Pre-registration activities at the Science Building, Western New Mexico University, on Friday evening consisted of an extraordinary exhibition of the original color plates of the birds of New Guinea painted by Dale Zimmennan, which will appear as the illustrations in his forthcoming book on this subject, in collaboration with Bruce Beehler, Smithsonian Institution, and Thane Pratt, Rutgers University. Registration began in the Science Building at 8:30 AM. Dustin Huntington, James Karo, et al., showed slides of birds at this time. The official business meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by President Chuck Hundertmark.

Chuck announced some NMOS publications that are in progress or recently completed. A bird-finding guide for New Mexico, by various contributors, and a publication on the birds of the Pecos Valley by Chuck Hunter and Bill Howe are in progress. SHARP-SHINNED HAWK TAKES MOUSE

On 30 March 1983, at 1708 MST, I observed a small adult Sharp-shinned Hawk (Accipiter striatus) fluttering on the ground alongside a fallen dead pinyon (Pinus edulis) tree, near the northern edge of the Cottonwood Gulch Foundation property in McKinley County, New Mexico. I stopped, and, as I watched, the hawk hopped up onto the log, holding an apparently dead mouse (Peromyscus sp.) in its left foot. The hawk peered around, and stared at me, presumably aware of my presence, although I had not moved since I initially spotted the bird.

For approximately 45 seconds the hawk and I stared at each other, allowing me adequate time to note the small size (no larger than a Scrub Jay (Aphelocoma coerulescens)), dark cap, fine reddish barring on the breast, blood red eye, and greenish yellow cere. Abruptly, the bird jumped up off the log and flew low over the ground, disappearing from view into the pinyons approximately 35 m south of me. The mouse was clutched around the neck in the hawk's left foot, facing right, giving me a clear view of its white belly and moderately short tail. The hawk's back appeared an even blue—gray, and the barred tail was slightly but clearly notched at the tip. Although the mouse was roughly 1/4 to 1/3 the size of the hawk, the bird did not seem to have any difficulty carrying it.

These observations were made at the edge of a pinyon-juniper (Juniperus spp.) woodland, altitude 2286 m, at a distance of 18 m, with the wind calm, and under virtually cloudless skies. The bird was observed through 10x binoculars, and my view to where it sat on the log was unobstructed.

Accipiters are considered to be almost exclusively bird eaters: Bent (1961, Life histories of North American birds of prey, Part 1, New York, Dover) cites A. K. Fisher's findings that 105 of 107 Sharp-shinned Hawk stomachs containing food contained birds, while only 6 of 107 contained mice. Small songbirds such as juncos, chickadees, nuthatches, and siskins were all common in the area at the time, and the kill was made midway between two feeding stations approximately 125 in apart, used in an experiment on Mountain Chickadees (Parus gambeli). These tended to concentrate such small passerines in these two areas, and it was therefore especially interesting to observe the hawk preying on a rodent.
