still present at
Mesilla Dam on 3/7 (CIS).

<u>YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER -- Unusual</u>: wintering males still at Conchas L. 3/15 and Bosque NWR 3/7 (JJP, LAG\*, ADK).

<u>WILLIAMSON'S SAPSUCKER</u> -- A probable female at Santa Fe 3/14 (JPH) was early.

<u>DOWNY WOODPECKER</u> -- Peripheral areas were 1 at Conchas L. 3/14 (CHR); a male at McMillan CG, Pinos Altos Mts. on 5/2 (RAF) "where they have nested the past few years;" 1 in the Burro Mts. 4/8 (RAF); and a female near the Iron Creek CG, in the Black Range, 5/30 (BRZ).

NORTHERN FLICKER -- Single Yellow-shafted forms were reported at Santa Fe 3/8 (LCH\*) and 3/9 (STW, JIW).

NORTHERN BEARDLESS-TYRANNULET -- 1 singing in the Animas Mts. on the Gray Ranch on 5/13 (AMC, NCM).

OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER -- Early migrants were singles at Bosque NWR 5/5 (PAS, RLT), Mangas Springs 5/6 (RAF), in the Animas Mts. 5/4 (AMC, NCM). Late migrants were singles at Albuquerque 5/25 (DVM), Sevilleta NWR 5/28 (PAB, RLT), at Mangas Springs 5/26 (RAF), 2 in the Organ Mts. 5/30 (CHB).

GREATER PEWEE -- 2 were in the Pinos Altos Mts. 5/26 (EUL) and 5/31 (BRZ); while 2 to 8 were singing in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

WESTERN WOOD-PEWEE -- 3 at Mesilla 3/7 were early (CIS).

WILLOW FLYCATCHER -- Breeding: a pair was on the Gila River n. of Gila 5/6 (SPM, fide RAF);...singles were at Zuni 5/9, 24 and 26 (DJC).

<u>LEAST FLYCATCHER</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 2 highly probable were in Boone's Draw on 5/12 (JJP\*, BJP).

<u>GRAY FLYCATCHER</u> -- Singing birds where seldom reported: 8 in the San Francisco Mts. n. of Reserve 4/29 (SOW), 1 in Water Canyon 5/16 (DVM); 2 in the Capitan Mts. 4/26 (SOW).

EASTERN PHOEBE -- Unusual: 2 at Percha Dam SP 3/18 were
west of their range (LAG\*, TYH).

<u>DUSKY-CAPPED FLYCATCHER</u> -- 1 was in the Animas Mts. 5/6 (AMC, NCM).

<u>ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHER</u> -- Early was 1 in the Playas Valley 3/12 (AMC, NCM).

BROWN-CRESTED FLYCATCHER -- 1 was early at the San Simon Cienega 4/1-5 (RWD\*\*\*); 1 near Cliff 5/15 (SOW) .

<u>CASSIN'S KINGBIRD</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: Early fledglings were in the Playas Valley on 5/8 (AMC, NRM);....early was 1 at Santa Fe 4/17 (JPH), and 1 in the Animas Valley 3/25 (AMC, NCM).

EASTERN KINGBIRD -- 8 at the Maxwell NWR 5/28 (CHR, LAG).

 $\underline{SCISSOR-TAILED\ FLYCATCHER}$  -- 1 at Clayton 4/8 (WEC), north of its range; 1 at San Antonio 5/25 (SOW) was westerly.

PURPLE MARTIN -- Reports where it is infrequently seen were
2 near Fence L. 5/31 BBS (DJC); 3 males and 5 females in
the Animas Mts. 5/24 (NMC, JJP, LAG\*).

NORTHERN ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW -- 1 in the Animas Valley on 3/14 (AMC, NCM), and 2 or 3 at Mesilla 3/1 (TMG, fide CIS) were early.

<u>CAVE SWALLOW</u> -- A peak of 3000 was at Carlsbad Caverns NP 4/14 to 5/1, a number typical of recent years (STW).

BARN SWALLOW -- 1 in the Animas Valley 3/13 (AMC, NCM).

GRAY JAY -- 1 near Tres Ritos 3/17 (CHR).

STELLER'S JAY -- Breeding: 1 on a nest in Frijoles Canyon, Bandelier NM, 4/29 (MGC, fide RBA).

<u>BLUE JAY</u> -- 1 near Montezuma 4/3 (CHR), 3 at the Corrales bosque 3/15 and 4/9 (TYB) and 1 at Percha Dam SP 4/5 (BRV) were west of its range; while farther east numbers were increasing at Carlsbad (STW) and Hobbs (CAL, RRR).

<u>GRAY-BREASTED JAY</u> -- A small flock was at Pueblo Park, sw. of Reserve, 3/25 (SOW), north of its normal range.

PINYON JAY -- Breeding: 2 juveniles were calling at Santa Fe 5/12,25 (JPH);...in the north small flocks of up to 35 were west to Zuni and south to Fence L., Horse Springs (DJC), and Magdalena (DVM).

AMERICAN CROW -- Breeding: now commonly nesting in the Rio Grande bosque at Albuquerque (BIW\*); 2 pairs were nesting at the Gila Bird Habitat and Nature Conservancy areas in Grant Co. with a pair nesting at Mangas Springs (RAF);.... peripheral birds were 1 at Conchas L. 3/14 (CHR); Edgewood in Santa Fe Co. 3/16 and Cedarvale, Torrance Co., on 3/15 (JPH, RWD); and Bear Canyon Dam 3/25,31 (EUL).

CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN -- Breeding: a nest was on a power pole s. of the Petroglyph NM, identified by vocalization of adult (HRS, BIW\*); nest much smaller than that of Common Raven and nests of both species are found within several miles of each other in grassland habitat, typically on poles or towers well away from the mountains in Bernalillo Co.; active nest also found ne. of Stanley, Santa Fe Co., in grassland habitat where Common Ravens nest as well (BIW).

<u>COMMON RAVEN</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: (see above), also in grassland habitat was another nest with 2 young close to fledging near Willard in a cottonwood tree (HRS), which was adjacent to a Swainson's Hawk nest in another cottonwood.

<u>BLACK-CAPPED CHICKADEE</u> -- 5 on the Rio Pueblo e. of Vadito 5/30 (JJP, LAG); 1 at La Cueva, Mora Co., 5/15 (CHR); 3 at Chacon, Mora Co., 5/15, 1 was excavating a cavity (CHR).

MEXICAN CHICKADEE -- 1 in the Animas Mts. 3/6 (AMC), up to 7 pairs were located 5/23-24 to 6/6 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

BRIDLED TITMOUSE -- 14 on the Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+).

<u>BUSHTIT</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: a nest in the laying stage was found at the RGNC 5/9 (HRS), rare breeder in the lowlands;.... present all spring in Ridgecrest area, Albuquerque (ALS).

<u>RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH</u> -- 1 in Santa Fe 3/3 (LCH); 1 in Trujillo Canyon 5/2 (PRS); a female or immature male at Percha Dam SP 5/6 (DDL, RYM); present in Water Canyon 4/23 (ALS+); 1 to 2 in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC, NCM+).

WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCH -- 1 at Bosque NWR 5/21 (RLT, PAB);
1 in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

PYGMY NUTHATCH -- 3 at Chacon, Mora Co., 5/15 (CHR).

BROWN CREEPER -- 2 at Conchas L. 3/14 (CHR); 1 in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC, NCM, LAG, JJP).

<u>CACTUS WREN</u> -- 6 in the La Manga Creek basin 5/31 where first found in February with 1 on 3/14; these sites are 30 miles s. of Sabinoso; first sighted here in 1989 (CHR).

<u>CAROLINA WREN</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 present at Cedar Crest since October was singing 3/14 (JJP\*) and 3/17 (LAG\*, TYH); another singing at Sandia Park 5/11-18 (PET\*), about 3 to 4 miles away, was possibly the same bird; a third singing bird was reported at Socorro on 4/7 (PAB\*).

HOUSE WREN -- Breeding: 1 at a nest cavity in the Animas
Mts. 5/24 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

<u>SEDGE WREN</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 heard at Bosque NWR on 3/6 (JJP) had wintered, 1 to 2 seen and heard there 3/8 (LAG\*, TYH).

<u>RUBY-CROWNED KINGLET</u> -- 1 at Deer Creek, Animas Mts., 5/13 was the first since 4/13 and late (AMC, NCM).

<u>BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER</u> -- Singles at the Pecos Monastary L. 5/7 (CHR+) and Bernardo 4/11 (LAG, JJP, fide RBA) were the only ones reported.

EASTERN BLUEBIRD -- Breeding: a pair with 2 fledglings was near Cliff 5/9 (RAF\*\*); a nest at Rattlesnake Springs in early April was the third Eddy Co. record and the first since 1981. A pair of adults flying back and forth to a nest cavity with food were later at the nest on 4/16 (TJH, STW);...also seen at Clayton (WEC); a male was singing at Watrous 5/28 (CHR, LAG); a female at Conchas L. 3/13 (PRS); 1 to 2 males e. of the lake 4/4,20 (CHR\*); and in Hobbs 3/28 (CAL, RRR).

<u>WESTERN BLUEBIRD</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: 4 young fledged at Fort Bayard (EUL) near the southern edge of its range;...8 in the Animas Mts. 5/24 (AMC+, NCM) where casual in summer.

TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE -- Singles at Bosque NWR 4/4,11 (JJP, LAG), 4/9 (RLT, PAB), and 4/19 (BRV) were late dates.

<u>WOOD THRUSH</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 probable reported at Pleasanton 4/21 by an observer familiar with them in Maine and has Hermit Thrushes in her yard for comparison (Marietta Summer, fide BAM). Another without details was reported near Clayton 5/9-10 (AVF, GIC, WEC). Casual in N.M. with less than five verified reports.

GRAY CATBIRD -- 1 singing near Vadito 5/30 (JJP, LAG); 1 at the San Juan Pueblo 5/24 and 1 Bandelier NM 5/20 (PRS); 1 singing near Albuquerque 5/17 (JJP, BJP) and 5/29 (DDL+); 2 were 8 miles w. of Melrose 5/3 (CHB); 1 singing at Bosque NWR 5/5 (PAS, RLT) (not 18 as stated in American Birds).

<u>SAGE THRASHER</u> -- 1 at Variadero 4/18 (CHR); 7 on the Fence L. BBS 5/31 (DJC); 5+ at the Mescalero Sands near Roswell 3/16 (JPH); 2 or 3 on the Gray Ranch 3/22 (AMC, NCM).

BROWN THRASHER -- Unusual: 1 singing at Rattlesnake Springs
4/25-26 (JJP, LAG, CHB) was still there 5/9 (STW).

<u>BENDIRE'S THRASHER</u> -- 7 were near the Very Large Array Rest Stop 3/26 and 2 s. of Hatchet Gap, Playas Valley, 5/27 (SOW); with 1 near Cotton City 4/21 (EUL).

CURVE-BILLED THRASHER -- 1 in Santa Fe 4/13-14 and 4/29 to 5/1 (JPH); 3 in the Conchas L. area 5/31 (CHR).

CRISSAL THRASHER -- Breeding: a nest located at Placitas in April (BDM);....2 to 3 at the Encino Canyon mouth, Manzano Mts. w. foothills, 4/14 in an area where unreported before (HRS); 1 at La Joya SGR 3/8 (TYB, fide RBA).

AMERICAN PIPIT -- 150 Storrie L. SP 4/22 (JPH, RWD); 46 Bosque NWR 4/9 (RLT, PAB); 100+ at Mangas Springs 3/3 is the largest flock RAF has seen there; late were singles on Sandia Crest 5/31 (PAS) and Rattlesnake Springs 5/13 (JJP).

CEDAR WAXWING -- 2 near Conchas L. 5/8 (CHR) with large numbers in the south: 43 at Tyrone 3/25 (EUL); 22 in the Animas Valley 5/12 (AMC, NCM); 50 NMSU campus, Las Cruces, 3/6 to 4/4 (CIS); the largest numbers ever for Eddy Co. included 330 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/9 (STW, TJH) and 100 5/17 (STW); 30 to 40 at Black River Village 5/18-20 (STW); present in Hobbs into mid-April (CAL).

PHAINOPEPLA -- 1 male at Alameda 3/26-28 (KBO) was far north; 1 male and 2 females at Luis Lopez 3/3 (LAG\*, TYH); 2 to 3 pairs at Bill Evans L. in May (RAF); 8 at Percha Dam SP 4/29 (CHB, JAB, fide RBA); 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/13 (JJP) and 5/21 (STW).

LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE -- 8 in the Conchas L. area 3/14 (CHR).

<u>BELL'S VIREO</u> -- 1 was singing at Percha Dam SP 5/6 (DDL, RYM); 6+ Red Rock to Virden 4/18 (CIS); 7 on the Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+); "numbers were higher this year" at Rattlesnake Springs, where it arrived 5/9 (STW).

GRAY VIREO -- 1 in Mullen Canyon, Zuni Mts. 5/12 (DJC); 5 singing in Soledad Canyon, Organ Mts. on Fort Bliss, 5/23-29 (CHB); 1 singing in the s. Guadalupe Mts. 4/24 (SOW); 2 heard in Slaughter Canyon, Eddy Co., 5/14 (JJP, BJP).

SOLITARY VIREO -- Breeding: noted at higher elevations on the Gray Ranch (AMC, NCM);....arrival dates were 4/27 at Los Alamos (PRS), 4/26 at Albuquerque (ALS), 4/23 at Water Canyon (ALS+), and 4/16 near Silver City (EUL), with 16 on the Española Count 5/10 (fide WBL).

YELLOW-THROATED VIREO -- Unusual: 1 singing at Rattlesnake Springs 5/15 (JJP\*) was supported by good details. HUTTON'S VIREO -- Breeding: found 5/28-29 in the Organ Mts. in Beasley Canyon (breeding strongly suspected) and in North Canyon where 3 adults were present, including 1 feeding a fledgling or female (CHB);....singles were at Sacaton Creek 3/18, in the Mogollon Mts. near Pleasanton 3/23, and at Pueblo Park 3/25 (SOW); on the Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+); at NMSU, Las Cruces, 3/26 (CIS); while 3 or 4 were in the Animas Mts 5/6 (AMC, NCM) and 2 5/23-24 (JJP+); 1 in the s. Guadalupe Mts. 4/25 (SOW) was far to the east.

<u>WARBLING VIREO</u> -- 3 were at the Bandelier NM 5/1 (CHR+); 3 in the Animas Mts. 5/24 (AMC, NCM, JJP, LAG).

RED-EYED VIREO -- 1 was singing at Percha Dam 5/30 (BRZ\*\*).

TENNESSEE WARBLER -- 1 was near Santa Clara Pueblo on 5/10 (API, JYT+, fide WBL); 1 Rio Rancho 5/6 (TYB, fide RBA, no details); 1 was 8 miles w. of Melrose 5/3 (CHB, RYM); 1 at Percha Dam SP 5/16 (EGW+, fide RBA, no details).

NASHVILLE WARBLER -- 1 singing at the RGNC 5/2 (DVM); 1 at Albuquerque 5/5 (ALS); 1 in Boone's Draw 5/2,12 (JJP, BJP); 1 at Percha Dam SP 4/17 (CHB); 3 at Rattlesnake Springs on 4/25-26 (JJP, LAG, CHB).

<u>VIRGINIA'S WARBLER</u> -- 2 to 3 in the Animas Valley 3/24 (AMC, NCM) were early; 2 at Percha Dam SP 4/11 (HHH+, fide CIS); 1 from Red Rock to Virden 4/17 (CIS); 1 was at Boone's Draw 5/2 (JJP, LAG, AJK) on the eastern fringe of its range.

<u>LUCY'S WARBLER</u> -- 4 were singing at Percha Dam SP 4/5 (BRV); "many" were present from Red Rock to Virden 4/17 (CIS); 2+ were singing at the San Simon Cienega 3/21 (SOW); 1 s. of Hatchet Gap, in the Playas Valley, on 5/27 (SOW) was in mesquite scrub far from trees.

NORTHERN PARULA -- Unusual: 1 probably this species was in Water Canyon 4/17 (BDM\*, Pauline England).

YELLOW WARBLER -- Arrives much earlier in the southwest corner of the state than elsewhere: 3 from Red Rock to Virden 4/17 (CIS) and 3/25 on the Gray Ranch (AMC, NCM); the next report came from Española on 5/1 (CHR+). 1 was at Lordsburg 5/5 (EUL).

<u>CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER --Unusual</u>: 1 male was in Boone's Draw 5/3 (CHB, RYM, JAB\*\*); 1 was well described from the Old Refuge, Mesilla, on the early date of 3/25 (EGW\*, LHS).

MAGNOLIA WARBLER -- Unusual: a male at Rattlesnake Springs 5/14 (JJP\*, BJP) was well described.

<u>YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: <u>Audubon's</u> were reported breeding in the Animas Mts.(AMC, NCM);....reports of <u>Myrtle's</u> were scattered from 3/7 to 5/5 (v.o.).

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER -- First detected 4/12 in Water Canyon (CHB, fide RBA) and 4/14 in the Animas Mts. (fide AMC); 1 at Boone's Draw 4/18 (JJP, LAG) was easterly.

TOWNSEND'S WARBLER -- 1 at Percha Dam SP 4/17 (CHB, fide RBA) and 1 at Water Canyon 5/14 (DVM) were the only spring reports; 4 to 5 have generally been reported in the past five springs.

<u>HERMIT WARBLER</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 female at Boone's Draw 5/12 (JJP\*, BJP) was very far east and well described.

<u>BLACKBURNIAN WARBLER</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 female at Rattlesnake Springs on 4/26 (CHB\*, JJP\*, LAG\*) was well described.

<u>YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 found at Rattlesnake Springs 5/13 (GAP), was seen again 5/14 (JJP\*, BJP, GEF) was well supported by good details.

GRACE'S WARBLER -- 1 at Bell L. 5/10 (JJP, BJP), far east at a low elevation (no details);...first seen in the Zuni Mts. 4/29 (TYH); 1 at Percha Dam SP 4/30 (DDL, RYM) was another lowland record; present at Bandelier NM 5/1 (CHR+) and Water Canyon 4/23 (ALS+); with 46 on the Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+); 4 in the Animas Mts. 5/24 (AMC, NCM+).

<u>BLACKPOLL WARBLER</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 male was seen well at Rattlesnake Springs on 5/13 (JJP\*).

<u>3LACK-AND-WHITE WARBLER</u> -- At Boone's Draw 2 males (JJP, AJK) and a female (LAG\*\*) were present 5/2, 1 female 5/3 (CHB), and 2 females 5/11 (CHB); 2 males were at Rattlesnake Springs 4/25-26 (JJP, CHB, LAG).

AMERICAN REDSTART -- 1 near Clayton sometime in May (AVF, fide WEC); 2 were 8 miles w. of Melrose 5/2-3 and 1 5/11 (CHB); 1 second-year male at Boone's Draw 5/12 (JJP, BJP) and another\* at Bell L. 5/16 (LAG\*\*).

WORM-EATING WARBLER -- Unusual: 1 seen and heard at Percha Dam SP 4/17 was supported by extensive details (CHB\*); 1 also reported there 5/16 (EGW+, fide RBA, no details).

OVENBIRD -- Unusual: 1 singing at the Oxbow Marsh, Albuquerque, 5/29 ((DDL, RYM); 1 at Boone's Draw 5/2 (JJP, ADK); 1 at Rattlesnake Springs 4/26 (CHB, fide RBA, no details).

NORTHERN WATERTHRUSH -- At least 12 reported: 1 in the Clayton area in May (AVF, fide WEC); 1 at Shady Lakes, Alameda, 5/7 (ALS+); 1 was 8 miles w. of Melrose 5/3 and 2 on 5/11 (CHB); 1 Boone's Draw 5/11 (CHB); 1 in Water Canyon 4/27 (CHB); 1 Percha Dam SP 4/29 (CHB) and 5/6 (DDL, RYM); 1 Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+); 1 to 3 at Rattlesnake Springs 5/9-15 (JJP, BJP); 1 at Bell L. 5/10 (CHB, JJP, BJP).

ENTUCKY WARBLER -- Unusual: 1 reported at Roswell 4/29 MAP\*) was very suggestive of this species.

MACGILLIVRAY'S WARBLER -- 1 at Bandelier NM 5/1 (CHR+); 2 were singing in Cienega Canyon, Sandia Mts., 5/24 (DVM); while 1 in Box Canyon, Doña Ana Co., 4/8 (LHS fide CIS) wavery early.

 $\underline{\text{COMMON YELLOWTHROAT}}$  -- 1 male was at the San Simon Cienega 4/1-5 (RWD).

HOODED WARBLER -- Unusual: 4 males were well supported by details: 1 singing at Los Alamos 5/18 (CAJ\*); 1 was 8 miles w. of Melrose 5/11 (CHB); 1 singing at Water Canyon 5/16 (DVM\*); 1 singing at Rattlesnake Springs 5/14 (JJP\*, BJP).

<u>WILSON'S WARBLER</u> -- 2 to 3 from Red Rock to Virden 4/17 (CIS); present in the Animas Mts. 4/14 (AMC, NCM); 10+ in Box Canyon, Doña Ana Co., 4/8 (LHS, fide CIS) were early.

RED-FACED WARBLER -- 1 singing on the n. side of Gallinas Peak 5/8 (HRS) was northeasterly, the first record for that range; 2 in upper Water Canyon 5/15 (DVM); in the San Mateo Mts. "many" in Springtime Canyon 4/28 (CHB, JAB, fide RBA) and 1 near Bear Trap CG 5/16 (DVM); 40 on the Grant Co. Count 5/9 (RAF+); 6-7 in the Animas Mts 5/24 (AMC, NCM+).

<u>PAINTED REDSTART</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 adult was flycatching on the Socorro Golf Course 4/1 (PAB);....<u>Breeding</u>: nesting in the Animas Mts. 5/6 and 5/24 (AMC+, NCM);....1 in the Mogollon Mts. 3/23 (SOW); 1 at L. Roberts 3/31 (EUL); 2 in the Peloncillo Mts. 3/22 (SOW).

<u>YELLOW-BREASTED CHAT</u> -- First reports were from the Gila Valley 4/17 (CIS) and the Gray Ranch 4/14 (AMC+); several near Lyden 5/22,24 (PRS+); 12 on the Española Count 5/10 (fide WBL); and 26 on the Bosque NWR BBS 5/31 (PAB+).

<u>OLIVE WARBLER</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: seen at two sites in the Animas Mts. 5/23 (including a female feeding a juvenile), 1 on 5/24 (AMC+,JJP, LAG\*);....reported from 4 sites in the Pinos Altos Mts. and 1 site in the Black Range (fide RAF).

 $\underline{\text{HEPATIC TANAGER}}$  -- 1 male at Fort Bayard 5/3 (EUL) was the earliest report.

 $\underline{\text{SUMMER TANAGER}}$  -- A male at Conchas L. 4/20 (CHR) was early.

PYRRHULOXIA -- 1 male at the Mescalero Sands e. of Roswell
3/16 was north of its usual range (JPH, RWD).

ROSE-BREASTED GROSBEAK -- 2 at Bandelier NM 5/16 (API+). Of 9 reports of single males the earliest was at Water Canyon 4/27 (CHB+) and the latest was a singing male at Mangas Springs 5/27 RAF), which was also westerly.

<u>VARIED BUNTING</u> -- A singing subadult male was in Walnut Canyon, Eddy Co., on 5/9 (CHR, CIS, fide STW). Probably the same bird was seen again 5/17 (STW, TJH).

ABERT'S TOWHEE -- 3 between Red Rock and Virden 4/18 (CIS) and 3 to 4 pairs at the San Simon Cienega 4/1-5 (RWD\*\*\*).

<u>BOTTERI'S SPARROW</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: 1 male singing in the Hachita Valley s. of Hachita 5/27 (SOW\*), a third N.M. locality. The others were Rodeo in 1977, the Animas Valley in 1991.

<u>CASSIN'S SPARROW</u> -- Probably responding to plentiful moisture, many were singing in the southwest, with 51 between Lordsburg and Red Rock 5/28 and 22 near Columbus 5/26 (SOW); they were also numerous in Eddy Co. (STW).

AMERICAN TREE SPARROW -- 3+ at Las Vegas NWR 4/12 (PRS) were late.

<u>CLAY-COLORED SPARROW</u> -- 1 singing at Albuquerque 5/5-6 (JJP, LAG) and 1 at Mesilla 3/25 (EGW, LHS, fide CIS).

FIELD SPARROW -- 1 at Conchas L. 3/7,12 (LAG\*) and 3+ at Waldrop Park Road Rest, Chaves Co., 3/16 (JPH, RWD).

<u>BLACK-CHINNED SPARROW</u> -- 4 were singing in Trujillo Canyon 4/20 (CHR).

 $\underline{\text{BLACK-THROATED SPARROW}}$  -- 4 were s. of Conchas L. 3/14 and 1 in the same area on 5/31 (CHR).

 $\underline{\sf SAGE\ SPARROW}$  -- 2 to 3 migrants w. of Roswell 3/15 (JPH, RWD) where rarely reported.

 $\underline{\text{SAVANNAH SPARROW}}$  -- Singing were 23 at Maxwell NWR 5/28 (CHR, LAG) and 3 at Black L. 5/22 (CHR); nesting is undocumented at both locales.

FOX SPARROW -- 1 at Clayton 4/5 (WEC).

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW -- 2 at Clayton 4/18 (FRK, AVF, fide WEC); 1 singing at Zuni 4/29 to 5/4 (DJC) was northwesterly and late; 1 was at Hobbs 4/12 (CAL\*, RRR). There were reports from 11 sites (v.o.).

GOLDEN-CROWNED SPARROW -- Unusual: 1 at Santa Fe on 5/1 (DAH, fide CHR) and an immature at Corrales 3/10 (STW).

HARRIS' SPARROW -- 1 at Las Cruces was last seen 5/1 (CIS);
"this was the fourth consecutive winter this banded bird
has wintered here. It always leaves the first week of May."

<u>YELLOW-EYED JUNCO</u> -- <u>Breeding</u>: a survey found 27 in the Animas Mts. 5/23-24 (AMC,NCM, JJP, LAG\*), many apparently nesting in oak brush sprouted since the 1989 fire.

BREWER'S BLACKBIRD -- Breeding: extended their breeding range to Grants, where a nest was found in May (TYH).

COMMON GRACKLE -- Breeding: 5 nests found in Albuquerque on
5/19 (KBO);....1 probable at Silver City 5/25 (EUL\*) was
westerly.

BRONZED COWBIRD -- Continue to be found with alarming regularity in the south: 1 male at Fort Bayard 5/22,25 (EUL), first male at Truth or Consequences 5/5 (DOM), 2 at the Gray Ranch 5/1 (AMC, NCM), a pair at Las Cruces 4/11 (GOE), 3 males near Las Cruces at Dripping Springs 5/20 (CHB), 1 female at Aguirre Springs SP 5/29 (BRZ\*) and 2 pairs at Carlsbad 5/11,13-14 (JJP\*, BJP, GAP).

ORCHARD ORIOLE -- Unusual: 1 probable first year male at Holloman L. 5/31 (TEF, fide CIS).

<u>HOODED ORIOLE</u> -- <u>Unusual</u>: a probable immature male at Conchas L. 5/8 (CHR\*);...<u>Breeding</u>: a pair nesting near Aguirre Springs SP 4/28 to 5/23 (HHH, TMG, fide CIS) was a first.

<u>SCOTT'S ORIOLE</u> -- Peripherals were 1 at Zuni 5/24 (DJC) and 2 near Newkirk 5/31 (CHR). Very early was 1 at Las Cruces on 3/5 (Ken Stinnett, fide CIS).

ROSY FINCH -- 150 near Tres Ritos 3/17 (CHR) was the only report.

PINE GROSBEAK -- 2 (1 singing male) near Holman 3/17 (CHR)
and 4 at the Santa Fe Ski Basin 4/12 (BRV).

<u>CASSIN'S FINCH</u> -- Notably scarce, with the few reports confined to the Jemez and Sangre de Cristo Mts. and the Zuni area (v.o.).

AMERICAN GOLDFINCH -- Late at Fort Bayard was a pair on 5/22 and 1 male 5/25 (EUL).

EVENING GROSBEAK -- Scarce, most reports confined to the Sangre de Cristo Mts. and adjacent areas, including up to 10 in Santa Fe March to May (JPH, LCH) and 33 n. of Pecos 5/7 (CHR+); the only southern report was 3 at Aguirre Springs SP 4/26 (RIK, fide CIS).
